The McGrath Families of Pallashill, Inch Parish

Introduction

About a year ago an extensive search for birth records was conducted in the civil records for McGrath and Long families in the Thurles and Cashel Registration Districts. This effort covered the period of 1864 to 1920, which is the extent of the online record availability on the irishgenealogy.ie site. The individual birth records were combined with others from the same family. The various families were organized by surname (McGrath and Long) and by registration district and uploaded to the web site mcgrathsearch.com. These family records were then used to build larger connected family groups and these were also published on the same web site as *Reconstructing Families From the Records*.

Where large numbers of the same surnamed families were found in the same geographical locations the records were extracted and, when available, these were combined with additional records. This paper is the result of such a process and it describes the McGrath families with connections to the Pallashill area of Inch parish in Co. Tipperary.

The paper is structured around three pedigrees. The first is Michael McGrath and Bridget Ryan. While Michael had a Pallashill connection, Bridget came from Glenreagh, Holycross parish. The second and third pedigrees have a connection through a pair of McGrath siblings from Pallashill who married individuals from Moyaliff parish. Thomas Ryan, of the second pedigree, is descended from John Long and Mary Magrath of Lisnagrough, Holycross parish. Thomas Ryan and Ellen McGrath remained in Coolbawn while Ellen was from Pallashill.

The third pedigree (Matthew McGrath and Johanna McGrath) contains Ellen's brother Matthew who married Johanna McGrath from Drombane, Moyaliff parish. Matthew's family traces back to Pallashill while Johanna traces her family back to Philip Magrath and Winifred Ryan of Coolkill, Moyaliff.

The Magrath families of Moyaliff and Coolkill and the John Long family of Lisnagrough, Holycross are described in *Reaching Across the Penal Times*. They are also found in *Neighbors in Ireland* and *The Long and McGrath Families* on the mcgrathsearch.com web site.

An additional result of the research done for this paper was the discovery of the connections among the individuals described in the inscriptions on a double gravestone found in 2006, in St. Michael's Cemetery in Rosmult in Templebeg parish. They were Thomas Ryan (from the second pedigree) and his siblings James and Thady plus wives and children.


There were two Magraths in Pallashill during the early 19th century: Michael and Matthew Magrath. A good deal of information concerning these individuals can be discovered from the land holding patterns found in the tithe Applotment and Griffith's Valuation. These patterns and later church records indicate that Michael and Matthew are probably brothers.

There are a number of townlands that appear in the records which are located very close to the townland of Pallashill. This could imply that some of these McGrath families are related. The St. Michael's Cemetery, where Thomas Ryan and Ellen Magrath are buried, is located in Rosmult, Templebeg civil parish, Co. Tipperary (Green oval).

Matthew and Michael Magrath

The Tithe Applotment

These were lists of landholders in the various townlands and were meant to determine the size of the Tithe they were expected to give to the Church of Ireland (Protestant). Not all of these records, which were compiled between 1823 and 1837, have survived and some were much more detailed than others and broke out the individuals' land holdings into various groupings based on the quality of the land. All that is of interest here is the total number of acres. Pallashill is a fairly small townland consisting of a little over 400 acres

The area is given in units of acre - rood - perche. While these are area units and rood should be square roods and perche should be square perches, by convention the linear versions of rood and perche are used. In the Tithe Applotment the old Irish acre was used instead of the English or Standard acre which is used today. The number of Irish acres is multiplied by 1.6198 to get the number of Standard acres. There are 40 perches in a rood and 4 roods in an acre and this is true for Irish and Standard acres. The difference comes in at the perche level where there are 7 yards in an Irish perche and only 5.5 yards in a Standard perche. In decimal format the total number of Irish acres in Pallashill is 254.481 and this converts to 412.208 Standard acres. The total acres from the Griffith's Valuation (in Standard acres) are 412.281, which makes the TA size only 0.073 acres smaller or 0.029%.

The basic elements of any holder's property are fields, which are usually bordered by walls made of stacked stones which arise from the field in spring. The fields should be all different sizes and therefore when identically sized holdings appear that is usually because of human intervention. The case of Lots 4 and 5 above belonging to Mathew and Michael Magrath is just such an example. In addition, when Lots 4 and 5 are added together they give an area of

20-2-26 which is even more curious since that is within 1 perche of the size of Lots 2 and 3. When Lots 2 thru 5 are added together the total comes out at exactly 60-0-0. Individual Irish stone walled fields don't possess such capability; someone must have divided up the property; but who?


