Various Lee Families in Central New York

At first the Lee families were just a curiosity as they were found living near other families that I was investigating and they were sometimes listed as sponsors or witnesses at religious ceremonies. Slowly, as the pieces came together and connections were made and family patterns began to form the Lee families became interesting in their own right. In addition to church records there were various census records and historical maps of the area of interest. There were also contributions from other researchers, which sometimes contained key pieces of information and other times were more speculation. Maiden names and family connections were some of the most important contributions from these other researchers. Eventually it became clear that many of these Lee families were related and formed two groups. One had originated in Co. Limerick in or near the parish of Ardpatrick, another from Mitchelstown, Co. Cork and another from the Upperchurch area of Co. Tipperary.

The first member of the Co. Limerick Lee family was represented by Julia Lee McDonald and her family. She was born in Ardpatrick parish, Co. Limerick and was married in Ireland to Patrick McDonald. The family was living in the townland of Castleoliver, Co. Limerick prior to immigrating to the town of Solon in Cortland County (1843), finally settling on West Hill Road on the outskirts of Truxton village. Thanks to some research shared by the late Barb Stinard (1958-2014) and her cousin Anne Brown, Julia's siblings were identified. In addition I was able to merge the sibling's family information with the information I had previously gathered to identify many family connections in this group.

Thomas Lee, of this Truxton Lee family, had previously been mistakenly attached to the family of Daniel Lee and Mary Walsh of Syracuse, NY. After the separation Daniel Lee's family was developed on its own. The Catherine Burke who married Thomas Lee of Truxton had been a neighbor of this Daniel Lee in Syracuse prior to her marriage to Thomas Lee. Several Burke families are developed in this document in the hope of finding a connection in the future.

During the final stage of the research for this document it was determined that Mary Lee, Julia's sister according the information from Anne Brown, was actually descended from a Lee family from Mitchelstown in Co. Cork. Since Mitchelstown is just over the Co. Limerick border and only about 20km from Ardpatrick Mary Lee and Julia Lee might be related more distantly. Mary had a sister Margaret who was also living in Truxton.

Another group of individuals named Lee had come to Central New York from the Upperchurch area of Co. Tipperary, some by way of Ontario, Canada. Daniel Patrick Lee had died in Ireland and his widow, Honora Phelan Lee, and some of her children traveled to the Central New York area. The Phelan and Lee families were from the townland of Shevry, Upperchurch parish, Co. Tipperary. Honora had other relatives

(Phelan, McAuliffe, King, and Lodge) in the Central New York area, who were nieces and nephews of her brother Pierce Phelan.

Another Lee from Upperchurch was Mary Lee, who was married in Ireland to Edmund Ryan, who was also from the same Upperchurch area. Edmund Ryan is the son of Phillip and Margaret Ryan of the townland of Gleninchnaveigh (Glown), which is on the north side of the townland of Shevry in Upperchurch parish. There are multiple records on Mary Lee, her husband Edmund Ryan and their children after they settled in the town of Fabius, Onondaga County, NY, near the rest of the large Phillip and Margaret Ryan family.





The Lee Family of Ardpatrick, Co. Limerick




The connection of these Lee siblings came from a "detailed family tree" given to Anne Brown, cousin of Barb Stinard. This has been extended with census information, gravestone inscriptions, obituaries and contemporaneous articles from the Fulton History newspaper archive. Several individuals have birth information sources which still need closer examination.

Three items raised suspicions that Mary Lee might not be one of the above siblings. First there is the range of the individual's ages: Julia born in 1802 and Thomas born in 1838. This is a very long period compared to the expected length of a typical woman's child bearing years. Secondly, there are the two baptisms in different counties: Julia in Ardpatrick, Co. Limerick and Mary in Mitchelstown Co. Cork. The third item occurred in an obituary. According to Mary Lee Buckley's 1914 obituary she was survived by a sister, Mrs. Margaret McAuliffe. This Margaret doesn't appear in the Lee family tree above. Mary's obituary didn't mention Johanna Lee Collins, who is in this family tree, and who outlived Ann by five years, dying in 1919.




