

Daniel Long and Mary Gleeson

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Introduction

This paper is meant to expand on the family information known about Daniel Long. In 2011, when I wrote *The Long and McGrath Families* it contained some information on Daniel but the main focus in that paper was his brother Richard Long who married Margaret McGrath, my gg-grandfather's sister. Now, almost fifteen years later, there are more databases available online which could provide more details about Daniel Long and his descendants.

The research for the paper *Coming to America — the Early Years*, focused on the connections among the McGrath, Long and Gleason families from Upperchurch, Moyaliff and Holycross civil parishes of Co. Tipperary, Ireland. Daniel Long had already been included in the previous papers on the McGrath and Long families but now any possible connection of his wife, Mary Gleason, was under investigation. Those possible connections will be researched in this paper.

During Daniel Long's early years (1852-1860) in the town of Geddes there was a person named Thomas Gleason who was also residing in the area and they were both working as "salt

boilers.” The obvious questions arose concerning Thomas’ possible connections to Daniel’s wife, Mary Gleason, and any possible connections to the Moyaliff Gleasons living in the Pompey area. In the end it was determined that Mary Gleason Long and Thomas Gleason were not related to each other and neither of them was related to the Moyaliff Gleason family. A Patrick Long family was uncovered during the research for this paper. The initial interest in this Long family was caused by the address where they were living. Their 108 Peach Street address was the same residence where the Pierce Fogarty family had been living in the latter half of the 19th century, who was part of another research paper. It was possible to trace the Patrick Long and Margaret Doyle family back to Ireland and find them in the Church records. Some of the Long children were baptized at Upperchurch, Co. Tipperary, which is where the author’s ancestors had emigrated from. This was also adjacent to Holycross parish where a number of Long families who settled in Pompey, Fabius and Truxton had originated. It was possible to flesh out Patrick and Margaret’s family tree using census records, newspaper articles and obituaries. Additional Long individuals found in the Irish church records who were the parents and a sibling of Patrick Long.

Daniel and Mary Long's birth dates and death dates are from their gravestone inscriptions in Immaculate Conception Cemetery, Pompey, NY — they are way off. Daniel, b. 1836, and Mary, b. 1835 are much closer to the truth. Catherine and Kitty in the above table are the same person.

Daniel Long, age 15, was living with a Smith family and a Fields family. He was working as a farmer.

1855 NY, Onondaga Co., Geddes, (June 20, 1855)

Dwelling 288, Shanty, value \$15.

Daniel Long, 21, born Ireland, resident of Geddes for 3 years, married, a laborer and an alien.

Mary Long, his wife, age 29, a resident of the town of Geddes for 4 years. Neither Daniel nor Mary could read or write.

John Long, Child, age 1, born Onondaga Co., 1 year resident of Geddes.

After analyzing all of Ellen's ages found in the census records it was determined that she was probably born in 1835, which would have made her about 20 at the time of the 1855 census. According to that census Ellen had been in the town of Geddes for 4 years. It could be assumed her arrival in Geddes (1851) was the same year as her arrival in the US, at the age of 16. At that age she would have been old enough to have made the journey to America by herself, which makes it difficult to identify her on a ship's manifest. The 1855 census for Geddes was searched for Gleeson families in the hope of finding one that Ellen could have belonged to — but with no success.

A search of persons named Gle*son, baptized in 1845 +/- 10, centered on Ballycahill and Holycross RC parish, but it also took in adjacent Borrisoleigh and Upperchurch and Drombane RC parishes. The only Ellen Gleeson who came close to a baptism year of 1835 was the following:

April 22, 1837 - **Ellen Gleeson** - Patt Gleeson and Bitty Bourke

However, the Ballycahill and Holycross RC parish register commences in 1835 and so given the uncertainty in Ellen's correct birth year, it is quite possible that no record of her baptism exists.

