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The Gleason Families of Onondaga and Cortland Counties

The purpose of this paper was to identify any other Gleasons in the two counties who might have been related to the Gleasons of Moyaliff civil parish, Co. Tipperary. In some cases these Gleasons left a nice trail and it was possible to trace them back to Ireland. In other cases the Gleason only made one or two census appearances, they came over to the US alone, and married after arriving here. Tracing these lone travelers back to Ireland is next to impossible. In most cases the Gleason individuals were traced only far enough to determine their possible connection to the Moyaliff Gleason so a full genealogy will not be developed for most of the individuals in this paper. It should also be noted that the spelling variation of the surname (i.e. Gleeson or Gleason) is not of primary importance for the purposes of this paper.



This is a picture of the gravestone of the Gleason sisters, Margaret Gleason Ryan and Catherine Gleason McGrath, in St. Patrick's Cemetery, Maple Ridge, town of Martinsburg, Lewis Co, NY. It was taken in August 2007 and the contrast and gamma settings have been adjusted to make the names Margaret and Catherine just barely legible on a badly weathered gravestone.

Traditionally, the engraved side of the gravestone is placed so that it faces east, toward the rising sun. This stone had fallen over and had been propped up facing to the west. The cemetery in Maple Ridge is located on the Tug Hill Plateau which consistently receives some of the worst winter weather in New York State. This has accelerated the aging of this stone. Fortunately there are two lists of the inscriptions found in this cemetery. They are known as the Powlin list (June 1965) and the Dunton list (prior to 1950). The exact wording found on the two lists is slightly different but the death dates and ages are the same.

<p>The Long and Gleason Connections</p> <p>The primary individual here is Daniel Long. His family was from Raheen, Holycross parish which was right across the Farneybridge River from the farm of Michael McGrath (my ggg-grandfather) in the townland of Moyaliff, Moyaliff parish. In 1847, his parents left Ireland and settled the family in Hoosick Falls, Rensselaer Co., just east of Albany, NY. In 1852 Daniel and his brother Richard came to the Syracuse area where Richard quickly married Margaret McGrath (daughter of Michael McGrath and former neighbor back in Ireland). By 1854 Daniel Long had married Mary Gleeson. In 1855 Daniel Long was living in the town of Geddes on the west side of Syracuse. Also living in Geddes was Thomas Gleeson and his wife Elisa Woodward. According to the 1855 census Thomas and Elisa arrived in Geddes separately and were therefore married in the US. [Note: Here are two examples of probable lone travelers that are difficult to trace.] The questions to be answered are (1) Are Thomas and Mary Gleeson related? (2) <u>Are either of them related to the Moyaliff Gleasons?</u></p> <p>While living in Geddes Daniel traveled to Pompey to have one of his children baptized with his brother Richard Long and Richard's wife Margaret as sponsors. Then later, Thomas Gleeson, while still living in Geddes, also traveled to Pompey to have one of his children baptized with Daniel Long being one of the sponsors.</p>

<p>The Lahert of Connection The name Lahert first came to my attention in 2007 when I was taking pictures of gravestones in the Immaculate Conception Cemetery in Pompey, NY. There was a stone for Patrick Gleason and Bridget Lahert. I took the because of the name Gleason and never gave the name Lahert a second thought — until now. While writing this paper two more Laherts were discovered in an obscure paper from 1871 containing the names of the parishioners of the Immaculate Conception Church, which also included the maiden names of their wives. All three Lahert individuals were female and the maiden names are normally difficult to determine. A long search of the census records showed that these families were long-time residents of the towns of Pompey and Lafayette.</p>

<p>Older John and Mary Gleason of the First Ward John and Mary arrived at different times and were probably lone travelers. They appear to have arrived in the US separately and married in the US after their arrival. The couple had two children who both died young. The only family connection found was a cousin in the 1880 census.</p>

At this point there is not enough information to uniquely identify the Irish marriage of this John and Mary Gleason among all the others.</p>

- Find all Gleasons in the 1850-1860 census records for Onondaga Co.

Immigration Information

- 1855 - years in US
- 1900 - arrival year in US
- 1910 - arrival year in US

Question: Could Patrick and Arthur be the same person?

- Ensures continuity in that the same family is being followed
- Establish birth order of the children
- Identify missing or extra children. Switching among first names, middle names and nicknames can cause confusion.

Presence of Relatives

- Parents, siblings, aunts and uncles, cousins, and in-laws living with family in census records.
- This can provide information to determine the wife's maiden name.

Wife's Maiden Name

- Children's baptism records

Parents' Obituaries

- Daughters' married names
- Absence or presence of surviving relatives — more family connections
- Status of children (alive/deceased; residences)

Childrens' Obituaries

- Status of siblings (alive/deceased)
- Married names of sisters
- Siblings residence

Looking Overseas

- Need to determine if the couple married in the old country or in the US
- Ideal profile: Parents married in Ireland and then had one or more children baptized in Ireland prior to their immigration to the US. This can sometimes be a way of discovering the wife's maiden name.
- This provides an excellent pattern for searching in the Irish parish registers.

Nibbling Around the Edges

- The Family Tree helps establish the big picture so that it is possible to see the gaps and missing information and to go after the little details which have remained hidden.
- It is now possible to tighten some of the search parameters while loosening up other ones when searching for some of the most difficult to find information.
- This is also the time to see if the boundaries can be pushed a bit more back in time and to possibly make some connections back in the Irish records.

