To understand the many fine points of the coming conference, to read between the lines of its formal stagements and diplomatically toned speeches, the average American who doesn't follow the intricacles of diplomacy

will do well to bear in mind certain facts which have navid LAWRENCE been developing slowly in recent months, but which, when pieced together remove entirely the vell of mystery from the proceedings which we are soon o witness here.

In the first place, without detracting in the least from the lofty splitt, which actuated President Harding in summoning the conference of powers, it is important to disclose just now the meeting happened to be called. Events forced the issue—events, indeed, lover which the United States did not have complete control. Here is the inside story:

President Harding told the American people as soon as he took office that he wanted to put America's house in order first before tackling questions of foreign policy. He honestly believed it could be done. Mr. Wilson, as President, had given first consideration to foreign policy, had gone overseas himself to help settle it, while taxation and after the war economic issues developed intense irritation at home.