OSI map showing the relative locations of Ardpatrick and Mitchelstown. The distance between the two locations is approximately 20 km.

Julia Lee and Patrick McDonald



Patrick McDonald and Mary Lee were married on December 23, 1854 by Rev. James P. Cahill. Witnesses were Edward Dwyer and Anna Callaher (Callahan?). At the time of the 1850 census a different Mary Lee was living with Patrick and his parents and siblings on West Hill Road. Obviously Patrick's mother's Lee family and his wife's Lee family were not closely related. For more information on Patrick and Julia Lee McDonald see "The O'Donnell Families"

David Lee and Johanna Lane



Only John, Thomas and David Lee were living on Morgan Hill, Cuyler, NY with their recently widowed mother Johanna Lane Lee at the time of the 1870 census.

No records of the McNamara or Connell marriages nor any subsequent baptisms at St. James Catholic Church, Cazenovia, NY or at The Immaculate Conception Catholic Church, Pompey, NY.

David Lee's wife Johanna Lane might be related to the wife of John Casey of Truxton, whose maiden name was Lane from Co. Cork, Ireland. David was listed in the Cortland County Gazetteer and Business Directory published in 1869. He was living in the Town of Cuyler on Lot 75 with 18 dairy cows and farming 170 acres. Since David died on October 28, 1868 the information for the 1869 gazetteer most have been gathered prior to October 1868.

Mrs. D. Lee was still living on Morgan Hill in 1870s and 1880s and her neighbors were the James and Ann Burke Lonergan family.

Census Records

Patrick McDonald was living with his parents, Patrick and Julia Lee McDonald at the time of the **1850** census. Living next door was the Hobart family and living with them was **David Lee**, age 27, born in Ireland, he was a laborer. This census age yields a birth year of approximately 1823. This David Lee is a sibling of Julia Lee McDonald based on the family tree of The Lee Family of Ardpatrick, Co. Limerick. He is assumed to be the future husband of Johannah Lane.

In the **1870** census for Truxton, Cortland County the Lawrence Morton family had a farm laborer living with them. It was **Richard Lee**, age 45, who was born in Ireland. Richard is another brother of Julia Lee McDonald. (see The Lee Family of Ardpatrick, Co. Limerick) - This is the **first appearance** of Richard Lee in the Truxton area.

In the paper *The Patrick and Julia McDonald Family*, this 1870 census appearance of Richard Lee was his only occurrence in that paper.

In **1880** this same **Richard Lee**, age 65, was living with the Patrick O'Donnell family in Truxton. [T9-822-Part1-235A, Residence 55, Family 65]. Richard would have been the great uncle of Patrick O'Donnell. He was listed as a servant and worked on the O'Donnell farm. Patrick O'Donnell had married Catherine Carr in 1871 and they were living across the road from his in-laws Dennis Carr and Bridget Rourke on South Hill. Dennis and Bridget were the parents of the four Carr Sisters from South Hill.

In **1880** Cortland County, Town of Truxton [T9-822-Part1-246A, Residence 7, Family 8] there was a **John Lee** (42) born in England of English born parents and his occupation was that of a blacksmith. This was a different Lee family and he has been included to help avoid confusion in the future.

[This Kilfiene could be Kilfinnane which is very close to Ardpatrick - see The Lee Family of Ardpatrick, Co. Limerick]

Johanna's Second Marriage?

Mary McManus-Smith has pointed out that the words "w/o John Burke and Daniel Lee," which supposedly were part of the Lee gravestone inscription, are in error.

A search of the Cortland newspaper for an obit for Johanna Burke or Lee in the 1890 to 1905 time frame did not produce a Johanna who died in 1895. Only a Johannah Lee who died in August 1902 was found - see obit below.

No appropriate John Burke obit could be found in the Cortland paper between 1865 and 1905. No John Burke interment in St. Patrick's Cemetery, Truxton, NY could be found in the www.interment.net list. The Find A Grave web site was not able to find any John Burke buried in any cemetery in Truxton, NY.

