The O'Donnell Families

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Introduction

When this document was first drafted about a dozen years ago it started as an attempt to assemble all the available historical information pertaining to the family of Thomas O'Donnell and Margaret McDonald. The families of their children were traced as far as possible and related families were identified. The locations of the family farms were also determined where possible and various neighbors were enumerated.

The primary focus was intended to be Thomas and Margaret O'Donnell family but when many more O'Donnell families surfaced during the research for this paper the scope was broadened. These new O'Donnell families were also traced out and attempts were made to discover any possible connections among these various families. Multiple sources have been consulted in the course of the research for this document, several of which were not available when the first draft was completed.

The O'Donnell Families of Truxton, NY

Thomas O'Donnell and Margaret McDonald

Thomas O'Donnell and Margaret McDonald were married in Kilfinane, Co. Limerick, Ireland on February 27, 1838 and they followed Margaret's parents to Homer, NY six years after her parents emigrated. Thomas and Margaret were from the townland of Glenosheen which abuts the southern border of her parents' townland, Casteloliver. Their ship *Montreal* arrived in New York City from Ireland on December 16, 1848. Traveling with Thomas, Margaret and four of their children were two of Margaret's siblings: Pat and Johanna McDonald and another Margaret McDonald who perhaps was some kind of relative.

According to the 1850 census for Cortland County, Thomas O'Donnell and Margaret McDonald were living in the Town of Homer with their five children. The three oldest children had been born in Ireland, Maria had been born at sea on the way over, and Ellen, the youngest, was born in NY in 1849, just after the family arrived from Ireland. Margaret's parents had come to Cortland County from the townland of Castleoliver, Particles parish in Co. Limerick. Patrick and Julia McDonald arrived in Homer, NY in 1843.

The O'Donnell Family of Morgan Hill, Cuyler, NY

Patrick O'Donnell and Ellen Franklin

The Patrick O'Donnell family can be traced back as far as Oswego, NY in 1847 where their oldest daughter Mary was born. Their second child Catherine was born in late 1849 but she would die in infancy before 1855. In 1850 the family was living in the town of Manlius, Onondaga County. Their third child, Henry, was born in Fabius, NY on May 23,

1852. In 1854 the family moved to Morgan Hill in Cuyler, which was then in the town of Truxton in Cortland County, and shortly thereafter their fourth child, John, was born. The family remained on Morgan Hill until at least 1865 where their children Patrick, William, and Ellen were born. The exact location of the family has not been determined for 1870 but by 1875 they were living in the Town of Preble in Cortland Co. and remained there at least through 1880. Patrick appears to have passed away prior to 1892. Ellen O'Donnell and her 22 year old son Edward were living in German Flatts, Herkimer County with her daughter Emma O'Donnell McMahon and her family in 1892. When Ellen died in March 1910 six of her children were still living and she left twenty-four grandchildren and twenty-one great grandchildren.

The O'Donnell Family from County Donegal

Dennis and Margaret O'Donnell

Dennis O'Donnell was first found in the 1850 census when Dennis, his wife Margaret and their children James, John, and Thomas had settled in the Town of Geddes. One of Dennis' descendants said that the family was from County Donegal, Ireland. During the course of the research for this paper that assertion could be neither proved nor disproved, so this family is being labeled as having come from Co. Donegal. Their oldest child, James, was 13 in 1850 and had been born in New York State. This means that the family had been in the US since at least 1837. This is almost ten years prior to the influx of the Famine victims from the southwestern portion of Ireland and lends some credibility to their believed origin in Co. Donegal. In the earlier part of the 19th century a large number of the Irish immigrants had come from Northern Ireland.

In 1855 the family was still in Geddes, living in a \$25 "Shantee" with Dennis employed as a salt yard laborer. The oldest son, James, was no longer living at home and 2-year old Mary had been added to the family. By the time of the 1860 census Dennis O'Donnell, his wife, and three of their children were living in the town of Camillus, just southwest of present day Fairmount Corners.

The 1870 census found Dennis, Margaret and their same three children back in the village of Geddes. At that time they were on Filbert Street (now the even side of the street in the 900 block of Avery Avenue). By 1880 young Mary had married John Sweeney and they had a 5-year old son named Edward. The Sweeney family was living on Filbert St. (Avery Ave.) and her brother Thomas was living with them. The fate of Dennis and Margaret O'Donnell and their sons James and John has not been determined. Their children Thomas and Mary are followed in this paper.

The O'Donnell Family of Manilla Street

James O'Donnell and Mary Dougherty

The information on this family was developed during an effort to track down the descendants of James O'Donnell, son of Dennis from Donegal. No descendants of this James were found but instead the descendants of another James O'Donnell were found. Although the family moved around Syracuse they started out on Manilla Street and then returned and remained there for many years, hence this will become their label. After an extensive search the 1870 census showed that these two James O'Donnell's <u>were not</u> the same person. During the attempt to identify Mary Dougherty O'Donnell's late husband (who turned out to be a James O'Donnell who was not the son of Dennis

O'Donnell) her entire Dougherty family was mapped out and they appear in this document.

