Latham Y. Avery's sister Eunice was B. A. Austin's grandmother. Latham got a great-nephew and a 3rd cousin, twice removed, all in one. What a confusing family!

EARLY AVERY HISTORY

James Avery came from England and settled in Gloucester, MA. and remained there for 7 years. In 1657 the family relocated to an area that is now New London, CN. They were referred to as the Cape Ann Colony (Gloucester in MA was located on Cape Ann).

Mary Avery Harris was born on the ancient Avery Estate called Birch Plains on the western border of the beautiful valley of the Poquetannach. She was married on Nov. 25, 1807 at the family mansion at Birch Plains. Nephews of Mary Avery Harris were Captain B. A. Austin Avery and Augustus Avery, Esqr. Her niece was P. S. Avery. She had numerous cousins such as the wife of Supervisor Chamberlain of Geddes and the Messers Sweet of the 5th Ward of Syracuse.

[Very, very, very distant cousins – 5th cousins. Mary Avery Harris' connection to the Sweet brothers is through their mother Candace Avery Sweet who was born 1797. She married Horace Sweet of Pompey in 1817.]

What follows is a partial transcription of a newspaper article that contains information involving the Avery family history

"Mrs. Chamberlin said she did not know when the house was built, but that it had been standing a long time when her father <u>Benjamin G. Avery</u> came to Geddes from Connecticut in 1827. And <u>Charles Gere</u> came together on horseback. They had been preceded by <u>Robert</u> and <u>William Gere</u>. Mr. Avery went back to Connecticut two years later to be married. Mrs. Chamberlin has lived in the house forty-five years. Two of the old trees that were in front of the house when she went there are still standing. Twenty-five years ago, when a furnace was put in workmen broke their tools trying to cut through some of the heavy timbers. These and the walls are still sound, and the old fireplace, with its wide chimney from cellar to roof, is still used occasionally. Additions have been made to the original house, and it is now much larger that it was when Squire Hughes built it."

The following short biographies have been taken from *The Averys of Groton*, *Genealogical and Biographical*, by Homer DeLois Sweet, 1894;

BENAJAH AUSTIN AVERY

Benajah Austin Avery (848) came to Syracuse in 1838 and for several years was in the salt business, but after marriage purchased a small farm a short distance from the city, on the first plank road. This he increased to two hundred and fifteen acres. His chief attention, as far as the farm was concerned, was the production of milk. He purchased and bred the best cows, investigated the best methods of feeding, and reduced the production of milk almost to a science. He, with James Noxon, organized and built the first street railroad, and was the general manager for several years. His crowning work was the founding of the Onondaga County Milk Association, which has not only been of great benefit to its members, and farmers in general, but has proved of inestimable advantage to the city of Syracuse.

LATHAM YOUNGS AVERY

Latham Youngs Avery (860) was born in Groton, Conn., and in his younger days taught school and farmed it until 1836, when he came to Salina, and was the pioneer of the family in what is now the First ward of the city of Syracuse. He was extensively engaged in the salt business, forwarding and speculative interests, and accumulated and extensive property. He was accounted one of the leading men in town. He attempted to create a water power on the Oneida river, at Caughdenoy, which was a failure, and this, coupled with the decline of the salt industry, almost completely ruined him. He owned an extensive farm nerar Caughdenoy, which he cleared of its timber, and rendered one of the neatest farms in the county. His life was one of the busiest, and closed with the respect of all who knew him.