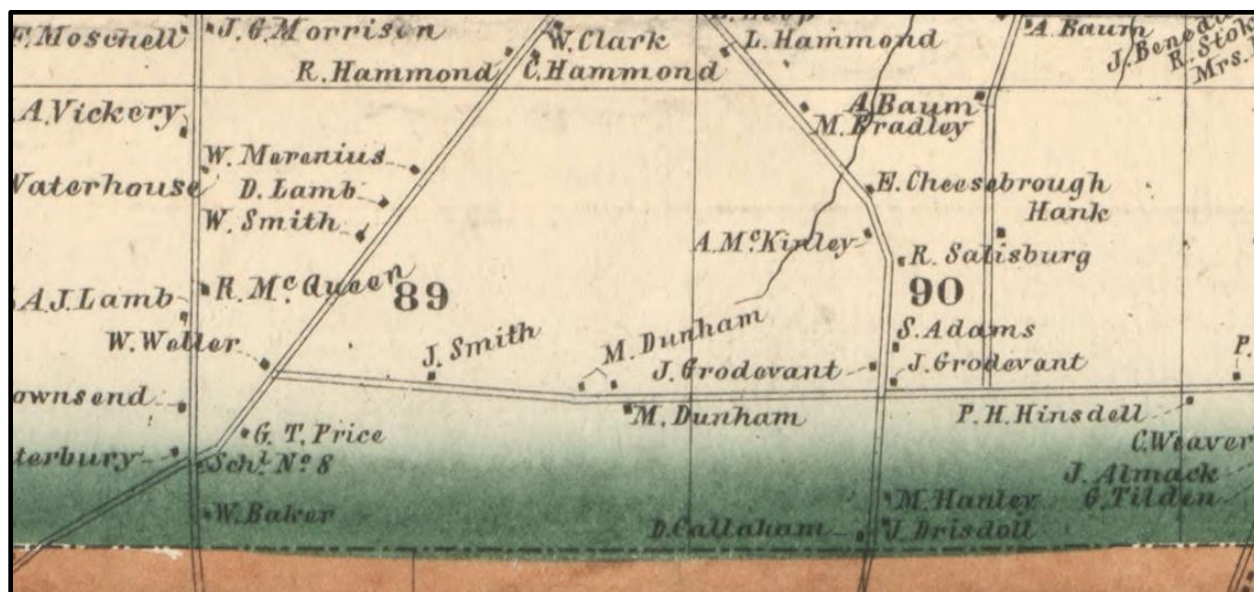

By comparing the 1860 census names with the names appearing on the 1859 map, it can be seen that Daniel Long had been farming land in 1860 on Fay Road (now W. Taft Road) between the Smith and Dunham farms. Up through 1870 there was no record of any land purchases by Daniel Long so he was most likely leasing this farm.

In 1855 Daniel Long and Mary Gleeson were residing in a “Shanty” in the town of Geddes and as seen above. In 1860 they were residing on a farm on Fay Road in the town of Clay. However, the baptism record of Michael, their third child, raises a question:

516. **LONG, Michael**, son of Daniel LONG and Mary GLEESON, born 26 February, baptized 11 April 1858. Sponsors: Richard Long and Margaret McGrath. Priest: M. W. Rooney.

Were Daniel and Mary residing in the town of Pompey between 1855 and 1860? There are no records to show that the Daniel Long family was residing in Pompey during the time period of interest, but there is a way of reasoning an answer to this question. Michael Long’s baptism sponsors Daniel’s brother and his brother’s wife. [Note that in this record the female sponsor was

married but her maiden name was recorded.] The baby's baptism took place almost 6 weeks after his birth, while the usual practice was to baptize babies as soon after birth as possible. A simple explanation would be that Daniel and Mary Long traveled from Clay to Pompey to have their son Michael baptized in Pompey so Richard and Margaret could be his sponsors. The 6 week delay probably resulted from the process of finding a day compatible with the Long families and the schedule of Pompey's visiting priest (April 11, 1858 was a Sunday).