The William O'Donnell Family of South Hill

William O'Donnell and Mary Drury

Back in 2004, when the initial research was conducted, this family was originally thought to be two different families. One family was put together from gravestone inscriptions found in St. Patrick's Cemetery, Truxton, NY. The other family was found in the 1870 census records for Truxton, NY. The first O'Donnell family was originally thought to have a connection to Morgan Hill, Cuyler, NY based on information received from another researcher in 2010. That researcher also speculated that the two families might actually be one family. After further research (2017) it was determined that they were indeed one family but it was also discovered that the family was not associated with Morgan Hill but with South Hill, Truxton, NY.

So far it has not been possible to determine the origin of William O'Donnell and Mary Drury back in Ireland. Although no marriage record has been found for the pair in the Truxton area it can't be assumed that they were married in Ireland and came to the US together. William and Mary had 10 children between 1867 and 1889 with only six surviving to adulthood. It has been possible to trace the descendants of four of these six children.

Owen O'Donnell and Catherine Meagher of the First Ward

Owen O'Donnell and Catherine Meagher

The Owen O'Donnell family originally came to the attention of the author through baptism records of two of his children in the St. James Catholic Church, Cazenovia, NY (Catherine - 1860 and James - 1862) and the 1860 Pompey census record. In the 1900 census Catherine stated she had given birth to seven children and only three of the children were still alive at the time of the census. Catherine gave 1842 as the year in which she had arrived in the US at the age of about 17. Owen O'Donnell died prior to 1892 and missed the 1900 census and since no obituary has been found for him his date of immigration is not known. The family is thought to have first resided in New York City where they had their first child, Edward, who apparently died prior to 1855. Owen and Catherine spent most of their time in Syracuse's First Ward.

Thomas Maher and Mary O'Donnell of Pompey

Thomas Maher and Mary O'Donnell

The Thomas and Mary Maher family came to the attention of the author from a family genealogy document titled "Descendants of Thomas Maher." The trail of this family picks up in 1859 in Pompey, NY where Thomas and Mary lived until they disappeared from the census records prior to 1892. Thomas and Mary had been born in Ireland and came to the US separately. The descendants of their children Mary and Sarah, remained in the Syracuse area and have been traced. Only Mary Maher Kinney had any children, a daughter Mable Kinney who married George Carr and they had no children. The family has died out.

The O'Donnell Family of Fenner, NY

Michael J. O'Donnell, Sr. and Anne Boyle Howe

Michael J. O'Donnell, Sr. makes his first appearance in Auburn, NY around 1852. The senior Michael was married twice and little is known about his first wife but the union produced one child, James (b. 1849). Michael's second wife was Ann Boyle Howe, herself a widow, with one son James Howe (b. 1851). Michael and Ann were married sometime after 1852, probably in Auburn. NY and moved to Williamsport, PA where Michael J., Jr. was born in 1854. An effort to fill in the family's activities in the 1860s has found them living in the towns of Victor, East Bloomfield, Manchester and Phelps in Ontario County, NY

The family settled in the town of Fenner, Madison Co., NY, sometime after 1867 when Michael J. O'Donnell was about 12 years old. Michael, Jr. married Mary Ellen Burke of Perryville, NY in 1881. The descendants of Michael and Mary are also described in this section. The information on this family benefitted greatly from family genealogies provided by Kristen Rickert.

O'Donnell Connection to the Nix Family

John Nix and Mary O'Donnell

The existence of the John Nix and Mary O'Donnell family was initially discovered from inscriptions found in the St. Patrick's Cemetery, Truxton, NY. Mary O'Donnell's point of origin in Ireland has not been determined but it is believed that she arrived in the town of Manlius in May 1855 just in time to appear in the 1855 census. She doesn't seem to be related to any of the other O'Donnells in this paper based on her absence from their numerous obituaries. This belief is further supported by her lack of interaction with the other O'Donnell families based on contemporary newspaper accounts. John and Mary Nix had nine children that are known and eight of these survived to adulthood. Two of the children remained in the area and were traceable however, the other six moved further away, to New York City, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Illinois and ceased to appear in the newspapers of Central New York.

Patrick O'Donnell of Cazenovia, NY

Patrick O'Donnell and Margaret Canaly

Patrick O'Donnell and Margaret Canaly came to the US separately in 1860 according to the 1900 census. They were married at St. James Catholic Church in Cazenovia on March 4, 1862. The other known church records belonging to this family include baptism records for two of their children: James (1863) and Anne (1865). The family appeared in the 1865 census for Cazenovia and then the family disappeared from the Central New York records. After finding the family again in an 1880 Illinois census it was determined that they had left New York after 1867. In 1900 Patrick and Margaret and two of their daughters were living in Chicago with their daughter Margaret Cunningham who was widowed with one child.

Future Research Directions

A section is included at the end of some of the family stories as a reminder for when I next pick up this search again or as a guide to anyone else who wants to further research these families. These sections will summarize the status of the research effort into the family and suggest possible areas of future research. Listed in this section will be suspected connections that remain to be proved in addition to key pieces of information or records that have yet to be found.