Based on the inscription "w/o John Burke and Daniel Lee," it had appeared that **Johanna Lane Lee** had married again after the death of her first husband **David Lee**. Her second husband was **John Burke**, according to this inscription. So far the only evidence of this 2nd marriage is this gravestone inscription which has not stood up under further investigation. In addition, no evidence can be found to support the existence of this John Burke. It is therefore concluded the Johanna never remarried after the death of her husband, David Lee.

Johannah's daughter's last name was actually McNamara.



Thomas and Catherine Burke Lee West Hill, Truxton, New York

In 1855 a seventeen year old Thomas Lee was living with the family of his brother David. Also living with the David Lee family was a twenty-four year old Ireland born cousin named Catherine Lee.

In 1860, Lawrence Morton was living in the Town of Truxton, according to the Cortland County census. His farm was located on West Hill Road, the road that runs from the Village of Truxton northwest to the Village of Tully. Lawrence Morton had married Maria McDonald, daughter of Patrick McDonald and Julia Lee. Julia was the older sister of Thomas Lee.

Two farms away from Lawrence Morton was Thomas Lee (20) and his wife Catherine Burke (18). Thomas was born in Ireland and Catherine was born in NY. They had been married less than a year. The following records come from the St. James Catholic church records, Cazenovia, NY. In the early years Truxton was considered a mission church and was served by a priest based in Cazenovia.

134. LEE, Thomas married Catherine BURKE 4 September 1859, at Truxton No banns called. Priest: Bonaventure Carney. Witnesses: Patrick Lillis and Johanna Lee. (sister of Thomas Lee)

694. LEE, Thomas, son of Thomas LEE and Catherine BURKE, born 9 July, baptized 12 August 1860, at Truxton. Sponsors: James Sheedy and Ann Burke. Priest: Bonaventure Carney.

The Catherine from the 1860 census was born in about 1842, whereas the Catherine Burke from the death certificate was born in 1848 and yet they are the same person. This latter year now appears to be in error. The ages found in census records are not known for their accuracy. However, Catherine was married in 1859, the year before the census, when she would have been 17 based on the census information. The year of her birth found in the census is probably correct, give or take one year.

Eventually the family moved to Syracuse and was living in 4th Ward by 1870. Thomas Lee died December 24, 1879.

An Upperchurch Connection?

The following was found in Mary Ryan Kennedy's Truxton Roman Catholic records: born 7/9/1860 Thomas

- son of **Thomas** and Catherine Burke **Lee**
- sponsors James Sheedy and Ann Burke

It was originally thought that the Ann Burke who was the baptism sponsor above might be the same Ann Burke who was the wife of James Lonergan from Morgan Hill, Cuyler, NY. Ann Burke was born in Upperchurch parish, Co. Tipperary as were many of the other residents living on Morgan Hill during the time period 1860-1880. But then it was discovered that Catherine Burke Lee had an older sister named Ann.

Mary Ryan Kennedy was the genealogist for her family and she kept a list of baptism records. It is though she did this for persons who were relatives or friends. The fact that

Mary kept records of the birth of Thomas and Catherine Lee's first son, Thomas, indicates there might have been some connection between the families. If it is a relation it is probably through the Burke connection. However, according to the 1855 census, Walter and Emma Burke had been in Syracuse since 1833 which is far longer than any of the other Upperchurch area Burkes that are known.

Mary Ryan Kennedy was descended from Ryans, who had come from Upperchurch, and Dwyers from Bishopswood, Clonoulty par., Co. Tipperary. Her husband, John Charles Kennedy, was descended from Kennedys and Dwyers who also came from the Upperchurch area.

Below is the baptismal record for James and Mary Landrigan's (Lonergan's) daughter Margaret. Among the sponsors is Patrick McDonnell (McDonald) from West Hill while the Lonergans were from Morgan Hill. Another sponsor, Mary Lee, is believed to be from the Lee family of Co. Cork and Rebecca Cary (maiden name) might be Ann's mother, although it isn't known it Ann's parents ever left Ireland.