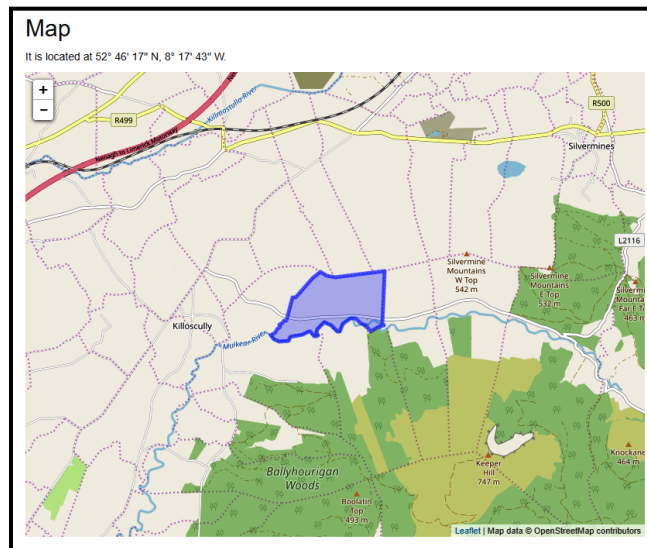

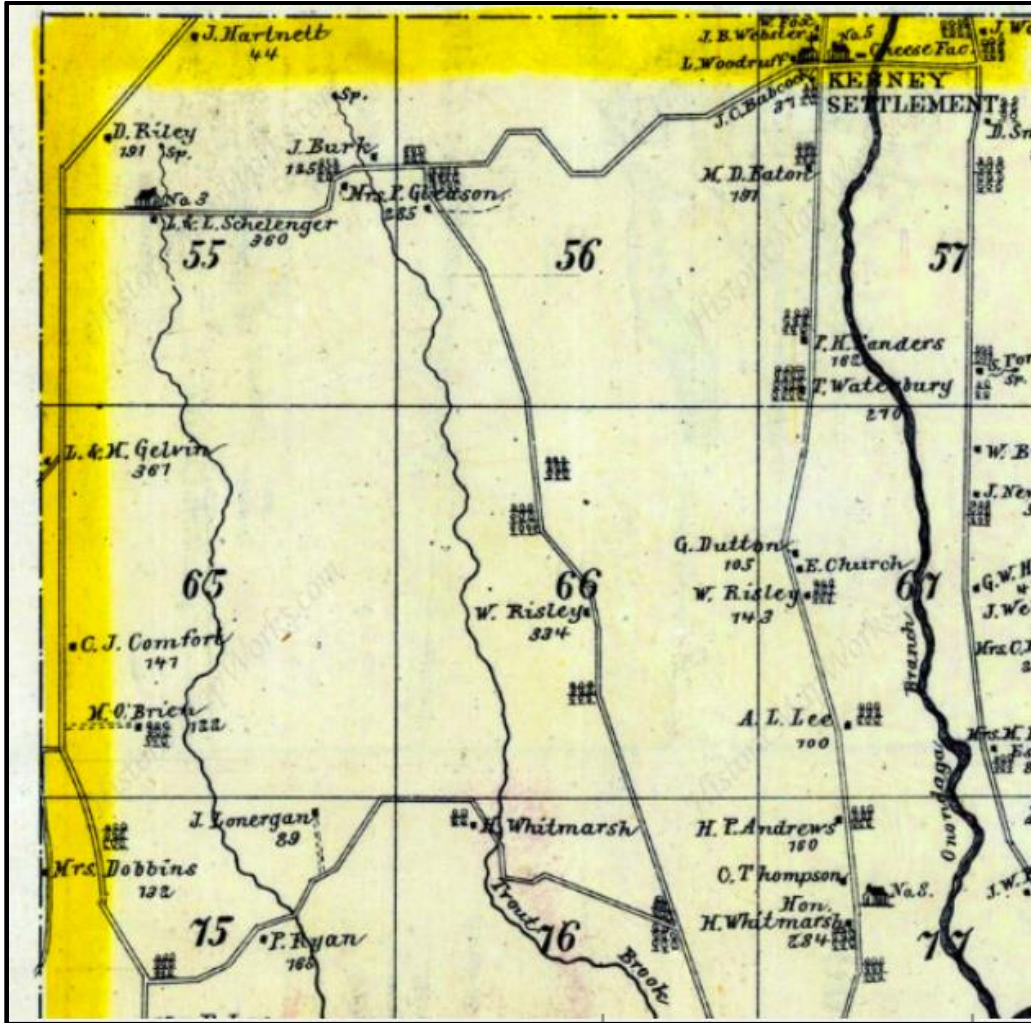

John McGraw and Ellen Comerford and their family were living between Jeremiah Burke and Patrick Gleason in the upper left hand corner of this map. The Patrick Ryan and Mary Dwyer family was living in the lower left hand corner of the map, just to the right of the number "75." Also in the upper left hand corner, just down the road from Burke, McGraw and Gleason, is School No. 3, also known as the Irish School.

The Long and Gleeson Connections

The Long and Gleeson Connections

The primary individual here is Daniel Long. His family was from Raheen, Holycross parish which was right across the Farneybridge River from the farm of Michael McGrath (my ggg-grandfather) in the townland of Moyaliff, Moyaliff parish. In 1847, Daniel's parents left Ireland and settled the family in Hoosick Falls, Rensselaer Co., just east of Albany, NY. In 1852 Daniel and his brother Richard came to the Syracuse area where Richard quickly married Margaret McGrath (daughter of Michael McGrath and former neighbor back in Ireland). By 1854 Daniel Long had married Mary Gleeson. In 1855 Daniel Long was living in the town of Geddes on the west side of Syracuse. Also living in Geddes was Thomas Gleeson and his wife Elisa Woodward. According to the 1855 census Thomas and Elisa arrived in Geddes separately and were therefore married in the US. [Note: Here are two examples of probable lone travelers that are difficult to trace.] The questions to be answered are (1) Are Thomas and Mary Gleeson related? (2) Are either of them related to the Moyaliff Gleesons?

While living in Geddes Daniel traveled to Pompey to have one of his children baptized with his brother Richard Long and Richard's wife Margaret as sponsors. Then later, Thomas Gleeson, while still living in Geddes, also traveled to Pompey to have one of his children baptized with Daniel Long being one of the sponsors.

Their son John, here in Chicago, was not present in 1855. Both John's and Eliza's ages are way off. This is probably not the same Thomas and Eliza Gleason family found in Geddes in 1855.

1880 - Thomas and Eliza and their children (Thomas, John, and Eliza) were not found in Chicago, Syracuse, or anywhere else.

Summary

This Long - Gleason connection is still a mystery; even after shaking all the trees. In 1852, Daniel Long came to Geddes, from Raheen, Holycross parish, by way of a stay over of a few years in Hoosick Falls, Rensselaer County, NY. Daniel met and married a Mary Gleason prior to 1854. It still isn't known if he knew her back in Ireland. Also living in Geddes in 1855 was a Thomas Gleason and his wife Eliza Woodward who had been in Geddes for 2 years and 1 year respectively. As shown in the baptism records above both Daniel and Thomas had a child baptized in Pompey. Daniel had his brother, Richard, and Richard's wife, Margaret, as sponsors and Thomas had Daniel as one of his child's baptism sponsors. It still isn't known if Mary Gleason Long and Thomas Gleason were related or where they came from in Ireland.

Obituaries for Ann and Thomas Gleason were finally found. Since Thomas died in Auburn at the home of his sister Mrs. Thomas Burke apparently he vacated 329 Shonnard Street in 1896 and moved to Auburn. His sister Johanna probably also moved to Auburn at about the same time.

Originally it was thought that the Gleasons arrived in 1851. The party would have consisted of at least Ann and her children: Thomas, Mary and Joanna. The fate of Ann's husband Michael is still unknown. They were not found in the Famine Immigration database.