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

Since Thomas and Margaret were married on February 27, 1838 in Kilfinnane, Ireland it doesn't seem possible for Bryan (b. 1835) from the *Montreal* manifest to be one of their children.

In the 1865 census for the town of Solon, Cortland Co., Margaret O'Donnell was recorded as being the parent of 14 children. By including Joannes (b. 1839, Joannes is Latin for John) and the younger John baptized on March 26, 1848 to the list of children found in the 1850, 1860, and 1865 census records the total comes to 14. It still remains to be explained what happened to the older and younger John. There are two standard answers for children that didn't come to the US with the rest of their family: marriage or death. Since neither of these two children would have been old enough to marry by the time that the family left for the US in 1848 then death is their most likely fate. This works for explaining the absence of the older John but there is a slight timing problem with the younger John. Maria was probably born in November or December of 1848 which puts her birth very close to the younger John's baptismal date of March 26, 1848. There is possibly more room in there than there might appear at first glance. Since this child died before the family left Ireland it might be supposed that he was born sickly. In those cases when it was felt that the child might die before a formal church baptism could take place the priest would come to the house and perform a private baptism. For some reason these private baptisms were not recorded in the parish registers. A few months later if the child survived a formal baptism would be performed and that baptism would be recorded in the parish register. Since this younger John O'Donnell died within the year it might be supposed he was sickly at birth. This might have been a few months prior to the March 1848 formal baptism.

The two images below are from the same page of the Kilfinane, Co. Limerick parish register for March 1848. The first entry in the top image is John, son of Thomas O'Donnell and Margaret McDonald.

In the bottom image the first circled name is "Johannes" and the second circled item is "Johann", an abbreviation of Johannes, which is Latin for John. In the upper image the first circled item is "Joh". By comparing it with the lower image it can be seen that this is

an abbreviation for Johannes. The second circled item in the top image shows the same abbreviation in the adjacent baptismal record.





Patrick O'Donnell was born in Ireland as were both his parents. His parents, Thomas and Margaret O'Donnell, probably came to the U.S. in 1849 when Patrick was four years old. The 1900 and 1920 census records give Patrick's year of immigration as 1849 while the 1910 census gave 1850.

Kate Carr O'Donnell was born in the tri-county area and both her parents were born in Ireland. In 1876 Patrick O'Donnell and his family were living just south of the village of Truxton, on South Hill, across the road from his mother and father-in-law, Bridget and Dennis Carr. Their family tree shown above was constructed by combining the 1880 and 1900 census information with information obtained by the author from Helena Dwyer of the village of Truxton. They had 14 children as of June 1900 and 13 were still living at that time. The composite family tree shows 14 children so one of them must have died prior to 1900. Three of the older children must have moved out of their parents' house by 1900 because they weren't recorded at this location in the census of 1900.

The Death of Thomas O'Donnell

"Sad in the extreme was the sudden death by accident of Thomas O'Donnell, aged 12 years, eldest son of Patrick O'Donnell, of Truxton, on Tuesday, the 15th of September.

"The little boy was driving a team of horses which was drawing an unusually large load of sowed corn. He was sitting on the rack in front with his feet resting on the whiffletrees, when in some mysterious manner he lost his balance, falling instantly to the ground, and in such a position that before the team could be stopped, the wheel passed over his chest and another over his neck, crushing and mangling him in a most horrible manner. His father, who was at work near by, hurried to the scene the terrible accident and raised bleeding and almost lifeless form of his dearly beloved child from the ground, in his arms, but too late to render him any earthly aid. He opened his eyes once, and looking piteously at his father, made an effort to speak, but was unable to do so. Before the father had time to reach the house death had claimed his darling boy.

"Oh! The agony of grief, and consternation of that mother, when she beheld the inanimate and unrecognizable form of her loved child whom she saw go forth but two short hours before, in his usual health and animation. He was remarkably intelligent and promising boy, one for whom we should bespeak a life of future usefulness, could be but have been spared. His funeral was largely attended on Thursday, the 19th, by the friends of the bereaved family, who have the sympathy of the entire community in this their sad affliction."

In 1900 Patrick and Kate were living across the road from John and Bridget Comerford. Patrick and John were brothers-in-law having married sisters Kate and Bridget Carr respectively. John Comerford had taken over the old Carr farm and his father and mother-in-law, Dennis and Bridget Carr, were living with his family at the time of the 1900 census. On an adjacent farm, a little further down the road was fellow brother-inlaw William Gibbon who married Mary Carr.

The 1910 census indicated that Patrick and Kate were living in Truxton, had 14 children and 12 of them were still living, at the time of the census.

Marie O'Donnell married John Reilly who was related to the Caseys. Thomas O'Donnell was killed by a horse in his early teens. Kitty (Catherine) O'Donnell married Louis Crandal but they had no children. Kitty died shortly after her marriage and Louis remarried and had a large family by his second wife. Margaret O'Donnell married a man named Murphy who died young, she married a second time. Isabell O'Donnell never married. Frank O'Donnell married May K. Carty. Hugh O'Donnell never married. Alice O'Donnell married Hugh Johnston. Anna O'Donnell married William Farrell. Emmit O'Donnell married Patricia H. O'Connor. <u>Albert A. O'Donnell never married</u>. Gertrude L. O'Donnell married Daniel P. Hartnett.