Patrick McDonald's brother-in-law, David Lee (married Johanna Lane) was from West Hill but was living on Morgan Hill in the 1860s. His presence might have helped facilitate the connections between West Hill and Morgan Hill

The possibility of an Upperchurch connection and the fact that Catherine Burke Lee's mother was Annie McGraw is very interesting. My gg-grandparents were Edmond and Mary Ryan McGrath from Upperchurch and they lived on Morgan Hill from 1855 until about 1868. – hence my interest in the area. Edmond came to America in 1848 and Mary, with her sons Michael and John, in 1850 as McGrath's and after about 30 years the McGraw spelling took hold which preserved the Irish pronunciation of the surname.



Catherine's age should have been 57 or 58, she has been married 41 years and both her parents had been born in Ireland.



This 1900 census record requires quite a bit of explanation and clarification after which it can be seen that this Catherine Lee is the widow of Thomas Lee and her daughter Nellie Carmody and her family are living with Catherine. For some reason Catherine's son-in-law and her grandchildren were labeled as "Boarder." The grandchildren's surname was close to being correct: "Carmady" versus the actual Carmody. However their parent's surname was listed as "Comally." Nellie's husband is obviously the "David R" person as seen by their common surname and the fact they had both been married 16 years. This is consistent with Nellie Lee's marriage to Thomas Carmody on Feb 20, 1884 in Syracuse, NY. Why Thomas Carmody was listed as "David R" isn't known, except Catherine Lee had a son named David R. Lee but he wasn't living in his mother's home at census time. The three grandchildren's names coincide with the surviving children in Nellie Carmody Calpin's 1916 obituary. Also the three grandchildren show their father having been born in Ireland when as shown above them their father, David R. Comally (Carmody), was born in NY.





"Emma A., the wife of John H. Johnson, died at 5 P.M., yesterday, aged twenty-two years, one month and one day, at the home of her mother, Mrs. Lee, No. 127 Burnet street. Her sickness lasted only four days. A council of doctors consisting of Doctors Didama, Wheaton, Saxer and Glander, was held and decided death to have been caused by paralysis of the brain, the result of tumor of the brain. The time of the funeral is not yet determined."

Complains Of Stagnant Pool

Park Street Man Says It Caused Boy's Death From Malignant Diphtheria Thursday, May 10, 1906, The Syracuse Herald, Syracuse, NY

"That the condition of the property at No. 106 Park street caused the death of Charles J. Johnson, the 12 year old son of Charles [John] Johnson, who died yesterday of malignant diphtheria at his home 802 Oak street, was the claim made by Thomas Errengy, a neighbor, this morning, in the office of the Health bureau.

"'The outbuildings on the premises stand in a pool of stagnant water and the conditions are something frightful,' declared Mr. Errengy. 'A week ago when the family moved up there, I saw this youngster playing and rolling his hoop on the very edge of that pond, and when I heard that he was dead I was not surprised. Last summer there was not a house in the vicinity of Park, Oak and Helen street in which there was not someone sick of a fever and unless the matter is attended to this year the whole Fourth ward may suffer.'

"Complaints in regard to the matter have been made repeatedly and last year Mayor Forbes visited the place himself and said that it was in the worst condition that he had ever seen. He ordered that it should be cleared up at once and the owner had several loads of dirt hauled to the yard, but instead of dumping it into the pond it was thrown down anywhere and the water is in as bad a condition as ever. The place became so bad finally that the occupants went to a different part of the city to live, closing up their house and leaving their furniture and everything as it was. If something is not done, everyone in the neighborhood will be compelled either to move out or to endure the chance of falling a victim to pestilence.

"The case of the Johnson boy is the first of malignant diphtheria which has occurred in this city in a long time and Dr. Totman says that there is no doubt that the germs of the disease entered his system in the manner described. Steps will immediately be taken by the Bureau of Health to have the property placed in a sanitary condition by the owner, who, if he refuses to comply with the requirements of the law, will lay himself liable to prosecution."