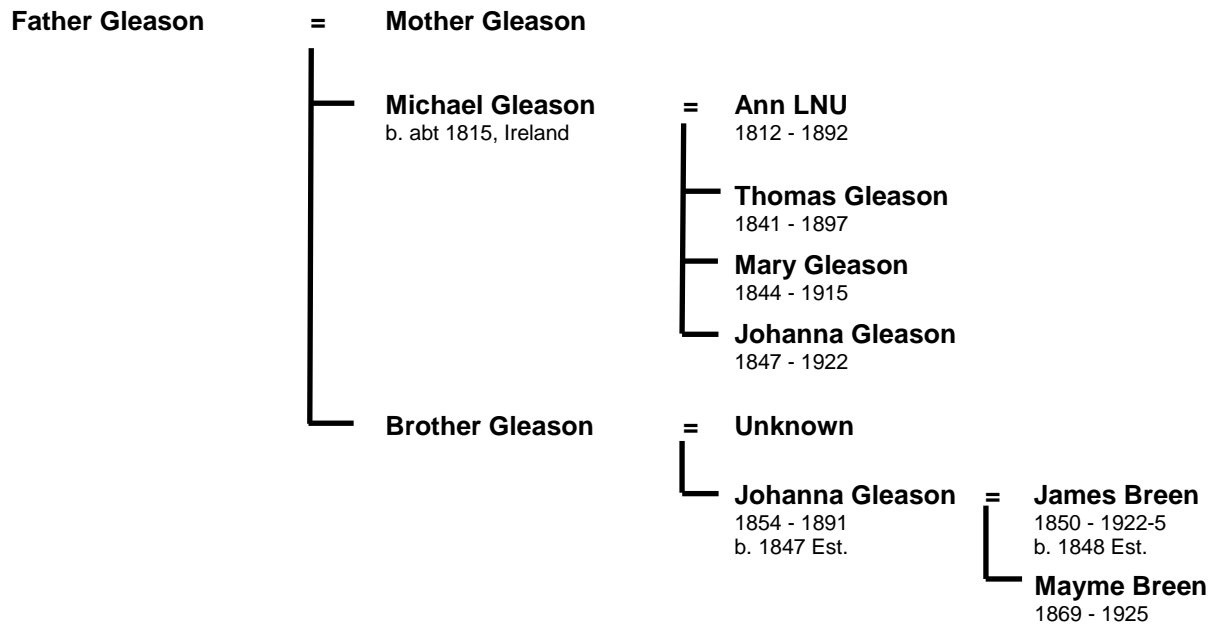

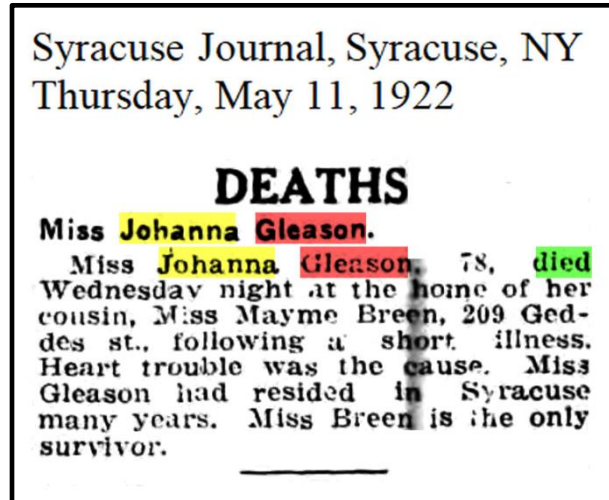

In the 1900 and 1920 census James Breen stated that he came to the US in 1866. As shown above Breen didn't make it into the Syracuse City Directory until 1868. Breen's wife, Johanna

Gleason did not make an appearance in the records until the 1870 census with James and their 2-year old daughter, Mary.

Unraveling of the Gleason - Breen Connection

This obituary for Johanna Gleason was the first indication of a connection between the Gleason and Breen families. At first glance it seemed that Mayme Breen would have to be the daughter of one of Johanna Gleason's aunts or uncles to qualify as her cousin. One possibility would be that Mayme's mother was Johanna Gleason and she was the sister of Michael Gleason (Johanna's long deceased father). Another possibility is that either of Mayme's parents were a sibling of Johanna's mother, Ann (maiden name unknown).



However, there is a problem here because the deceased Johanna and Mayme's father, James, were both 69 in the 1920 census. An aunt or an uncle would be a generation removed from the deceased Johanna. The most likely explanation would be that Mayme Breen was Johanna's niece and her mother was a sister of the deceased Johanna. Ann Gleason only had three children: a son and two daughters. In the 1865 census her daughters were living with her: Mary (21) and Josephine (17). In the 1870 only one daughter was still living at home: Johanna

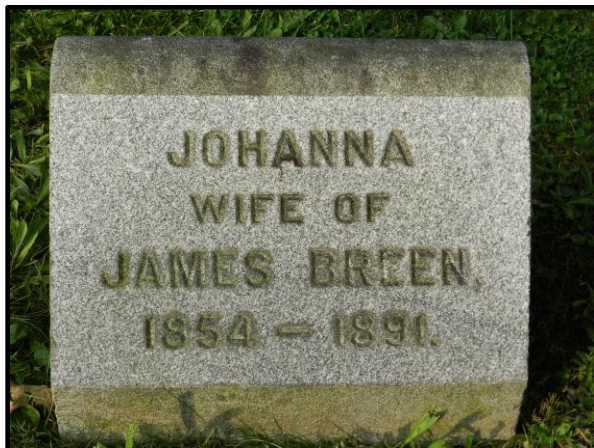
(22). Mary, who would have been 26 in 1870, was gone and Josephine seems to have changed her name to Johanna. This complicates the Breen picture if we assume that the older Gleason sister had married James Breen, since, according to the census records, she was also named Johanna.

SOLUTION: Johanna Breen was a Gleason and was Johanna Gleason's 1st cousin. The daughter, Mayme Breen, was Johanna Gleason's 1st cousin once removed. This means that Johanna Breen was the daughter of one of Michael Gleason's (Johanna's father) brothers. See "The Gleason - Breen Connection" above.

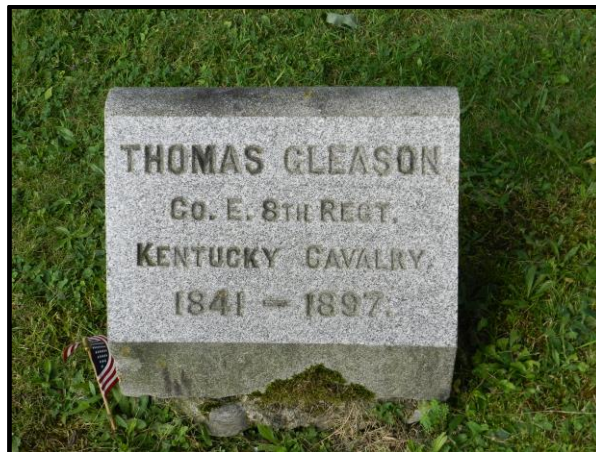

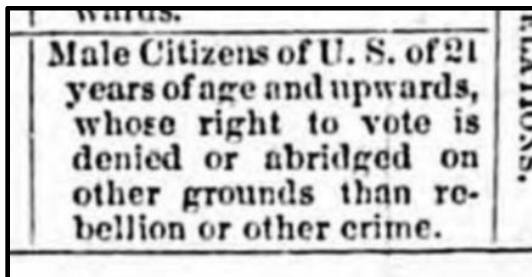

MARY E. BREEN WILL DISPOSES OF \$16,000

The will of Mary E. Breen, filed for probate today, disposes of an estate valued at \$16,000. It was filed by John R. Walsh, executor, and gives a house at 209 North Geddes street to Nellie M. Furlong. It was to go to Nellie Furlong in the event of the death of Johanna Gleason, which occurred.