In 1920 Patrick was 74 years old and still living in the town of Truxton. His occupation was listed as a dairy farmer. The census date was Jan 21-23, 1920.



After the death of Patrick O'Donnell on June 26, 1928 it was decided to sell his farm in order to settle the estate. The entire notice is reproduced here because of the insight it provides into the equipment and implements that were needed to run a dairy farm in the early part of the 20th century. Apparently none of his children wanted to take over the family farm. This was the time when health codes were requiring that dirt floors in dairy barns needed to be replaced with concrete. This would have been a large investment for older farmers who were nearing retirement and sometimes the children either had farms of their own or perhaps they also didn't want to make the investment in upgrading the sanitary conditions on the old family farm.







Family Story from Beth DeArmond - July 25, 2021

On a recent trip my younger brother and sister were in Truxton in the hopes of locating the graves of John O'Donnell and his second son Leo, who died after falling out of a tree at the age of 10. While they were able to locate St. Patrick's Cemetery, they were unable to locate the graves.

As with most families, there have been many stories handed down through the generations. We were aware that John was previously married and that there was a child who died at a young age. Your work helped to fill in those pieces. One story indicated that after Leo's death John and Mary were engaged in a particularly heated argument when Mary hit John in the head with an iron skillet. Although he survived, Mary realized that she very nearly killed him. At that point she packed up Edwin and Margaret and returned to her parents' home in Syracuse. There was no contact between the children and John until my grandfather, Edwin, visited him on his deathbed. I have childhood memories of Mary. At the time it was in the 1960's and she was in her 90's living with Margaret and her husband (Courtney Jones) in Sarasota, Florida. My grandparents, Edwin and Marilyn Smith O'Donnell are also buried in Sarasota County Florida.







Edward O'Donnell Dies of Injuries

Cortland Man Struck by Lackawanna Train in Syracuse

"Edward O'Donnell of 200 Port Watson-st., this city, was struck by the Lackawanna train due here at 6:35 last night at the South Clinton-st. crossing in Syracuse and received injuries from which he died at the Hospital of the Good Shepherd about five hours later.

"Cortland people on the train and other eye witnesses state that the man gave an exhibition of fortitude seldom seen. There wasn't an outcry, although he was conscious and talked with the men who worked to release him from beneath the pilot, and he was game when the doctors placed him on the operating table, and kept his nerve after the operation, talking with those about him for nearly an hour, when consciousness left him, and he died at 9:50 o'clock.

Daughter Was on Train

"An especially trying feature of the accident was the fact that Mr. O'Donnell's daughter, Miss Bertha O'Donnell, was on the train. She had been spending the day in Syracuse with her father, and, after he had seen her on board the train which leaves Syracuse at 4:50, he started down and across the tracks for his boarding place on the west side of the city. No explanation is offered as to how he happened to get in front of the engine.

"Edward O'Donnell was 49 years of age, and for a time was employed as a hammer man in the plant of the Cortland Carriage Goods company. He went to Syracuse three weeks ago to work for the Brown Lipe Gear Co., leaving hi8s family in Cortland.

"Besides his wife and daughter he leaves three sisters, Mrs. Martin E. McMahon and Mrs. Daniel Brown of Cortland and Mrs. B. Garner of Cuyler. Two brothers, Henry and John O'Donnell, live on farms near the city.

"Mr. O'Donnell was a member of Cortland lodge No. 1,512, Loyal Order of Moose, and of St. Mary's church."

DEATH OF PATRICK O'DONNELL, **RESULT OF ACCIDENTAL INJURY**

Truxton, June 27-The funeral of Patrick O'Donnell, a prominent resident of this town, was held at St. Patrick's church on Tuesday morning. Interment was in the Catholic cemetery.

Rev. Edward Crowley, pastor of St. Patrick's church, was celebrant, Rev. Patrick Donohoe of Cortland was deacon, and Rev. William F. Christian of Fayetteville, a former pastor of St. Patrick's church, was subdeacon.

The bearers were Patrick Kiley. Joseph Kiley, David Wallace, John Morton, Daniel Hartnett, and John Comerford.

Mr. O'Donnell's death occurred last Saturday at Cortland hospital, the result of an injury sustained at the carnival grounds on Wednesday evening. He was visiting at the home of his son Frank in Cortland and attended the carnival. When about to leave the grounds at 10:30 he stumbled over some loose boards and fell. His skull was fractured and he sustained other injuries. He sank into a stupor before morning and did not regain consciousness.

Mr. O'Donnell was born in Ireland in 1845 and came to Truxton when he was four years old with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. William O'Donnell, who were residents of this town for some years and then moved to Solon.