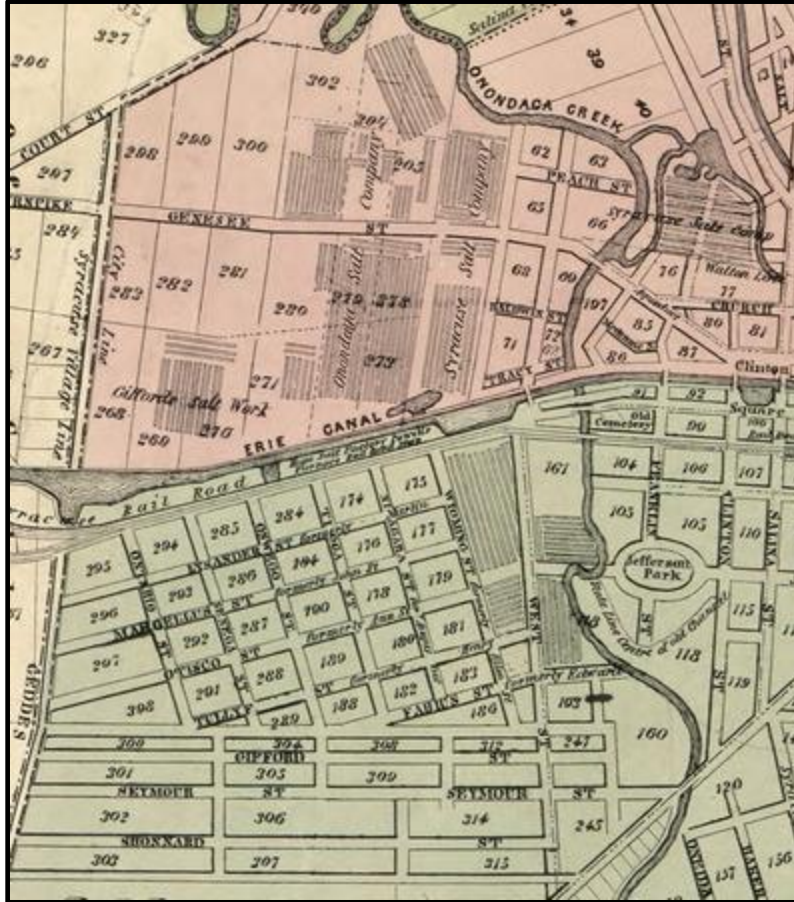

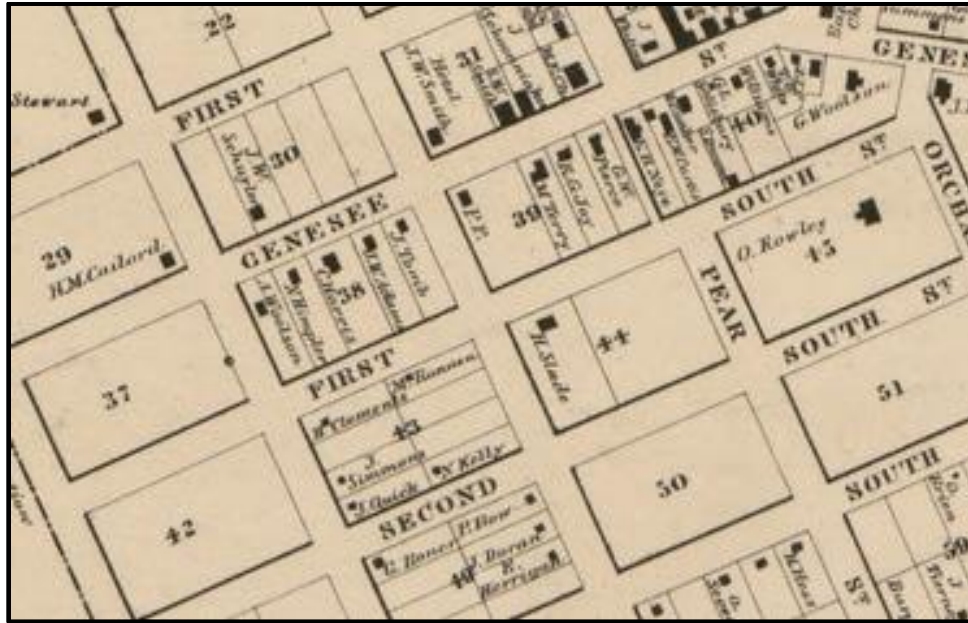

Today 1st South Street is Cayuga Street and Filbert is Avery Street. The next parallel street west of Filbert is Myrtle Street. Mrs. Mary Long, for a number of years a resident of the West End of this city, died yesterday afternoon at Pompey, where the funeral will be held Wednesday morning. Besides her husband, **Daniel Long**, she is survived by three sons, Edward and Thomas Long of this city and Michael Long of Minnesota, and by two daughters, Miss Catherine Long of Pompey and Mrs. Mary Jewson of this city.