Another house at 207 North Geddes Street is willed to Elizabeth Furlong on condition that \$100 be paid for maintenance of a lot in St. Agnes Cemetery.

The obituary for John Furlong matches up with the Furlong information from the city directories. The 1924 and 1925 directories showed that Elizabeth Furlong was living with Mary E.

Breen at the Breen residence at 209 North Geddes Street. This was a key piece of information in understanding the Breen - Furlong connection. This possible connection came to light when it was discovered that Elizabeth and John's daughter, Anna, was buried in the Gleason-Breen plot in St. Agnes Cemetery. Then the common Geddes Street address was found. It is suspected that Elizabeth was a Breen and this assumption is further reinforced in the disposition of Mary E. Breen's Will. The property originally belonged to Mary's father, James Breen (d. 1920), and he left it to her. Mary's would have left the property to her cousin, Johanna Gleason, but Johanna died in 1922. After Johanna, Nellie Furlong was next in line and the article above documents the property going to Nellie after Mary died in 1925. Nellie's mother Elizabeth Furlong got the property next door. Nellie died in 1926 and Elizabeth might have inherited the 207 North Geddes property. Finally Elizabeth wound up at Loretto Rest and died in 1929.

The above information shows that there was a Thomas Gleeson in Co. E, 1st Batn, 8th Regiment of the Kentucky Cavalry during the Civil War. Since this same unit information was found on Thomas Gleason's gravestone in St Agnes Cemetery this is probably the same person. However, it still is not known why Thomas was in Kentucky while his family was supposedly living in Syracuse, NY. [Note: the Gleason family was not found in the 1855 and 1860 census for Syracuse. Their first census appearance, including Thomas, was the 1865 Syracuse census.]

This old human interest story from 1856 might tell the story of the Ann Gleason described in this paper. There is no definitive evidence to prove this assumption but a careful examination of the records that do exist about this Gleason family shows that it also can’t be disproved.

The Gleasons came to the US in 1852 but don’t appear in the Syracuse census, or any other census, until 1865. The Ann Gleason in this paper had three children, a son and two younger daughters. Her son, Thomas, had been in the Kentucky Cavalry during the Civil War.

Since most individuals joined a regiment that was forming near their city of residence this would imply Thomas was living in the Russellville area of Kentucky prior to the war. This would leave his mother back in Syracuse with just two children. Another characteristic of this family is that Ann’s husband, Michael, has never been found directly in the any record — he only appears in the records of his wife Ann, as a “widow of Michael,” or as “wife of Michael.”

The Ann Gleason in the newspaper article had a missing husband who was only referenced as “Mr. Gleason,” and for a while Ann believed he was deceased. According to the article, Mr. Gleason succumbed to gold fever and headed to California, leaving his family back in Syracuse. In the article, Ann Gleason was described as having two children. It is tempting to identify the Ann Gleason in the article with the Ann Gleason (widow of Michael) in this paper.

In the newspaper article Mr. Gleason was still alive in 1856 but no mention was made about whether he ever returned to his family in Syracuse. There is also enough vagueness in the article to cause one to wonder if any of it was true — or was it just intended as an entertaining story.

Categories: **Birth** years have been determined from the census ages. In some cases the ages have been used to graphically determine an estimate birth year. **To US** years have been extracted from the 1900 census. A question mark “?” appearing in this category only means that the individual didn’t appear in the 1900 census, not that their immigration year is unknown. In the case of families, if the younger children report the immigration year it can be assumed that the parents were with them during the voyage. In the **Married** category “NA” means that the individual never married. Sometime the year of marriage can be inferred from census information. The **Death** years came from obituaries, city directories or from gravestone inscriptions. The **Obit** category indicated whether an obituary had been found for the individual. The **Burial** category indicated where the individual was buried.

The **BOLDED** items, especially the obituaries, are still being sought for the valuable information that they might contain — such as previously unknown relatives. However, it can't be certain that they even exist.

Notes:

(1) - Michael's existence was determined by Syracuse Directory listings of Ann (widow of Michael) and her gravestone inscription, "wife of Michael." It is unknown if Michael ever set foot in the US.

(2) - Johanna is believed to be a Gleason because of her burial at St. Agnes in the Gleason-Breen plot. Also, in Johanna Gleason's 1922 obit, the deceased Johanna Breen's daughter, Mayme, was described as Gleason's cousin (1st cousin once removed).

(3) - St. Agnes Cemetery is in Syracuse, NY. St Joseph's Cemetery is in Auburn, Cayuga Co., NY.

(4) - It is suspected that Anna Marie Furlong's mother was a Breen. In 1924 and 1925 Elizabeth Furlong, Anna Marie's mother was living with Mary E. Breen in the Breen residence at 209 North Geddes Street.

After 1880, Daniel was living apart from his wife and son, Edward.

The table above combines the ages found in the census records over the years for a given family. This methodology serves several purposes; first and foremost it allows a means of estimating a person's actual birth year. The ages found in the census are inaccurate and sometimes notoriously so. **The technique for obtaining these estimates is explained in the appendix of this paper.**

The census age table also keeps track of the family members and provides a name and age pattern that help ensure that the correct family's census records are being used.

The yellow highlighting on Daniel Gleason's ages from the 1892 - 1910 census records were used to resolve the problem of two Daniel Gleasons found in the records. After 1880 Daniel was no longer living with his wife and children but no obituary could be found. Then, a Daniel Gleason was found in the 1910 census and this eventually turned out to solve the identity problem. But during the process of resolving this identity problem all the records related to this 2nd Daniel were highlighted in yellow. The records of the original Daniel, the one found with his family, were highlighted in green. This same highlighting scheme was also used with the city directory information for this family and is found later in this section. In the end, the green and yellow highlighting never overlapped, which meant that both Daniels never appeared in the same records at the same time — they were one and the same person.

Note: Philip and Bridget's daughter Elizabeth was born in Onondaga County in 1849 and James was born in Onondaga County in 1850. Therefore it would be expected that the family could be found in the 1850 census for someplace in Onondaga County.