Mr. O'Donnell was employed as a clerk in a store in his youth but at the time of his marriage to Miss Kate Carr of Fabius on Jan. 8, 1871, he bought the farm of 250 acres on South Hill where they reared their family Hartnett, Albert, Hugh, and Emmett and celebrated their golden wedding O'Donnell of Truxton.













The information on this family was developed as the result of an effort to track down any descendants of James O'Donnell, son of Dennis from Donegal. No descendants of this James were found but instead the descendants of another James O'Donnell were found.

The connection between James O'Donnell and Mary Dougherty had been made based on several assumptions. The 1860 census James O'Donnell was assumed to be the son of Dennis and Margaret O'Donnell since he was in the Town of Camillus when the rest of the family was there and he was of approximately the same age as their James in the 1850 census.

A James O'Donnell of approximately same age died in 1878 while living at 10 Manilla St. In the 1900 census there was a widow named Mary O'Donnell living at 119 Manilla St, born in the same year as James O'Donnell, son of Dennis, and she had a son named James (from 1915 census).

However after an extensive search the 1870 census (see below) showed that these two James O'Donnell's <u>are not</u> the same person. This is based on the fact that this James O'Donnell was born in New York and <u>could not</u> read or write while the other James O'Donnell (son of Dennis) was born in Ireland and could read and write.

"Robert Gardner, a veteran railroad man, died at his home, No. 135 Oak street, at 11:30 o'clock yesterday morning after an illness covering a period of twelve weeks. At his home last night it was said that the cause of his death could not be attained, but it was believed to have been superinduced by an accident which he sustained early last

April. Dr. George M. Price was the attending physician. He could not be communicated with last night.

"While walking east on Burnet avenue one night in April, Mr. Gardner was run down by a bicyclist, whose name was said to be Harper. On account of his advanced years Mr. Gardner suffered a severe shock which, together with his injuries, kept him confined at the Hospital of the Good Shepherd for more than two weeks.

"At the time of the accident Police Captain Quigley caused the arrest of the wheelman on a charge of violating the city ordinance in riding a bicycle on the sidewalk. Mr. Gardner came to Police Court, but he swooned and he had to be taken back to the hospital.

"Since his discharge from that institution Mr. Gardner had not been himself, and three weeks ago he became worse and had to take to his bed. His death was unexpected, and the doctor was surprised upon making his daily call early in the afternoon to find that his patient had passed away.

"Mr. Gardner was born in County Mayo, Ireland, 60 years ago, and removed to this country in 1869. He located in Syracuse, where he had always made his home. Besides his wife, Mrs. Catherine Dougherty Gardner, whom he married twenty-nine years ago in this city, he is survived by one daughter, Mrs. Wallace Miller, three sons, John, James and Robert Gardner, and also a brother, John Gardner of County Mayo, Ireland, and two sisters, Miss Margaret Gardner of the same place, and Mrs. John McAndrew of this city."

"Shortly before 4 o'clock yesterday she said she wanted to sit by the window, where she could watch the people pass. She had been in the chair only a few minutes when she called feebly and fell over against the window.

"Members of the family hurried to her and Dr. Cornell N. Smith, who had been in attendance, was summoned. Mrs. Gardner was dead when he arrived. Rev. Richard J. Shanahan of St. John the Evangelist Church administered the last rites of the church.

"Coroner George R. Kinne, who was notified of Mrs. Gardner's death by Dr. Smith, gave Undertaken Edward F. Gaynor permission to take charge of the body. The Coroner will investigate today.

"Mrs. Gardner was born in Ireland. She had lived in Syracuse more than fifty years. She was well known in the East End of the city. She is survived by one daughter and three sons, Mrs. Wallace Miller and John H., James J. and Robert Gardner. There are also two brothers and four sisters, Thomas and Patrick Doughtery, Mrs. John Welch, Mrs. Bridget Flannery and Mrs. Mary O'Donnell, all of this city, and Mrs. George Price of East Syracuse."

Future Research Directions:

Key missing information: Obituaries for James O'Donnell (died September 1878), and James Dougherty (died before Oct. 1912) and Thomas Dougherty, his father (died before Mar 1892).

The obituary for James O'Donnell is a key piece of missing information that would establish his family connections to the other O'Donnells. Without his obituary it was necessary to compare this James with all the other known James O'Donnells in the Syracuse area based on other information such as age, birth place of parents, occupation and ability to read and write. In the end this type of comparison only allows a person to be ruled out or to be considered compatible. It reduced the field of possibilities but did not allow a definite identification.

Thomas and Catherine Dougherty had at least eight children who survived to adulthood. The first to die was Catherine Dougherty Gardner and her obituary gave the names of all her siblings with the exception of her youngest brother, James Dougherty. His obituary has not been found and so it wasn't possible to determine if he had ever married and whether he was survived by any children. His last appearance in the records was the 1880 census where he was single and living with his parents at 342 East Water Street.

The obituary of Thomas Dougherty has not been found and the date of his death is only known to be between 1880 and 1892. The obituary of Thomas would possibly allow the identification of his siblings and parents and allow the reconstruction of his family tree.

