Introduction

Bob Conan Jr. was an avid reader since an early age. As a child his mother would often read to him and he would sometimes receive a book for his birthday or for Christmas. He enjoyed science fiction and read many Isaac Asimov books in the 1950s and 1960s. During this time period he became interested in his family tree which began in Ireland and continued into New York State. His ancestors moved from the Upperchurch area of Tipperary County, Ireland, to the neighboring towns of Pompey and LaFayette in Onondaga County, New York.

In the pre-internet era Bob spent a lot of time at the Syracuse Public Library searching for any relevant information he could find about his family's roots. He obtained the death dates of relatives from the inside cover of an old family bible and from local cemeteries. The library's microfilm reader allowed him to search old newspapers for obituaries which often listed names of surviving family members. This enabled him to locate and track families using the U.S. Federal Census records which were also on microfilm.

Once he exhausted those resources he began reviewing old historical books about central New York. Oftentimes these books were rare or fragile and could not be removed from the library, so his ability to gather information was limited to taking handwritten notes.

Bob determined that in order to efficiently continue his research he needed his own copy of these books. That decision began his quest to build his own personal library. Bob became a regular visitor to several small bookstores in central New York, and an occasional visitor to bookstores in New York City. He let the employees know what kind of books he was looking for, and they would contact him if they found one. His New York State book collection contains 40 books published between 1800 and 1900, and 37 books between 1901 and 2000.

Bob's quest for knowledge led him to study the history of Ireland and the United Kingdom, and the history of the Middle East and Israel. He studied the family relationships that are mentioned in the Bible and tried to determine if connections could be made with family trees from other sources. This led to Bob's interest in ancient world history and he became a passionate collector of ancient Roman coins.

Bob determined that the next logical thing for him to do was to collect books about local, regional, national, and global history. He collected hundreds of books on these topics and built his own history library. During his summer trips to Ireland he would always visit bookstores and return home with books about Irish history.

The purpose of the index contained on the following pages is to document the part of Bob's book collection that pertains to New York State and Onondaga County.