No appropriate Kennedy death information was found with the following search string on the Fulton History Newspaper Archive (fultonhistory.com)

("Syracuse NY") AND ((Kennedy) w/35 (died OR dead OR funeral OR Surviving OR survivor OR burial OR buried OR cemetery OR expires OR Death)) AND (filename contains(1850~~1860))

There were several "Aid To Ireland" meetings held in 1848. In the third meeting Philip Kennedy was present and he donated \$0.88 (most people gave \$1.00). These lists of persons donating at each of the meetings were published in the Daily Star, Syracuse, NY, Saturday, August 19, 1848. This is evidence that Philip Kennedy was living in Syracuse and probably should have shown up in the 1850 census for Syracuse but neither he or his wife Bridget were found in that census.

The Second Daniel Gleason?

When looking for a person in the census records, it is easier to positively identify an individual that is residing with persons to who they are related, rather than an individual living by themselves or with a group of strangers. The 1910 census below brought to light another Daniel Gleason. It was necessary to track this Daniel back in time to determine if he was the same Daniel Gleason who "disappeared" after the 1880 census. The presence of a sister-in-law and an uncle living with the Patrick Dowling family in 1910 provided the essential information needed to subsequently make this identification of a unique Daniel Gleason.

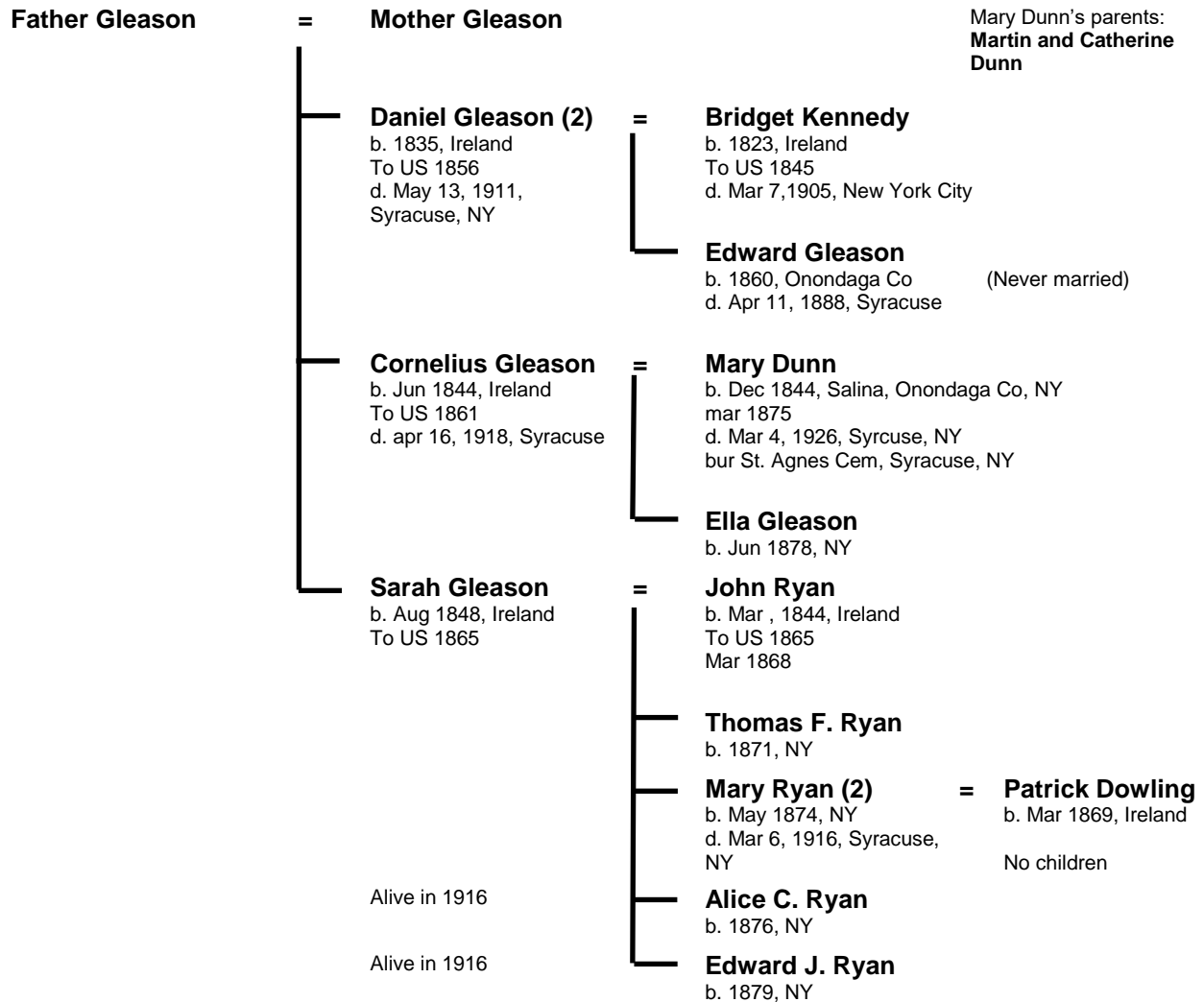

These obituaries provide a valuable link back into the Dunn family, but that line of research won't be pursued at this time. The main line of research for this paper is Gleason families. The Ryan family above was only followed until the connection with Daniel Gleason could be determined. During that process Sarah Gleason Ryan's connection to Cornelius Gleason was also discovered. In the next section a search of the Irish church records will be made to see if these newly found Irish siblings can be established in their homeland.

No Roscrea marriage record was found for John and Mary. No baptism record for Cornelius was found in Roscrea after a manual, page by page, search of Roscrea Microfilm 02480/01. This Daniel and Sarah cannot be positively identified as being the same Daniel and Sarah Gleason found in the Syracuse census records. Daniel's age is right on but Sarah is off by eight years and Cornelius was not found at all. Even if the bad hand writing found in the Irish parish registers could somehow be rationalized to make "Horry" turn into "Conny", which is a nickname for Cornelius the age difference would still be 17 years. Below was the only Cornelius Gleeson who could be found that was close to Roscrea, but the mother's last name is not Brennon/Breman.

Summary - The failure to find the Irish baptism records for Daniel, Cornelius and Sarah Gleason is a mystery. They were ideal candidates for a successful search since all of them had been born after the commencement of almost all the parish records. With three siblings the key measure of success would be to find three baptism records with identical parental names. Even if the birth years were slightly off and the parishes were different (the parents moved a lot) it would be highly likely that the correct Daniel, Cornelius and Sarah had been found. However, that didn't happen in this case.

FOUND DEAD IN BED

Daniel Gleason Had Been Ill for Some Time.

Convulsions, the result of Bright's disease, caused the sudden death of Daniel Gleason, 76 years old, at an early hour this morning. He was found dead in his bed shortly after 8 o'clock by Mrs. Frederick Secor of No. 417 Wilkinson street, with whom he made his home.

Mr. Gleason had been ailing for nearly a year and was under the care of Dr. Frederick W. Smith. Recently, however, he had seemed much improved and last night when he retired about 9 o'clock he spoke of feeling unusually well.