The William O'Donnell Family of South Hill

The following O'Donnell family was not originally thought to be related to Thomas O'Donnell and Margaret McDonald or their descendants. In the 1870 and 1875 census William and Mary O'Donnell were living on South Hill just two farms away from Patrick O'Donnell and Kate O'Donnell. With what little information is available it is consistent that William might be Patrick's older brother, but this is just speculation at this point.

The William and Mary O'Donnell family above was thought to have a documented connection with Morgan Hill, Cuyler, NY. This information came from Dennis Rasbach in a Sept. 8, 2010 e-mail

The information about Bridget staying with her sister Mary at Morgan Hill came from Cecelia Murphy, grand-daughter of Bridget Drury Pierce, in a letter of recollections about the family written in 1937: "Grandma Pierce [Bridget Drury] came to America when Grandpa [Frank Albert Pierce] was 15 or 16 [her emigration was in 1868, according to the 1910 census of Preble, NY]. Grandma was 'quite a chunk of a girl of a woman.' She came in Spring, and stayed at Morgan Hill with her sister, Aunt Mary."

It now appears that Aunt Mary's actual location was South Hill. The O'Donnell family was living on South Hill between 1870 and 1880. There was an O'Donnell family living on Morgan Hill from 1855 until the late 1860s. This was about the same time that the William O'Donnell family was living on South Hill. This Morgan Hill O'Donnell family might be the cause of Cecelia Murphy's misidentification.



Since William and Mary don't appear on the map means that they had moved prior to the collection of data for the 1876 map.

In the 1892 NYS census the individuals are listed sequentially without any residence or family number information. Although there is also no explicit indication as to how the individuals are related to each other previous census information and obituaries make it apparent that these are all children of Mary O'Donnell and the late William O'Donnell. In 1875 there was a two month old John O'Donnell who didn't show up in the 1892 census. There is a John O'Donnell belonging to this family whose gravestone inscription records his birth and death as both happening in 1873. These different John O'Donnells might be the same person if the gravestone inscription had been in error and should have been 1875 instead of 1873.

At the time of the **1920** census Mary O'Donnell was not living with any of her children. In **1930** Mary wasn't living with her daughters Bridget Conroy or Agnes Cerny or her son Bryan. Her son Thomas was probably still in Springfield. MA in **1930** but he wasn't found in the census.

Dennis raised an interesting question earlier when there appeared to be two William and Mary O'Donnell families. Could these two William and Mary O'Donnell families be the same persons? The 2nd William and Mary O'Donnell were only known through the inscriptions found on their gravestones in St. Patrick's Cemetery, Truxton, NY. The 1st William and Mary O'Donnell were defined by the baptism records from the St. James Church in Cazenovia. The 1870 census information matched the name of the children for the 1st family.

The birth dates for this 2nd William and Mary O'Donnell family, found in the gravestone inscriptions, varied from those found in the 1870 census records above. Given the known variation in ages found in the census records. *it was possible that these two families were one and the same.* The information that was known about the two families at that time (2010) could be merged together and no contradictions would result, except for the variation in the birth dates already noted. As more information from the full set of census records and obituaries were found it was readily apparent that these were actually one family

William and Mary O'Donnell were burying their children in Truxton but no records of the baptisms of these children have been found at St. James Church. There is a possible explanation for the absence of the baptismal records for two of these four O'Donnell children who were buried in the Truxton Catholic Cemetery. It is possibly connected with an old Irish custom that was explained to me by my 5th cousin, Con Ryan, from Gleninchnaveigh, Upperchurch, Co. Tipperary.

The Private Baptism

When a baby was born and the health of the baby was suspect, the parents would request that the parish priest come to the house and perform a private baptism. The immediate concern was that if the child should die without baptism, to provide the removal of original sin with which all Catholics are born, the baby would be barred from entering the gates of heaven. Once the private baptism had been performed the urgency was removed and a formal baptism at the church could be scheduled later. The custom in Ireland was to NOT record these private baptisms in the official church records. I am not certain if this practice (of not recording the private baptisms) was carried on in the US.

Since two of William and Mary's (No. 2) children died in the same year that they were born, William and Mary might have been familiar with the private baptism custom. Out of fear they might have also used the private baptism custom with their other two, who, although they didn't die in infancy, failed to make it out of their childhood years, dying at ages 7 and 12 respectively. It is possible that the O'Donnell's used private baptisms with all their children and just never had the chance to schedule the formal church baptisms that would have recorded the events in the church records.

Other possibilities - they might have been baptized in St. Patrick's Church in Truxton (when did Truxton records start?), whose early records were destroyed by fire.



In the Gen document Thomas Maher's wife was Mary Kinney, b. 1823, Co. Cork, d. 1899. This surname is incorrect since their children's baptism records show that the name of Thomas Maher's wife was Mary O'Donnell. Suspiciously their daughter Mary Agnes married Lawrence Kinney, so that there was a Mary Kinney in the family. Perhaps it was a transcription error. Mary O'Donnell's census ages are consistent with being born in 1823.