For the past 15 years Mr. Johnson suffered from rheumatism, but his illness was not considered serious until a short time ago. He was a member of Branch 42, C.M.B.A. Funeral services will be held from his late home Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock and at 10:15 from St. John the Evangelist Church. Burial in St. Agnes Cemetery."

T. L. Johnson, Rail Veteran, Dies at Shower for a Bride

East Syracuse Resident Heart Attack Victim; Rites on Thursday Tuesday, November 7, 1939, The Herald-Journal, Syracuse, NY

"Returning home in the midst of a shower being given for a friend of his family, Thomas L. Johnson of 209 West Yates Street, East Syracuse, a railroad veteran, suffered a heart attack and died before the arrival of medical aid.

"Mr. Johnson, a brakeman, arrived at the New York Central station at 8:25 o'clock last night, after completing a run from Albany, and knowing his wife was giving a shower for a bride-to-be, delayed his return home.

"He finally went to his home at 9:45 P.M., walking in to find the party was in full progress. At the insistence of the guests, he remained, however, and was introduced to everyone gathered in the living room.

"Mr. Johnson then went into the dining room to hang up his coat, and he had just placed the garment on a hook when he collapsed. Calls were put in for Rev. John J. Toomey of St. Matthew's Church, East Syracuse, and a physician, but Mr. Johnson died before their arrival.

"Although he had been known to have a heart condition, Mr. Johnson had not complained of feeling ill and he appeared in good health when he returned home.

"Born in Syracuse 57 years ago, Mr. Johnson lived in East Syracuse 31 years and was a brakeman on the New York Central for 30 years. He was first employed in the West Shore yards, but in recent years had worked on the main division between Albany and Syracuse.

"Mr. Johnson was a member of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen and a communicant of St. Matthew's Church. He was also a member of the Holy Name Society. His wife and a son, Francis, survive.

"Funeral services will be conducted at the home at 9 o'clock Thursday morning and in St. Matthew's Church a half hour later. Burial will be in St. Mary's Cemetery, Minoa."

Thomas L. Johnson, died at his home at 209 West Yates Street, East Syracuse, on Monday, November 6, 1939. Funeral was on Thursday November 9th. Pall bearers were: Harold Beckley, Raymond Burke, William Ryan, Leon Burgan, Edward Jackson and Price Healy.

1912-05-30, Thursday, The Syracuse Journal Condemned Brook Claims Another Victim in Child

Alice Lee, Five Years Old, Fell Where Stream Flows and Overflows

"OSWEGO, May 30. - Harbor Brook Creek on the East Side, which for years residents of that section have been trying to have abolished and which has thrice been condemned by the State Board of Health, claimed another victim yesterday afternoon. It was Alice Lee, the five-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Lee of E. Seneca, near Eleventh st., and the child's sister and another playmate, Agnes O'Neill, were with her when the tragedy occurred.

"According to the best information obtainable from the children, all three started for the East Side playgrounds, which are not far from their home. That section of the Fourth Ward through which Harbor Brook Creek flows and overflows presented a desolate sight. Trees were washed out, wooden sidewalks were afloat and, according to the children, the little Lee girl tumbled from the bridge near Cayuga and Eleventh sts. The current in the creek was swift and in an instant the child was lost to sight. Her horrified companions gave the alarm and soon the entire neighborhood was out searching the stream for the body.

"Charles Mears discovered it near a culvert at Schuyler st., about two blocks away, and pulled it ashore with a grappling hook. Mr. Mears carried the body to the home of its grandmother, Mrs. Ellen Daly, 130 E. Eleventh st. and Undertaker Cullinan was called.

"It was impossible to locate Coroner Vowinkel, who was said to be down the lake with a party of men looking for the body of Miss Bridget Lucy, who has been missing since a week ago Monday night and who is supposed to have committed suicide by jumping into the river, so Undertaker Cullinan prepared the body for burial.

"The tragedy which cost Mr. and Mrs. Lee the loss of their little daughter cast a gloom over the entire neighborhood. Aged women who have lived almost their entire lifetime in that neighborhood told The Journal that never before had conditions been so bad. James Arden's truck farm not far away is gone and Archie Loughrey told The Journal that all he has after two weeks' labor planting on his premises is its memory.