Mrs. **Daniel Long** of Pompey died yesterday afternoon after a long illness, aged 75 years. She lived in Syracuse until 25 years ago. Her husband and five children, survive. Edward and Catherine Long of Pompey, Thomas Long and Mrs. Mary Jewson of this city and Michael Long of Detroit, Mich. The funeral will be from the family home Wednesday at 9 and at 10 from the Church of the Immaculate Conception.

DEATH OF DANIEL LONG.

He Was 75 Years Old and Lived Here More Than Half a Century.

Daniel Long, 75 years old, a resident of Syracuse for more than half a century, died of paralysis and Bright's

disease at the home of his daughter, Mrs. James Jewson, No. 207 North West street, at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon. For many years he was engaged in the salt business in this city and about twelve years ago he removed to Pompey and bought a farm. He was one of the founders of St. Patrick's church of Syracuse. He had been ailing for several months.

He leaves three sons, Michael of Minnesota, Edward of Pompey, and Thomas Long of this city, and two daughters, Miss Catherine Long of Pompey and Mrs. James Jewson of this city. The funeral arrangements have not been made.

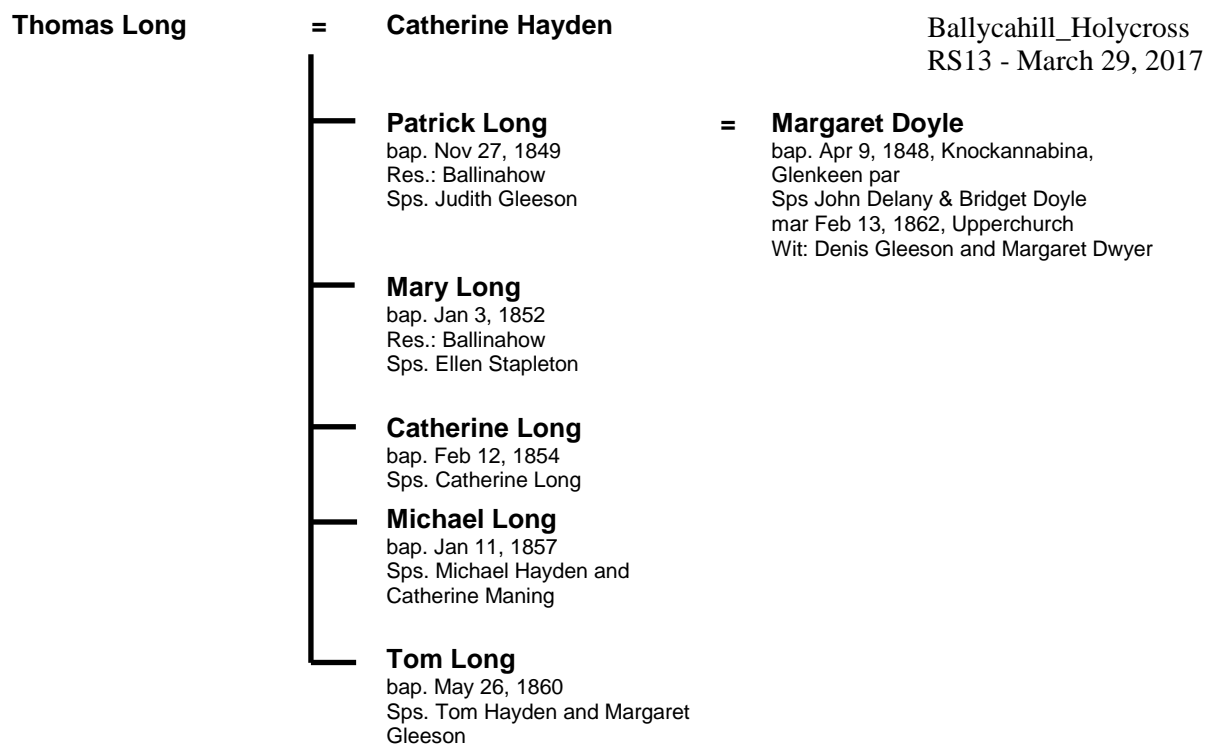

With the exception of Patrick Long there is no evidence that any other members of this Thomas Long family ever immigrated to the US. So far no connection of this family has been made to any of the other Long families from those areas that are under study.