No obituaries have been found for either Thomas or Mary O'Donnell Maher. The Fulton History Newspaper Archive was searched for any Mahar, Maher or Meagher deaths from 1880 to 1900. Since Thomas and Mary's daughters Mary and Sarah were buried in Pompey it can be assumed that their parents were also buried in Pompey. However, after searching the Find Graves site and a list of interments in the Immaculate Conception Cemetery, Pompey, NY, Thomas and Mary O'Donnell Maher were not found.

Richard doesn't exist. The census taker mistakenly entered this name when it was actually Bridget/Sarah. In the 1910, 1920 and 1925 census Sarah McCarthy was listed as Sarah B. McCarthy. A case could be made that the "B." stands for Bridget. This would explain why no Sarah shows up as a daughter of Thomas and Mary Maher in the census or church records.

Is it possible that the census enumerator heard Richard when the person said Bridget and hearing Richard he wrote down son? The 1865 census is the only place where Richard shows up and strangely, Bridget, who does have a baptismal record, while Richard, born the same year does not, she doesn't show up in the 1865 census. Since Bridget and Richard were both born in 1862 it might be possible that they were twins. If so then Richard's baptismal record should have appeared next to Bridget's in the numbering sequence. 

Michael J. O'Donnell and Ann Boyle Howe



There are plenty of mysteries to be solved with this family. According to the 1865 census, for both Michael and Ann this was their second marriage. The actual record of that marriage has not been found. In the pension papers Ann's name appeared as Boyle. An explanation for this is that Ann's maiden name was Boyle and her first marriage was to a man named Elon C. Howe and <u>James Howe (b. 1851)</u> from the 1860 census was her son from that first marriage. This means that Michael and Ann could not have been married in 1851 but at a later date prior to the 1854-5 birth of Michael O'Donnell, Jr. James O'Donnell (b. 1849) was a son from Michael's first marriage. It is uncertain where Willie belongs in birth order but according to Kristen Rickert's "Mary's Forget-Me-Nots" he appears to be the child from Michael O'Donnell's second marriage. By the time of the 1865 census James O'Donnell has left home and 14 year old James Howe was still living at home.

From Mary's Forget-Me-Nots - Part 3 The Farm at Fenner Hill

Note: Mary is Mary O'Donnell Kinney, daughter of Michael O'Donnell, Jr. and Mary E. Burke. She was the granddaughter of Michael J. O'Donnell, Sr. and Ann Boyle and all references to relationships in the following are relative to Mary.

"Our Grandpa O'Donnell had a small farm at Fishers NY about half was between Rochester and Canandaigua - pre-Civil War Time. It was at the Canandaigua Court House that our father [Michael J. O'Donnell, Jr.] said his father enlisted for the Civil War, where he served under Capt. Parker in Co. L, 9th Artillery out of Auburn, NY.

"When Grandpa O'D and Grandma (Anne Howe O'D) were first married, they lived at <u>Williamsport PA</u> where our father was born. They moved to Perryville before our father was seven years old. The little farmhouse was about half way from Grandpa Burke's farm at the top of Fenner Hill. The little red schoolhouse where our mother and father went to school was a short distance from Uncle Tom's farm. It was a one mile walk to school for our father from his home and it was a two mile walk for our mother and her brothers and sisters. They all grew up together. Our father was three years older than our mother. He said he was as big as most men when he was twelve years old, and was earning - in Civil War Times - a man's pay - "\$1.00 a day rain or shine".

"After the Civil War, Grandpa O'D. went out to Nebraska to claim his land for army service. The Homestead Act provided settlers with 160 acres and eventual ownership but they had to live two years on the site. At the end of the first winter, messengers brought word to Grandma that Grandpa died of the "fever" with 20 others of his <u>army comrades</u> when an epidemic swept the camp."

Added facts: Michael O'Donnell, Sr. was working on the railroad and living in a camp in Nebraska near Indianola, Red Willow County, with the rest of the <u>railroad</u> <u>workers</u> at the time of his death. The Homestead Act was signed into law in May 1862 and allowed any American or freed slave to claim up to 160 free acres of Federal land. Eligibility wasn't predicated on service during the Civil War. Apparently Michael was working on the railroad to make some money.








Indianola, Red Willow County, Nebraska

Indianola, Red Willow Co., Nebraska - 1905 - Historical Map Works. Notice the Burlington & Missouri River Railroad running westerly along the south side of Indianola. There is a cemetery near the middle of Lot #12 where Michael J. O'Donnell, Sr. is probably buried. Also notice the number of 160 acre lots in the area around Indianola. These are the size of the parcel of land that were awarded under the Homestead Act.

This is a closer view of the two cemeteries on the northwest corner of Indianola. Notice that there was a separate cemetery for Catholics. When the McCook Precinct, just west of Indianola Precinct, was selected as the midpoint terminal of the Omaha to Denver route by the railroad company Indianola began to shrink as McCook continued to grow. In the 2010 census the population of the city of Indianola was only 584.

