PATRICK QUINLAN'S FATE

Patrick Quinlan (Quinlan), age 24, and his brother John, age 19, were living and working on the Charles Bailey farm in the town of Fabius at the time of the 1855 census. Later Patrick married, had two children and lived on a 235 acre farm just northwest of the Village of Homer. By 1880 Patrick was a widower still living on his Homer farm with his children Julia (19) and Thomas (17), along with a boarder named Martin Quinlan who was probably a relative. On the evening of December 21, 1894, while walking back to his farm after visiting a local tavern, Patrick was attacked on the long trail leading from the main road up to his farm house. He was left for dead and was seen by his son the following morning on his way to town. In an explanation that has always seemed lame, Thomas left his father there, assuming he was "sleeping it off." On his return from town Thomas finally brought his father up to the farm house. Patrick died of his injuries on Christmas Eve.

The investigations and trials that followed were covered in detail by the local papers. This whole set of affairs has recently been incorporated into an interesting little book entitled, *Death In The Winter Solstice*, by Martin A. Sweeney, the Town of Homer Historian.