LINEMAN CRUSHED TO DEATH

Breaking of Telegraph Pole on Newell Street Kills Harry Salisbury and Fatally Injures James Long.

"**Harry Salisbury** of Naples, N.Y., was almost instantly killed and **James Long** of 108 Peach street was so seriously injured that he will probably die by the breaking of an independent telephone pole near 600 West Newell street at 11:14 o'clock this morning.

"The men were strapped to the pole, which was rotten, and which broke into three parts. Another pole in the vicinity broke Tuesday, and Salisbury was said to have commented upon the fact that the pole was rotten.

"There was no noise when the accident occurred, but the men were pinned under the pole for some time before being extricated by their fellow workmen. Then they were taken into the residence of **P. D. Gray** of 617 West Newell street until the ambulance arrived.

"Both Salisbury and Long were employed by the telephone company as linemen and began work this morning stringing new wires in West Newell street. Both men were working on the top of the pole when it suddenly broke near the top throwing them to the ground.

"Ambulances were hastily summoned and the injured men were hurried to the House of the Good Shepherd. It was found that Salisbury had suffered severe concussion of the brain and had sustained internal injuries as well. He died immediately after having been carried into the hospital.

"Long also suffered a concussion of the brain and little hope and entertained of his recovery.

"It was said at the office of the Independent Telephone Company this afternoon that no report had been received on the accident, but it was thought that guy ropes, connecting the pole on which the men had been working snapped causing the pole to break."

TWO LINEMEN KILLED BY FALL

Telephone Pole Broke When Men Were Near Top

BOTH STRUCK ON THEIR HEADS

Harry Salisbury and James Long Died at the Hospital of the Good Shepherd — Their Skulls Fractured — Pole Said to Be Rotten

"**Harry Salisbury** of Naples and **James Long** of No. 108 Peach street, met death to-day by falling with a telephone pole at 11:30 this morning at No. 600 West Newell street. Both men were linemen in the employ of the Independent Telephone company and at the time of the

accident were working with a gang of five men connecting a telephone wire to a newly erected pole.

“A gang of men, it is said, set up a pole near the scene of to-day’s accident yesterday morning and before the work was completed a section of the pole near the top broke off and fell to the ground. Luckily no one was working near the spot at the time. This broken pole was removed and this morning a new pole was substituted. It had been set in the ground and guy wires attached to strength it. Salsbury and Long climbed up to a point near the top to attach a wire to the top.

“Suddenly the pole snapped off at a point about two feet above the ground and the two men were hurled downward, both landing on their heads and shoulders. When picked up both were unconscious and an ambulance was summoned from the hospital of the Good Shepherd, where the two men were taken. An examination showed that both were suffering from fracture of the skull and other injuries. Salsbury died shortly after his arrival at the hospital, and Long died at 2:30 o’clock.

“A man living in the vicinity said that he saw the broken stump of the pole and that the inside was decayed.

“At the office of the company it was said that the breaking of a guy wire or an anchor rod, to which the wire is attached, was the cause of the accident. The weight at the top of the pole was too great, causing it to break. The pole, it is said, was a new one and no reason for its weakened condition could be given.

“Mr. Salsbury was about 45 years old and Mr. Long was about 25.”

KEPT COURT OPEN FOR GRAND JURY

“The supreme court was kept open Monday only for the purpose of continuing the Grand jury, as no cases were ready for trial. The Grand jury heard assault cases and minor matters.

“At the head of the calendar for Tuesday is the case of **Margaret Long**, as administratrix of **James Long** against the Onondaga independent Telephone Company for negligence.

“Also upon the calendar is the case of **Charlotte A. Spence** against the Suburban for negligence and the case of **Agnes Hession** against the Independent Order of Foresters.”

\$15,000 ASKED FOR LONG DEATH ON POLE FALL

“To the allegation of negligence which allowed the telephone pole to fall upon which James Long was at work, killing him, the Onondaga Independent Telephone Company answers that there was a latent defect in an anchor rod that caused the accident.