The clue might lie with "Widow Burke" and the fact that Michael Magrath was married to Nelly Bourke who is most likely the daughter of the widow. A possible scenario is that upon the death of her husband Widow Burke inherited 60 acres and she divided it into thirds and gave 20-2-27 to Thomas Connell and another 20-2-27 to Michael Magrath and kept the final 20-2-27 for herself. Then Michael divided his 20-2-27 in half and gave half to Mathew Magrath who is probably his brother, although that assumption has not been proven. It is possible that Thomas Connell was married to another of Widow Burke's daughters. Why Mathew Magrath was sharing the 21-0-00 acres of Lot 6 with the widow is still a mystery.

The Griffith Valuation

About 25 years later Griffith's Valuation for Pallashill was published and the Widow Burke was gone but Michael and Thomas Burke show up and they were holding land in partnership with Michael and Matthew McGrath. The Burkes are probably the sons of widow Burke. Only the Magrath and Burke holdings are reproduced in the table below.

The numbering of the lots in the GV will only accidently coincides with those from the Tithe Applotment. However, there might be some information in the size of the lots. If the land of the Widow Burke and the Magraths is combined (Lots 3, 4, 5, and 6) it equals 62-1-13 Irish acres or 100.96 Standard acres. If the sizes of Lot 3 and 4 in the GV above are added together it is 99.156 Standard acres. So it is very probable that the lots numbered 3, 4, 5, and 6 in the Tithe Applotment have become Lots 3 and 4 in the GV. The Michael and Mathew Magrath found in the Tithe Applotment are the same persons as the Michael and Matthew McGrath found in the GV.




Usually the lot numbers and sizes found on these valuation maps (with marked red boundaries and numbered lots) don't agree with the numbers published in Griffith's Valuation. There are several reasons for this but it's not necessary to discuss them because this Pallashill valuation maps does agree with the numbers found in the published GV, at least for Lots 3 and 4.


Although it wasn't shown in the GV table above the Connell family was still in Pallashill. Thomas Connell had been replaced by his sons Michael and Francis who held 33.350 acres according to the GV. If Thomas Connell's 20-2-27 (a-r-p) holding from the Tithe Applotment is converted to Standard acres it is 33.479 acres. Therefore it is reasonably certain that Michael and Francis had inherited Thomas' farm and it is now Lot 5.

A curious puzzle will be described later when the family trees and records are discussed. There is a Matthew McGrath of Pallashill, born in the late 1830s or early 1840s, and it would be natural to assume that he was the son of the Matthew McGrath found in the above records.

However, this younger Matthew named his first son Francis which wasn't a name seen in the family and now here is a Francis Connell on the next farm.



This enlargement of the homes and farm buildings on Lot 4 is from the Historical 6 Inch Map (1837-1842). The valuation map on the previous page started with these same maps and added the lot boundaries and numbering. The short diagonal red line shows the boundary between Lot 4 (on top) and Lot 5 (on bottom).



This is a recent satellite image of the same area of Lot 4 as shown in the map on the previous page. It appears that most of the old structures from the 1840s have been replaced by modern structures.


Mountcatherine

The McGrath brothers also held additional land in the nearby townland of Mountcatherine. The size of their total holdings was probably essential in their success in surviving the Great Famine that drove many others to emigrate.



Where is Kill?

This was the residence given in Michael and Mary McGrath's 1861 marriage record. As a first guess it should be a townland in either of Drom or Inch civil parishes.

There is no townland in Inch parish which begins with "Kil." Therefore Kill should be in Drom parish. The most likely candidate is Killahagan.





Michael Ryan and Ellen are shown here since they were another Ryan living in Glenreaghmore. According to Michael and Ellen's marriage records Michael's father was also a Michael Ryan. William Ryan on the previous page is suspected of being this Michael Ryan's brother. They are approximately the same age, living in the same small townland and William had named his first son Michael. The Irish tradition was to name the first son after the paternal grandfather. However, the Michael below appears to have named his first son John while it is known from his marriage record that his father was named Michael. A search of the birth records for Thurles Dist showed no son named Michael before their son John was born on March 2, 1886. No birth records could be found that would prove William and Michael were brothers.



Three sets of parents' names (in italics) are based on the naming tradition. The fourth set of parents didn't have enough baptism records to allow this naming method to be used. However, the witnesses at the wedding of William Ryan and Catherine Long were possibly Catherine's brothers and their family was known. But then again, this is all tentative and remains to be verified. See "Catherine Long's Parents?" later in this section for a further discussion.



