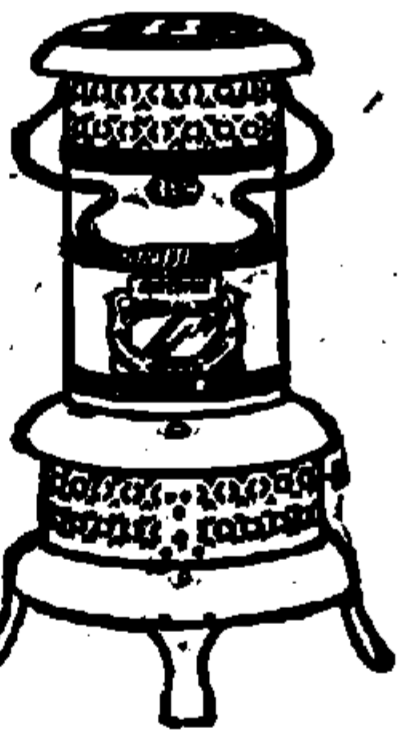

WALLACE DEAD AT URBANA HAD TRIED SUICIDE HERE

Former University Man Successful in Second Attempt to Kill Himself. BROODED OVER TREATMENT Friends Say Jealousy of Fellow Instructors Caused Mind to Become Unbalanced.

Professor Lee Wallace, formerly an instructor at the University, committed suicide at Urbana, Ill., Monday by inhaling gas. This was Wallace's second attempt to kill himself, a similar attempt having been frustrated in this city.

QUIET AND UNASSUMING. Mr. Wallace was a quiet, unassuming man and was not the sort to complicate his life in any way. He was known for his disengagement at Syracuse and the obstacles which were thrown in his way by his colleagues.