“To illustrate the West Newell street accident to the Supreme court jury, a miniature pole and wire system was constructed. The action is the first important negligence one of the term being for \$15, 000 damages.

“In the complaint put in by **T. E. Hancock** for **Margaret Long**, who is administratrix of **James Long**. It is set up that on Jan 20, Mr. Long, an employee of the Independent Telephone Company, climbed a certain anchor telephone pole, as he was ordered to do. Mr. Long was fastened to the pole by a safety belt. The pole broke, throwing him to his death. Negligence was alleged in having a weak, rotten and unsafe pole.”

“**L. B. Williams** for the company made the claim of the defect in the anchor rod. The accident happened near 617 West Newell street.”

WAS POLE THAT HURLED TWO TO DEATH ROTTEN?

“Whether a cedar pole had so rotted that it could not stand the breaking of an anchor rod, or whether no pole could stand the pressure made by a breaking rod, is the pretty question in the West Newell street case, where two men were sent to their death, which will go to the jury in the Supreme court.

“Experts in pole work were called, and there are two sides to the question. **T. E. Hancock** and **A. Lee Olmsted**, for **Margaret Long**, administratrix of **James Long**, for whose death \$15,000 is asked, put in evidence to show that this pole was an old one, had been used before, and snapped off two and a half feet above the ground, showing dry rot in the butt.

“**L. B. Williams**, for the Onondaga Independent Telephone Company, told the jury that the pressure necessary for a sagging wire, put up as these wires were put up, was 1,000 pounds, and the moment that anchor rod broke, it was like hitting a pole 18 feet from the ground with a trip hammer driving 4,000 pounds. The defense is that there was a latent defect in the anchor rod that nobody could have known about. A new pole, it is alleged, would have done the same thing — been broken.

“Before the jury is a model of the rigging and poles.”

LONG CASE AGAIN ON

“The case of **Margaret Long**, as administrator of **James Long**, against the Onondaga Independent Telephone Company, in which the jury disagreed upon the first trial has gone on before **Justice Rogers** and a jury. The action is for the death of Mr. Long by a falling pole in west Newell street. **T. E. Hancock** appeared for **Mrs. Long** and **A. H. Cowie** and **L. B. Williams** for the telephone company.”

MRS. LONG GETS \$4,750 VERDICT

“Upon the first trial of the suit for the death of **James Long**, killed in West Newell street by a falling pole, the jury disagreed, but on the second trial the jury Wednesday afternoon reported a verdict in favor of the plaintiff for \$4,750 against the Independent Telephone Company.

“**Mrs. Margaret Long** brought the suit as administratrix. **T. E. Hancock** and **A. Lee Olmsted** appeared for her.”

SON OBJECTS TO MOTHER’S WILL

“Objections to the will of **Margaret Long**, who died Jan. 16, leaving an estate of \$3,400, was filed in Surrogate’s Court Monday by **Thomas W. Long**, a son, who, with four other married children, were given \$100 each, while four others, unmarried, were given the residue of the estate.

“The will was drawn Jan 11, five days before the death of the Testatrix, the objecting son charging his mother was not of sound mind at the time and that undue influence was used in securing a will that gave greater part of the estate to the four unmarried children.”

His son Thomas was the person followed through the directory.

Note: This Daniel Long is the brother of Richard Long and the husband of Mary Gleeson. In the 1855 Geddes census Thomas Gleeson and Daniel Long were living only 14 residences apart. In 1860 Daniel was farming in the town of Clay while Thomas Gleeson was still in Geddes.

Since the couple arrived in the US at different times and married in the US, it is nearly impossible to trace them in the Irish records without additional information.

It is interesting that Thomas and Eliza went to Pompey to have their daughter baptized. One of the purposes of this paper is to determine if Thomas Gleeson and Daniel's wife, Mary Gleeson, might be related. The question remains: Why would a couple residing in Geddes, on the west side of Syracuse, go all the way south to Pompey to have their child baptized?

There was at least two Mary Ryans in the area (McGrath and Gleeson) who could have been the baptism sponsor.

How Many Mary Ryans?

Thomas Gleeson and Eliza Woodward were both born in about 1830.