"Little Miss Lee was very badly burned some months ago by the upsetting of a tub of scalding water at her home and for some time her recovery was doubtful.

"Coroner Vowinkel is conducting an investigation. The funeral will probably be held Saturday morning."

1924-04-21, Monday, The Watertown Daily Times Former R.W. & O. Conductor Dies

"Oswego, April 21. - **John B. Lee**, 49, for many years a conductor employed by the Rome, Watertown and Ogdensburg railroad and more recently a field representative of the circulation department of the Syracuse Post Standard, died 8:30 on Sunday morning at the Oswego hospital, following an operation he underwent three days ago. He has been ailing for several years.

"Mr. Lee was born in Syracuse, the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Lee. at an early age he moved to Oswego with his parents. When he was 17 he took a position with the Rome, Watertown and Ogdensburg now the New York Central. At the age of 18 he was advanced to the position of a passenger conductor on the road.

"After serving on the R.W. & O. for a number of years he went to Chicago where he took a position as passenger conductor on the Chicago & Northwestern railroad. He met with an accident in which he suffered the loss of his left arm at the elbow. Shortly after that he was appointed a night yardmaster in the railroad yards at Mayfield, III. He has the distinction of being the youngest passenger conductor ever employed on the R.W. & O.

"Mr. Lee was a member of the local No. 69 Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen, having for several years past served as secretary of the organization. He was also a member of the Oswego lodge of Elks and the Oswego Aerie of Eagles.

"Surviving besides his widow are four daughters, Catherine, Helen, Marion and Margaret Lee, and one son, John B. Lee, jr. The funeral will be held from the family home, 186 East Bridge street at 9:30 and from the St. Paul's church at 10.



MRS. JOHN BUCKLEY

A Long Time Resident of Truxton Died at Ripe Old Age

Thursday, April 9, 1914, The Cortland Standard, Cortland, NY

"The death of Mrs. John Buckley occurred at her home in Truxton on Wednesday of last week after a short illness with pneumonia at the advanced age of eighty-one years.

"Mrs. Buckley, whose maiden name was Mary Lee, was born in Mitchelstown, County Cork, Ireland, and she came to this country when young, bringing wither that strong Christian faith so characteristic of those of her time and her nationality. She was one of the pioneers of her race in this section, and, possessing a cheerful disposition together with a considerate feeling for the welfare of others, she was popular with her associates, and honored and respected by all who knew her.


"In May, 1861, she was united in marriage to John Buckley by the late Rev. Charles Brady of Norwich. For a time after their marriage Mr. and Mrs. Buckley lived on a farm in the eastern part of the town of Truxton, and then they purchased the farm premises long owned and occupied by them on West hill in the same town. Mr. Buckley died a few years ago. Four children survive, two sons and two daughters, John and Jeremiah Buckley and Miss Margaret Buckley of Truxton, and Miss Mary E. Buckley of Cortland. She is also survived by one sister, Mrs. Margaret McAuliffe of Truxton.

"The funeral was held from the house and at St. Patrick's church in Truxton on Friday morning and was largely attended. A requiem mass was offered by the pastor, the Rev. A. J. Logan, and the Rev. Thomas J. Hannon of Cortland was present in the sanctuary. Burial was made in the family lot in the Catholic cemetery in Truxton.



The Thomas Lee who married Catherine Burke was originally thought to have been descended from this Lee family. Instead Thomas was a sibling of the Lee family from Ardpatrick parish, Co. Limerick, Ireland who had settled on West Hill Road just outside the village of Truxton in Cortland County, NY

The name of the husband of Mary Walsh Lee shown above is Daniel Lee. His name and suggested place of birth were from another researcher. He has not appeared directly in any of the census records or obituaries so his name cannot be confirmed. His place of birth has been given in the census records of his children as Ireland. Mary Walsh Lee's earliest appearance in the records was the 1855 census but her husband was not found

in that census. Her youngest son Daniel was born in 1843 in Onondaga County. Therefore it can be stated that Mary's husband, who might be named Daniel, died sometime between 1843 and 1855.