This morning when he failed to appear for breakfast Mrs. Secor went to his room to call him and, receiving no response to her repeated calls, went into the room and found him dead. Dr. Smith was summoned and said that Mr. Gleason had been dead a number of hours. Coroner George R. Kinne investigated the case and decided that Mr. Gleason's death had been the result of natural causes.

Mr. Gleason was a widower and his only surviving near relative is a brother, Cornelius Gleason of No. 708 Turtle street. The funeral arrangements have not been made.

In 1900, Matthias, William, and Dennis were at three separate locations. Matthias was in Geddes, while William and Dennis were in Lafayette. Their ages from those census records are shaded in yellow in the 1900 column. All of the yellow census ages correspond to locations other than with their mother, Alice. Four of Alice and Dennis' children appear to have "left home" at very young ages. These are indicated by the pink and blue shaded cells and bold numbers in the census year where they first failed to appear. The ages displayed are the ages expected at the time of the missed census, based on their ages in the last census.

With the exception of Katie, who would have been 16 if she had appeared in the 1880 census, the other three "left home" at around 12 or 13 years of age. There is no hard proof of what actually happened to Mary, but it is likely that Mary died young, while Alice, Katie and Eddie went off on her own and were found in subsequent census records. Their leaving home was probably due to the death of their father, Dennis, in 1876.

By this process of elimination, Alice or Katie could have been the daughter that Alice Gleason was residing with, in Syracuse, at the time of her death in 1915. Alice Gleason, the

mother, was not found living alone in the census records after 1892. Since mothers usually go to live with one of their daughters so the search for her became a search for her daughters Alice and Katie. Neither of the daughters was found under the name Gleason so they might have married to unknown husbands making it nearly impossible to find them in the census. Since Alice occurs less frequently, a search was made in the 1892 census for a married woman named Alice, born in Ireland in about 1863. Four such individuals were found (Moran, Hanley, Hoebrandt, and McCabe) and none had a mother-in-law named Alice Gleason living with the family. The 1910 census was searched for these same families and only the Patrick McCabe was found. Although Patrick's marital status was listed as "M1," (married once) and not widowed even though his wife Alice was not found with the family.

Alice Kennedy Gleason, wife of Dennis Gleason was not found in the directories searched above. The Alice M. Gleason listed above was the daughter of Michael Gleason of Apple Street (see his story in the Appendix). Matthias Gleason above is the son of Dennis and Alice Gleason.

Usually a parent’s obituary is a good place to discover the married names of their daughters — but not with Alice. Which one of her daughters could it be who was mentioned in Alice’s obit? The Catherine Gleason obit shown below seemed to offer an opportunity to answer this question.

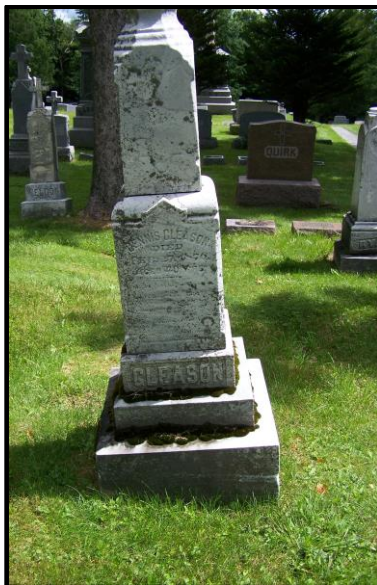

Summary: Despite all the confusion with the house numbers, the Catherine in the obituary is not the daughter of Dennis and Alice Gleason because they never had a daughter named Johanna. With the exception of Alice, their oldest child, all the other children were born in Pompey, NY

It was possible to find her marriage record and some baptism records of her children in the Irish records. These Gleasons are not related to the Moyaliff Gleasons.

Summary

The Mary Gleason of St. Mary's Cemetery remains a mystery. If she was the same person found in the Irish records above then it might be expected to find her with some family members prior to her death. She wasn't found in the Syracuse census records. The only record that fit her was the 1862 directory entry for Mary Gleason whose husband William was already deceased. However he wasn't found on the same cemetery list where Mary's name showed up. Perhaps Mary Gleason's husband's died in Ireland and she came to Syracuse by herself and appeared in the 1862 directory and then died 2 years later.

Census Records - Older Patrick

Based on the analysis of the information contained in the census records below, the following arrival story of Bridget Gleason can be told. In 1849 Bridget Ryan, with or without her husband, arrived in the US with three small children. There was Thomas Ryan, age 4, Margaret Ryan, age 3, and Catherine Ryan, age 1. These individuals should have shown up in the 1850 census but so far no evidence of any of them has been found. The fate of Bridget's husband, FNU Ryan is uncertain. He might have died in Ireland, which was the impetus for Bridget and her small family leaving Ireland. Or, he might have traveled to the US with the family and then died shortly after arriving.

Summary: This should have been an easy search with a high probability of success. However, it didn’t turn out that way. Three baptism records were found, each with the same parents: Patrick Ryan and Mary Ryan. However, each of the individual baptism records is off by 5 years and the birth order is incorrect, with the oldest (Thomas) and youngest (Catherine) switching places.



This map shows the relative locations of the Roman Catholic (RC) parishes of Cullen & Latten and Knockavilla.

This search was conducted before it was realized that Bridget Ryan’s maiden name was Connor, or some variation of that name, or Colly, which was probably an error in the St. James record keeping. Repeating the search with these names gave even worse results.