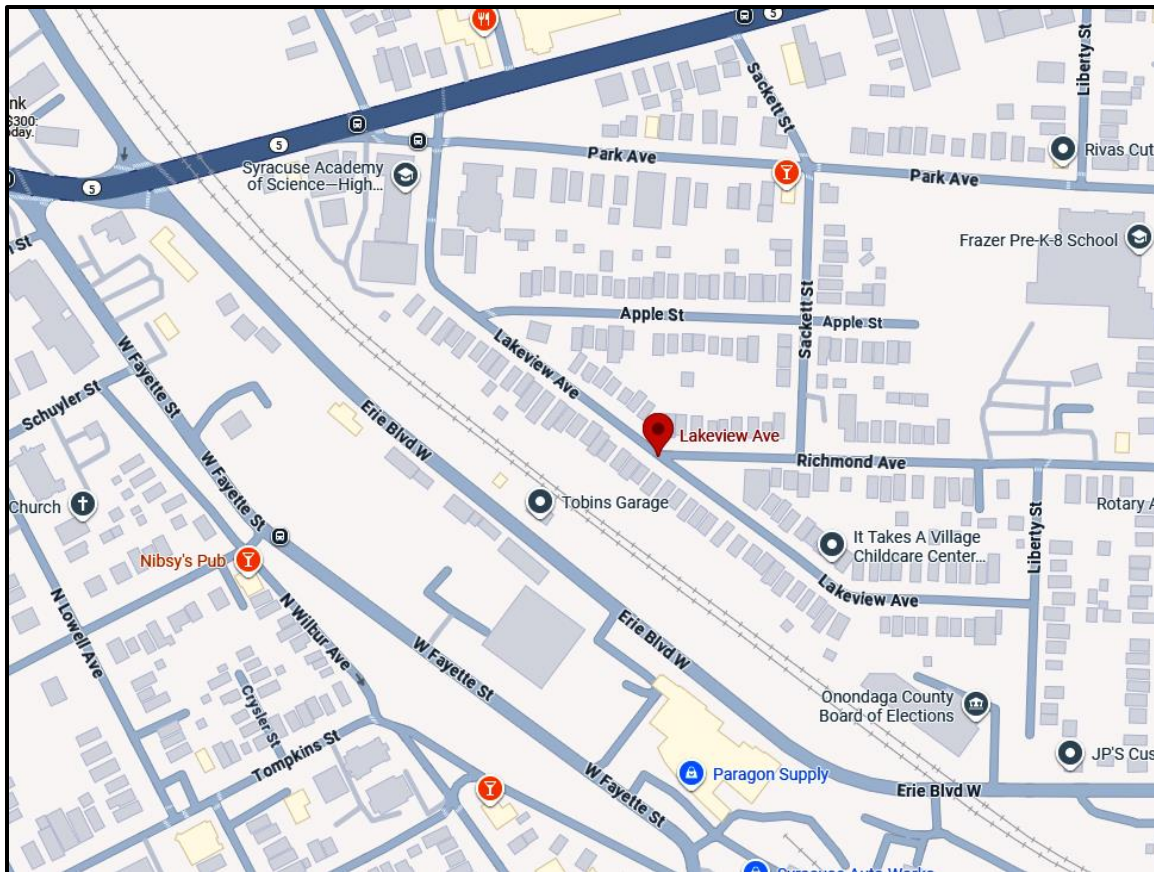

“Young Biezauowski, who is several years older and larger than the Toole boy, said that he was coming home from work on several occasions the little fellow threw stones at him and in retaliating he threw the stone, but not with the intention of hitting him. He said he was sorry. The wound has been dressed a number of times by a physician and the boy’s father, who was present, agreed to pay the bill and the boy was allowed to go.”

“Traced through a license number furnished by an eyewitness, two men were out on bail today on charges of public intoxication following a ‘hit-and-run’ accident yesterday, in which one man was left injured in the underpass in State Fair blvd.

“**James O’Toole**, 251 Lakeview av., driver and owner of the car, told police he did not know that his car struck Frank Starowicz, 46, 607 Richmond av., but his companion, William Larkin, 131 Grand av., had another story to tell

“According to Larkin, he felt a bump as they drove through the underpass and cried:

“For God’s sake stop, we’ve hit somebody.”