"Watty"Lee, 86, Is Dead

"Death which he bravely faced as a policeman for 22 years and which he narrowly escaped when he was beaten by a thug 25 years ago, claimed Daniel W. Lee, 86, 504 Hawley av., early this morning.

"A veteran of the force for 22 years, 'Watty' Lee retired on pension in 1902 after he had been permanently injured in an encounter with a thug in the West Shore freight vards.

"For 22 years Lee had walked a beat. The long deferred promotion to a detective post finally came in 1902. The first night on his new job he answered a call to the freight yards. The thug he was apprehending turned on him, using a club to beat off the officer.

"Lee bore the marks of the fight until his death. He was so seriously injured that he was retired from the force on a pension. At the time of his death he was the oldest veteran of the city department.

"Since his retirement he had been associated with James Finnegan in the building business. He resided in Hawley av. All his life and was well known to residents of that section.

"He was stricken with the fatal illness three months ago and died early this morning.

"Surviving are his son Daniel W. Lee Jr., two daughters, Mrs. W.S. Welch amd Mrs. Arthur J. Fay; three grandchildren and a great-grandchild.

"Members of the police force will act as pallbearers at the funeral services which will be conducted at the home at 9:30 a.m. tomorrow and in St. John the Evangelist Church a half hour later. A solemn high mass will be celebrated by Mgr. Albert J. Hayes. Burial will be in St. Agnes' Cemetery."

Corrections: Daniel "Watty" Lee was appointed an acting detective in late 1900. On April 15, 1901 Commissioner of Public Safety D. W. Peck appointed Lee as Detective. In early 1902 Daniel Lee was taken sick with an illness and didn't report for work in the police department for a couple months. On February 26, 1902 "Detective Daniel W. Lee ... handed his resignation to Commissioner of Public Safety Charles L. Listman and asked to be placed on the pension roll." Ill health was given as the reason for the resignation.



The incident with the "thug" in the West Shore freight yards occurred several years later on November 13, 1905 when Lee was employed as a Special Officer by the railroad. The "thug" was Angelo Pagano (or Perigo). Lee was struck in the head by Pagano with an iron bar but after the incident he was able to walk to his home at 504 Hawley Street where a doctor was summoned to treat his wound. "Dr. W. S. Law had been summoned and was dressing the wound when a Journal reporter arrived. He said that although the blow must have been a heavy one, judging by the damage done the scalp, that the skull was not fractured and that unless some unexpected complications should arise the wound would be more painful than serious. The steel bar with which the murderous assault was made is about an inch in diameter and three feet long."

"...according to the doctor's statement, it was the officer's heavy derby hat that saved his life." [1905-11-13, The Syracuse Journal, Syracuse, NY]. Lee subsequently returned to work as a Special Officer for the railroad.





Pierce Lee's Children versus the Catholic Benevolent Legion

Pierce Lee died somewhere between 1892 and 1900 and sometime before his death he had purchased a life insurance policy from the Catholic Benevolent Legion, naming his children as the beneficiaries. The company refused to pay the beneficiaries after the death of Pierce Lee because they stated Lee had falsely stated his age in his application for the policy and that he had also misrepresented his physical condition. The defense stated the Mr. Lee hadn't misstated his age, he just did not know how old he was. The jury in the Supreme court case decided in favor the Pierce Lee's children for the \$2000 policy on December 12, 1900.