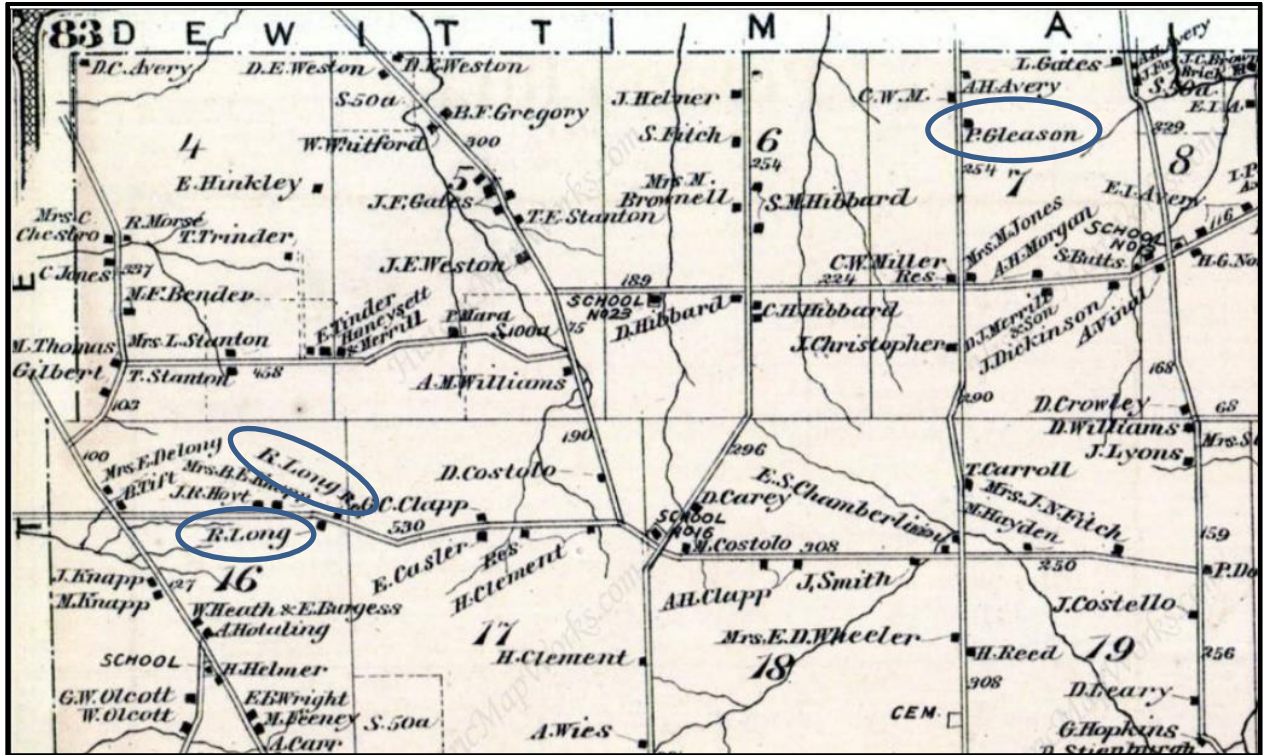

This map shows the northwestern corner of the town of Pompey in 1874. In the upper right hand corner there is a blue oval containing the name P. Gleason. This is the older Patrick Gleason described in this section who was married to Bridget Connor Ryan. The younger Patrick Gleason, who arrived in Pompey later and was married to Bridget Lahert resided on what is known today as Frank Long Road. On the map above this road is straddled by two blue ovals containing the name R. Long. This is Richard Long who married Margaret McGrath. One of Richard's descendants had the road named after him and the family still owns property on that road and the old house is still standing. In 1910 Patrick Gleason's neighbor was Frank Long.

ANOTHER TYPHOID VICTIM

JOHN BITTNER, A JAIL PRISONER, DIES AT THE PENITENTIARY.

Was Ailing When He Was Taken There October 31st to Await Trial on an Indictment—Stricken With the Typhoid Epidemic, He Expired Suddenly Last Night.

John Bittner, 29 years old and under indictment for second offense petit larceny, died of typhoid at 9 o'clock last night at the penitentiary. This is the second fatal case in the epidemic there.

Bittner lived in North State street this city, before his arrest. Penitentiary officers believe he had consumption when he was admitted to jail.

He was first sent to the penitentiary August 1st, but was brought back to the city October 29th, and was indicted by the Grand jury in session at that time. He was taken back to the penitentiary on October 31st to await trial. He was then feeling ill, and was removed to the hospital on November 2d.

Doctor Wheeler of Pompey was at the hospital all yesterday and the patients there seemed to be getting along all right when he left at 6 P. M. But at 9 o'clock Bittner died suddenly.

Bittner was arrested on July 1st for stealing \$5, and the charge was made petit larceny, second offense, as he had been arrested in 1898 for stealing.

Thomas Dunn of Rome was the first prisoner to die in the penitentiary during this epidemic. He expired last Thursday. He was serving four months for vagrancy.

The first case of typhoid fever developed October 24th, and there are now ten remaining cases in the penitentiary hospital.

Victim in the Village.

Michael McDonald, a resident of Jamesville, died Wednesday of typhoid. There are several other cases in that vicinity, including that of Supervisor W. C. Newell of Lafayette.

The penitentiary authorities say that every precaution is being taken to prevent a further spread of the disease, and the patients are being given the best of care. All water used is now boiled and filtered.

The patients seem to be doing well and Bittner's death is largely attributed to his poor physical condition before he was stricken with typhoid.

Michael McDonald was the husband of Margaret Ryan (daughter of Bridget Connor Ryan).

The Lahert Connections

The Lahert of Connection

The name Lahert first came to my attention in 2007 when I was taking pictures of gravestones in the Immaculate Conception Cemetery in Pompey, NY. There was a stone for Patrick Gleason and Bridget Lahert. I took the picture because of the name Gleason and never gave the name Lahert a second thought — until now. While writing this paper two more Laherts were discovered in an obscure paper from 1871 containing the names of the parishioners of the Immaculate Conception Church, which also included the maiden names of their wives. All three Lahert individuals were female and the maiden names are normally difficult to determine. A long search of the census records showed that these families were long-time residents of the towns of Pompey and Lafayette.