In the Beaver Precinct of Red Willow county was Francis M Pennington, an acquaintance of Michael O'Donnell. Pennington had given an affidavit that was found in Ann O'Donnell's pension petition stating that he (Pennington) knew O'Donnell and that O'Donnell worked for the railroad. At the time of the 1880 census Robert Brown (age 23) was boarding with the Pennington family. Michael O'Donnell was not found in Beaver Precinct, Driftwood Precinct, Danbury Precinct or Red Willow Precinct. Therefore at the time of the 1880 census Michael O'Donnell was not found in Red Willow County. The boarding house for the RR workers was in Indianola Precinct Res No. 27 - Joseph Snyder's Boarding house, there were 23 of them including the boss. Most of the railroad workers were single, three were married and one was a widower. The oldest was John Hulstrom (72), the next oldest was Cyrus Griffis (55) and the youngest was Thomas Haley (19).

Michael O'Donnell enlisted in the Army, in Co. L, 2nd Regt NY Heavy Artillery on October 22, 1863 and was discharged with the rank of Private on September 29, 1865.

Marriage

Ann was married to Michael O'Donnell under the name Ann Boyle in April 1851 by Father O'Flaherty at Auburn, NY

"...there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that neither she nor her husband had been previously married"

"If either had been previously married, so state and give date of death ..."

NOTE: The above section of the pension application was lined through even though the 1865 census showed that both Ann and Michael had previously been married. By reverting back to her assumed maiden name of Boyle perhaps Ann was attempting to hide her first marriage to simplify the pension application process. She might have felt this was necessary because she did not possess the requested information on Michael's first marriage.

F. M. Pennington Affidavit

"...that he knew Michael O'Donnell in year 1881 and that he was staying at his place in the Spring of 1881 and the he went some 25 miles to work on the RR some time in fall of 1881 and the he (Michael O'Donnell) was taken sick while at work on the road and died some time about the last of September 1881 and that said Michael O'Donnell was bearyed (sic) by and at the expence (sic) of Red Willow Co. Neb and that the Books in the court house of said Co. show that one Michael O'Donnell was Bearyed (sic) by the Co. at that time and that he has examined sed (sic) Boocks (sic) and knows it to Be a fact and that he Belives (sic) that said Michael O'Donnell was the Husband of said Ann O'Donnell."

NOTE: In the 1880 census (Census date June 1, 1880) Francis (Frank) Pennington was living in Beaver Precinct, Red Willow Co., Nebraska. At that time there was a boarder staying with the family named Robert Brown, 23, single. Brown was born in Indiana and his parents were both born in Ohio."

NOTE: Michael O'Donnell's death has been reported as May 10, 1881 at Indianola, Nebraska. It is curious that despite Mr. Pennington's statement in his affidavit that he had checked the records at the court house his statement placed Michael O'Donnell's death at the end of September in 1881.



The ages found for John and Margaret Nix in the various census records (1855 - 1910) are displayed on the above chart. These are connected separately for John and Margaret and are represented by the curving lines on the chart. The straight lines, one for each person, describe the expected age progression. These straight lines are not the usual least squares fitting lines that are normally encountered in the statistical analysis of experimental data because the variations are not random. In this analysis the slope of the straight lines is determined by the scale chosen for the axes and the initial height is set by selecting an age for the first census, which is 1855 in this case. The most accurate ages are usually found in a person's younger years, those under 25. In the case of Margaret she was found in both the 1855 and 1860 census

records at ages 17 and 23 respectively. Her age in the 1855 census was taken to be the most accurate and this produced a birth year of 1838. In John's case he was older and didn't show up until the 1865 census at age 46. Therefore it was decided to move his line up to closely match his age in the final 1910 census. There isn't any scientific reasoning here only the expectation that at some point people stop lying about their age and are proud to have survived to a ripe old age. This yielded a birth year for John of 1819.







Descendants of Thomas Maher



The initial Maher family information was shared by Gay Young on the Co. Tipperary Internet list on March 8, 2009 under the title: "Maher - Connors - Kinney -Coonan - Ryan." This document is referenced as "Gen." all three of Thomas Maher's sons left Ireland and settled in central New York. Cornelius, Thomas and John all settled in the town of Pompey, Onondaga Co., NY. Although Cornelius, Thomas and John Maher might be siblings no evidence had been uncovered so far to prove that nor has any information been found that shows their father was named Thomas. The birthplace of son Thomas in Co. Cork is also suspect. Where questions still persist information from the above document are labeled (Gen).

Thomas Maher's wife's name was Mary O'Donnell. John Maher's obituary has not been found and his death in Ontario, Canada seems out of place for a man who spent most of his life in Pompey, NY. The children of Thomas Maher and Mary O'Donnell given by the Gen document are found in the Pompey census records. However, there were only two daughters; Bridget (b. 1863, Pompey) is actually Sarah Bridget (b. Sept 1862, Pompey).

Mary Coonan and her husband John Maher settled in Pompey, NY in 1850. She was followed by her brothers James in 1852, John in 1855 and sister Honora by 1863. The children of John Maher and Mary Coonan found in the Gen document are correct names and number but the birth order and birth years had to be corrected via census data.