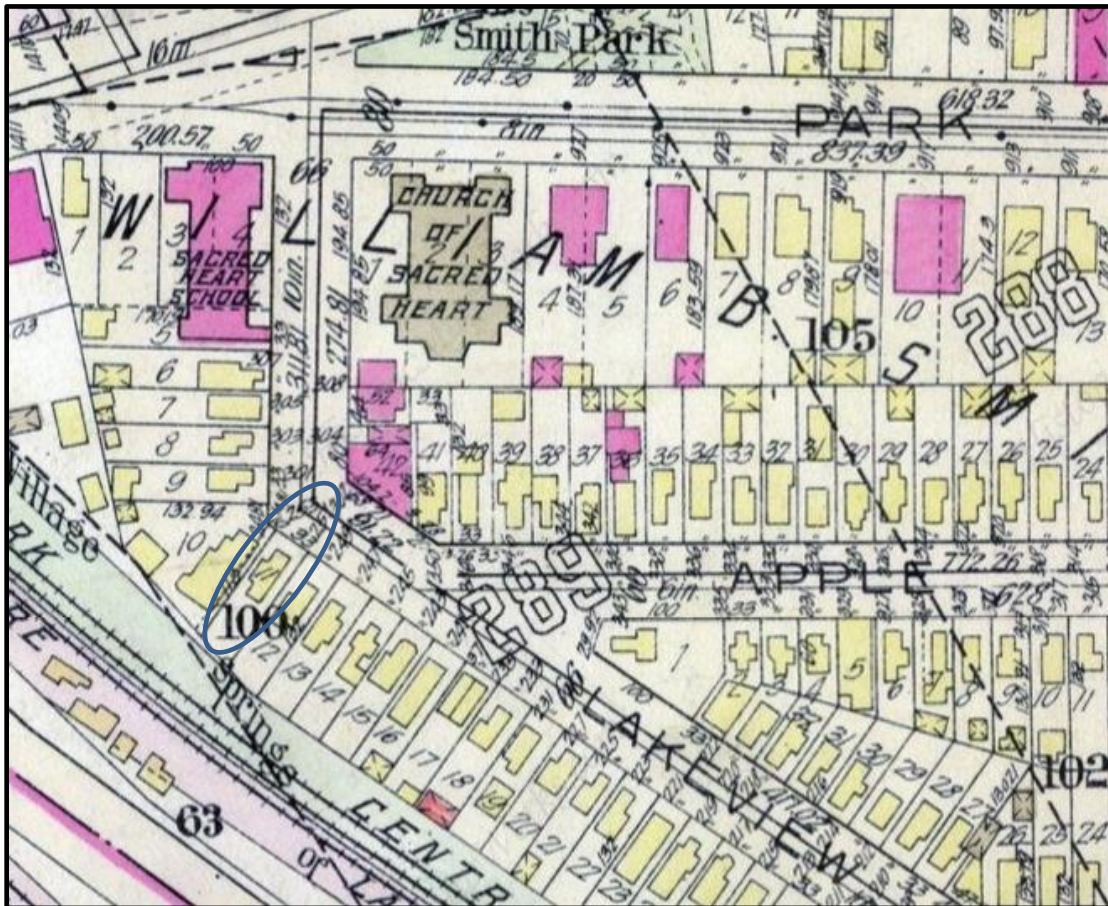
“But O’Toole didn’t stop.

“Starowicz was treated at St. Joseph’s Hospital for cuts on his face and head and a fracture rib, but refused to stay in the hospital. Patrolman Sallen investigating was given a license number by a witness. At O’Toole’s home Sallen found O’Toole’s car in his yard with the right front headlight bent and the glass broken. O’Toole and Larkin were taken into custody and examined by a physician, who said they were both intoxicated.

“According to Larkin’s statement to James P. Dwyre, clerk in Chief Cadin’s office, the pair had been drinking beer all day and during the evening. The car was going slowly at the time as they planned to stop at Toll Gate inn. Instead they continued to O’Toole’s home, where they were arrested.

“O’Toole said he did not remember hitting anyone and that he didn’t feel any jar. He also declared that Larkin did not tell him that they had hit someone.”