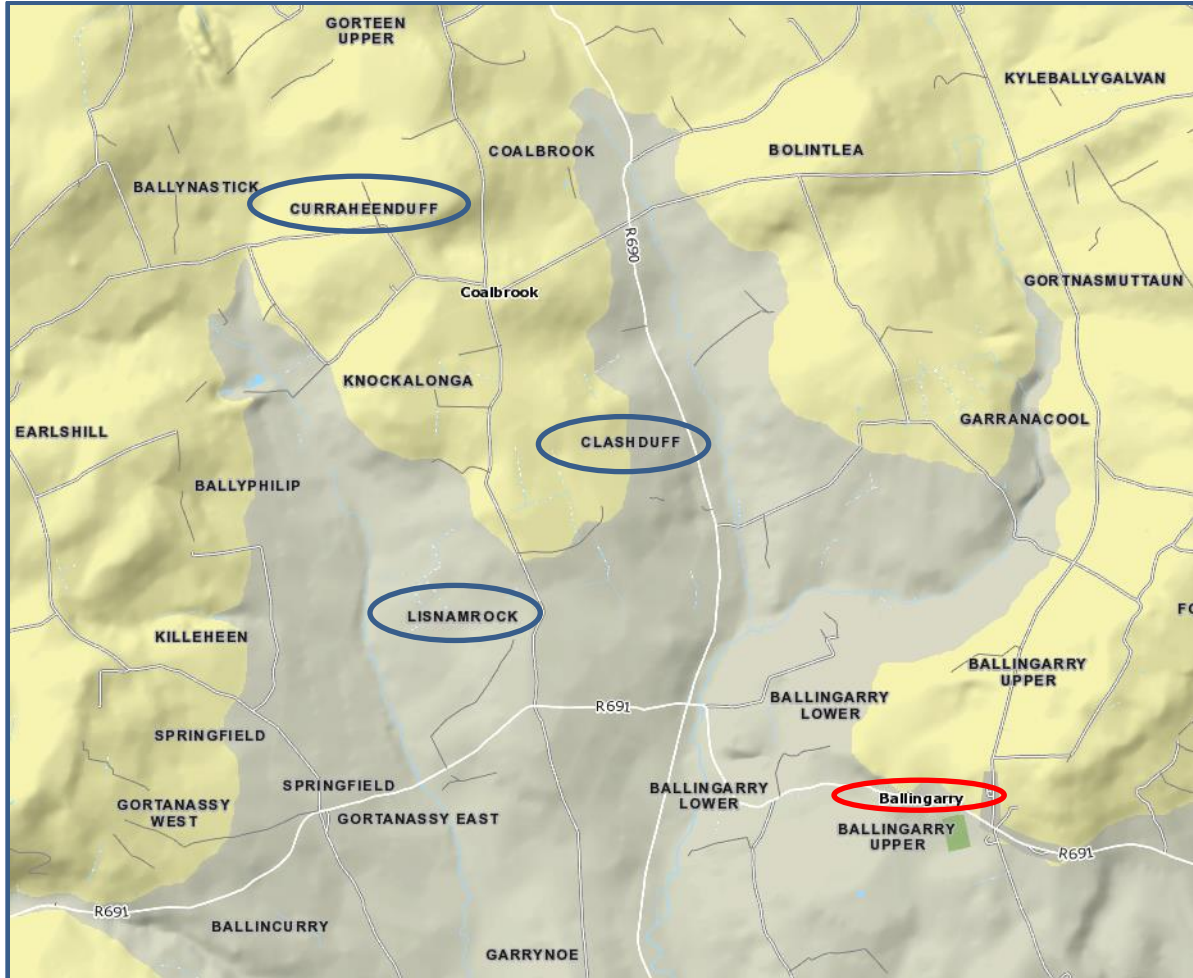

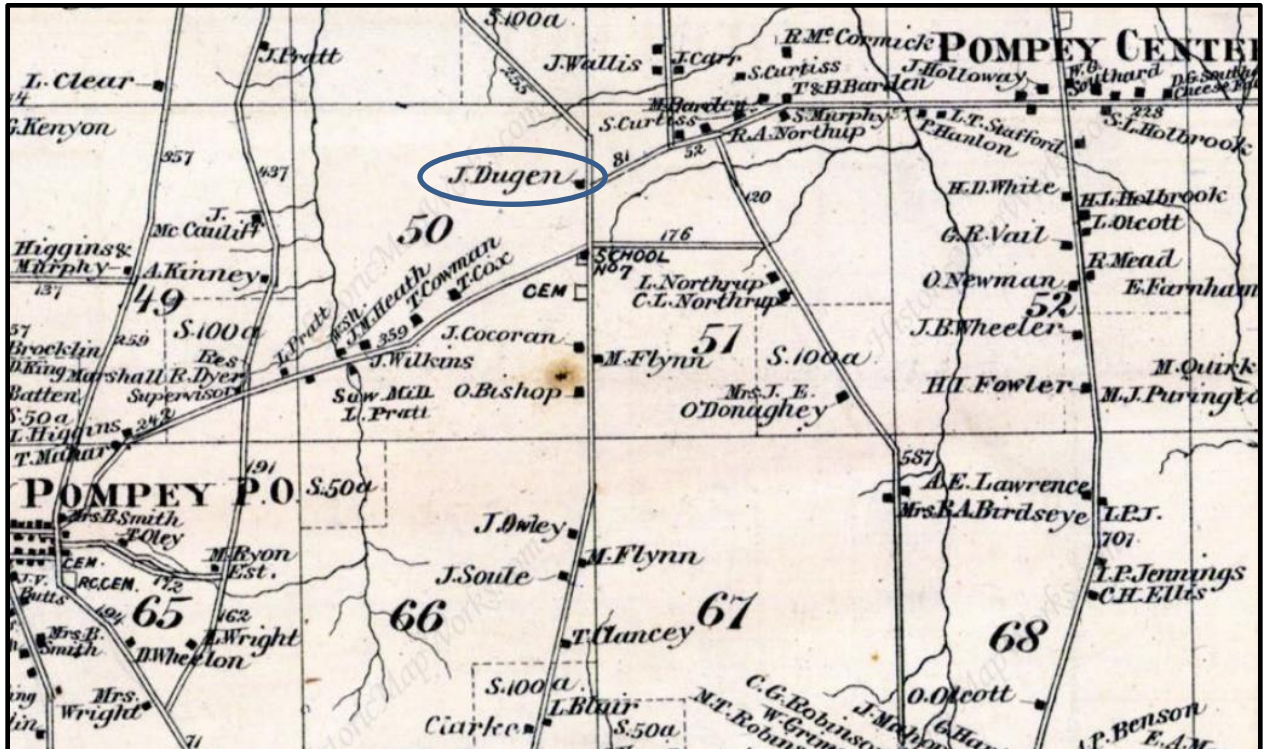

This family was found living in Syracuse in the 1855 census and then seemed to disappear from the census record. The family was finally found in the 1870 and 1880 census living in Dayton, Ohio. From an examination of the children's birth dates it was determined that their daughter Winifred had died. In 1859 the family was in Ohio and Winifred gave birth to a daughter who they named Winifred.

It was possible to trace them back to the northern part of Co. Tipperary, Ireland. There is no obvious connection of this family to the Moyaliff Gleasons.

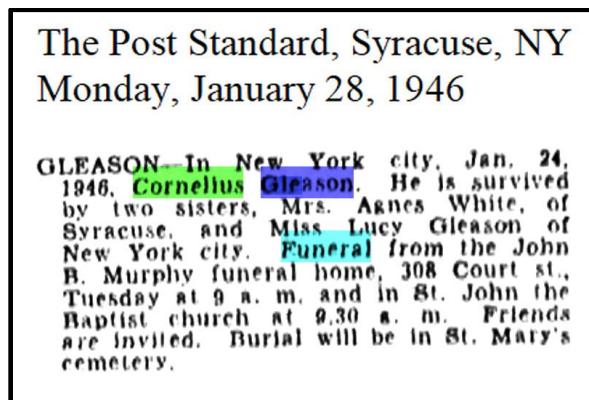

Mrs. Burns' Gifts To Nieces Upheld

Gifts amounting to \$2,257, which Mrs. Margaret Burns gave to her three nieces, Miss Alice Gleason and Miss Bessie Gleason, 1617 W. Colvin st., and Mrs. Helen A. Fayle, 827 Lancaster av., before her death last September, were upheld by a surrogate's court jury returning a verdict to Judge John W. Sadler late Wednesday.

Mrs. Burns died without leaving a will. The gifts to the nieces, representing money on deposit to the credit of Mrs. Burns in a Syracuse bank, was attacked by James P. Burns, husband, who claimed his wife was not of sound mind and that she was subjected to undue influence when she signed a blank check and gave it to Miss Alice Gleason, who retained \$900, dividing the balance between the other two nieces.

This article started the search for Alice and Bessie Gleason to identify their family. Alice and Bessie Gleason were determined to be the daughters of Michael and Mary Gleason of 324 Apple Street. The Alice Gleason found in the 1932 Syracuse City Directories is the Alice who is the daughter of Michael Gleason of Apple Street.