The picture to the left was taken at the Templebeg Cemetery (St. Michael's Cemetery, Rosmult, Templebeg) during a 2006 trip to Ireland. When I took this photo I had no idea that I would eventually find the information useful. There were just so many family connections documented there that I couldn't resist taking a picture. The Thomas Ryan and Ellen McGrath family related inscriptions are described on the left hand side.




Coolbawn is a sub-townland located in the western half of the townland of Moyaliff, in the civil parish of Moyaliff. Although Coolbawn is located in Upperchurch and Drombane RC parish the church at Holycross (Ballycahill and Holycross RC parish) is much closer, which explains why William and Catherine's children were baptized there. This is the family whose inscriptions were on the gravestone in St. Michael's Cemetery, Rosmult. Ellen and Mary McGrath are sisters.

Catherine Long's parents were not deduced from the family's use of the naming tradition. The reasoning follows from the names of the witnesses at Catherine and William's wedding as shown below and on the next page.





The above family tree was taken from: *Reaching Across The Penal Times*. The tentative addition of Catherine Long to this family might be stretching things a little bit. The witnesses at William Ryan and Catherine Long's wedding were James and John Long. It is proposed that the James and John Long marriage witnesses were Catherine's brothers. Therefore it follows that John Long and Mary Magrath above are Catherine's parents.

Catherine is estimated to have been born in the time period 1815-1820. Since this time period is significantly prior to the commencement of the Ballycahill and Holycross parish registers Catherine can tentatively be placed in the family tree above.

Alternatively, if it was assumed that Catherine and William followed the Irish naming convention in selecting names for their children then this would imply that Catherine's parents were named Thomas and Johanna.

The above picture shows the right half of a Ryan family gravestone in St. Michael's Cemetery, Rosmult, Templebeg parish, Co. Tipperary. This will be called the James Ryan side of the gravestone. James Ryan and Thady (Timothy) Ryan were brothers. Their brother Thomas' family were represented on the left hand side of this gravestone and they are described in another section of this paper. The left hand side will be called the Thomas Ryan side of the gravestone.

Linking Both Sides of the Ryan Gravestone

The very act of sharing a gravestone indicates that the persons doing the sharing are related. However, when there is a Ryan marrying a Ryan the exact nature of the relationship can be difficult to sort out. The maiden names of other wives were included in the inscription and since none was given for Mary Ryan it was assumed that her maiden name was Ryan.


Working initially from the Thomas Ryan side of the gravestone it was determined that Thomas' father was William Ryan. Subsequently the entire William Ryan family was mapped out. Later, while working from the James Ryan side of the gravestone, the family of James' wife, who was initially thought to be Mary Ryan, was mapped out from the information on James and Mary's marriage record. On this marriage record James Ryan's father was given as John Ryan. Since no Thady Ryan had showed up in Mary Ryan's family Thady had to be James' brother. This turned out to be correct but for the wrong reason. A search through the parish records for a John Ryan who had sons James and Thady turned up empty. However a look at the previously constructed Thomas Ryan family showed that a James and Timothy (Thady) of the correct ages where already waiting there. This was the obvious connection - three brothers were occupying

the two sides of the gravestone. After examining the various records to determine why a search from the Thomas side and the James side did not wind up with the same family the culprit was thought to be found in the marriage record of James Ryan and Mary Ryan. That record gave James' father as "John Ryan." If that name is assumed to be an error and John is replaced with William then all the pieces seemed to fit. However, that wasn't the solution.

The 1911 census gave James and Mary's marriage year as 1902, while the previous marriage record had the year as 1905. Shortly a different marriage record was found for James Ryan, it was in 1902 and his wife was named Mary but Mary McGrath not Mary Ryan. This Mary's father was Matthew instead of Richard. The residences were Coolkill for James and Pallashill for Mary, which was a better fit than those found in the 1905 marriage record. In addition Mary was the sister of Ellen McGrath who married James' brother Thomas Ryan.





The oldest generations in this pedigree chart are represented by Philip Magrath and Winifred Ryan of Coolkill, and John Long and Mary Magrath, of Lisnagrough. It isn't known if Philip Magrath and Mary Magrath, from these oldest generations are related. The details of their analysis and addition supporting information will be presented and discussed in detail in *Reaching Across The Penal Times*.

No baptism record was found for Matthew McGrath (married Margaret Costello) which would have provided the names of his parents. The assumed use of the Irish naming convention would yield the names of Francis and Bridget for the names of Michael's parents. However, the only McGraths found in Pallashill were Michael and Matthew. It is more logical that Matthew's father was also named Matthew McGrath. There never was a Francis Magrath found among the land holders in Pallashill at the time of the younger Matthew's birth, and it was a very small townland.