1900-12-12, Two Thousand For Lees, The Evening Herald, Syracuse, NY

In October 1901 the Supreme Council Catholic Benevolent Legion appealed the earlier decision against them in the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court in Rochester. The appellant (Catholic Benevolent Legion) argued that they had discovered new evidence in the church records of Pierce Lee from Ireland. The parish priest of Upperchurch, Co. Tipperary had found the record of Pierce's baptism. His parents were Daniel Lee and Nora Phelan and pierce had been born in 1836. The lawyer for the Lee siblings argued that Pierce Lee had been born in 1846. In his application Pierce Lee had stated that he was born in Co. Tipperary on January 26, 1846. "The principle witness for the respondents (Lee siblings) yesterday was Michael Whelan of this city (Syracuse) who was a second cousin of Pierce Lee. He testified that he came to the United States from Ireland in 1851; that when he came here Pierce Lee appeared to be about five years of age. He knew Pierce Lee in Syracuse and knew him in Ireland before he left there. As he was 16 years of age when he left Ireland and Pierce Lee came over as a young man his testimony would seem to be conclusive on the question of Lee's age." A decision was reserved on that day. The following week the Appellate Division affirmed the judgment in favor of Lee's children

ANALYSIS:

The entire list of Daniel Lee and Nora Phelan's children from Dooree Commons, Moyaliff parish, Co. Tipperary are displayed in a family tree on the following page. The records are from the Upperchurch-Drombane Roman Catholic (RC) parish register. From these records it can be seen that Pierce Lee was born in August 1836 as the lawyer for the Catholic Benevolent Legion had argued. Pierce's sister Honora was baptized on Mar 29, 1846 and therefore she would have been born shortly before that or sometime in March 1846. Therefore this doesn't leave any room for Pierce Lee's claim that he had been born on January 26, 1846. Not in this family anyway.

In defense of Pierce's position, many Irish children did not know when they had been born. The old tradition says that Irish parents kept the knowledge of their children's ages

a secret to lengthen the time they could keep them at home to help on the family farm. As for 2nd cousin, Michael Whelan, recalling a young five-year old Pierce Lee in 1851 it is important to remember that Irish families stick together, especially against institutions and the law. If a five-year old Pierce Lee was in Syracuse in 1851, then it would have been expected that all or part of his family would have emigrated with him. However, they can't be found in the 1850, 1855 or 1860 census for Onondaga County and for that matter neither can Pierce himself be found in those same census records.


Census Records - Daniel and Nora Lee

The census record below is the result of a desperate attempt to find Pierce Lee or a portion of his family residing in the Onondaga County area. Pierce's mother was named Nora and his oldest brother was named Patrick. This is a mother-son shown below according to the census information, despite the fact that Hannorah would have been only 12 years old at the time of her son Patrick's birth in Ireland. The actual Nora Phelan Lee also had 9 children as did the census Hannorah Lee. A couple of her younger children (Honora, b, 1846, and Judy, b. 1848) might have been expected to still be living with her but they have not been found.





Patrick and Edward Burke were sons of Matthew Burke and Bridget Carey of parish Templederry, Co. Tipperary. Patrick owned 2 quarries in Onondaga and for more than 25 years gave employment to hundreds of his countrymen in the construction of public works. He built and occupied a stone house, which was the center of hospitality for the immigrant in that part of the country. Edward and his wife Mary Kennedy came from Thurles, Co. Tipperary to Jamesville in 1833. Edward was a farmer.

"John Burke, a former well known business man of Syracuse and a charter member of Branch 36, C.M.B.A., died Tuesday at his home, 410 Prospect Av. Mr. Burke was borne at Jamesville 70 years ago. He was the son of Patrick Burke, one of the pioneers of Onondaga County and owner of stone quarries in E. and W. Onondaga, being also one of the contractors building the first conduit line to the old reservoir.

"John Burke was a graduate of Onondaga Academy, after which he held the position of bookkeeper for a number of years, becoming manager of the Kearney Brewing Company 25 years ago which position he held for 13 years.

"He was also associated with the National Brewing Company for a number of years and later became manager of Central City Land Company. Advanced age forced him to retire five years ago.

"He is survived by four daughters, Elizabeth, Rhea, Frances and Loretta Burke, and three sisters, Mrs. Joseph Ainsley and Mrs. Dominick Sharkey of this city and Mrs. Charles Moseley of Cleveland, Ohio. The funeral will be held Friday at 9a.m. from his home, with services at St. John the Evangelist Church. Interment will be made at St. Agnes Cemetery."
