Introduction

Growing up in Mattydale, my family went to school, both elementary and high school, with another McGraw family that lived in North Syracuse. At the time we both wondered if our two families were related but no one ever bothered to check it out, past just asking our parents. My father was Francis M. McGraw and in North Syracuse was Francis L. McGraw and the common given name hinted at a possible connection somewhere back in time. Francis L. was known as "Muggsy," and had something to do with the city jail. Since the names were next to each other in the phone book we would gets phone calls from drunks, they were always drunk, looking for "Muggsy." Over the years we learned that it was impossible to convince a drunk that he had the wrong number. It was a blessing that those gentlemen were only allowed one call each from the drunk tank. After high school graduation our paths never crossed again.

In the fall of 2010 the question occurred to me once again and I decided to search for a connection between our families. It turned out that we weren't related but I was able to trace the North Syracuse McGraws back to Patrick and Bridget McGrath of the 1st Ward in Syracuse, NY. The family had come to the US in 1866 with seven children. Patrick worked as a laborer in the Salt fields on the north side of the city. My family had come from Upperchurch, Co. Tipperary, Ireland, in 1848 and 1850, and settled in the southern part of Onondaga County in Fabius and later moved to Cortland County in Cuyler and then Truxton.

About this time I was working with the late Richard Long on research to find connections between our respective families. During this research I connected with one of Dick's nephews, Steve Long. More than once, Steve had asked me if I was related to a McGraw family that had gone to St. Anthony's High School with him. I was a curious since my father's family had lived at 512 Garfield Ave., just off E. Colvin, and they had all attended St. Anthony's. Rosemary, the youngest, had graduated in about 1958. However, we weren't missing anyone from the family tree, and so, without doing any actual research, I knew we weren't related to this McGraw family from the south side.

Over the years Steve Long would ask me about this family and finally I decided to do a little digging to find the actual connections of this McGraw family. It developed that they were connected to the same Patrick and Bridget McGrath family as the North Syracuse McGraws. And with that I filed the result away and moved on.

During September 2014 the mother board in my computer decided to die. For two weeks I was without a computer and so I decided to reorganize my genealogy papers. During the process I found a 2007 e-mail from an Ed McGraw asking about a William McGraw from Syracuse. Back then my response to him had been negative. In the e-mail he had mentioned his mother's maiden name, Mullen. That name rang a bell and after

checking I found that Ed was the youngest member of the McGraw family of McLennan Ave.

The latest update (10-11-19) was initiated by an email from Maureen Leary Mamula. She is descended from the John and Bridget Meally McGrath family who was also living in the three hundred block of 1st North Street in the 1st Ward of Syracuse in the 1880 census. They were probably also neighbors in 1875 but that census didn't record addresses. The birth of two of their children in Onondaga County implies that they settled in the county in 1852-4. The family could not be found in the 1855 and 1860 census records so their exact location at those times is unknown.

Both families had their roots in the townland of Loughourna, Knigh parish, Co. Tipperary. However no specific connection between the families has been documented.





This portion of the Griffith's Valuation was published in the mid-1850s.



This is a circa 1840 Ordnance Survey map of the townland Loughourna, Knigh parish. This marked up map represents the land holding about 15 years after the Griffith's Valuation was published probably after Patrick and Bridget had left Ireland in 1866. The most prominent observation of these maps in comparison with the published GV is the large reduction in the number of small land holders.



A quick assessment of the reduction in the number of parcels in Loughourna can be made by observing the portion of the body of water in the upper right hand corner of the map above that is in the townland of Loughourna. In the published version of the GV this was the last parcel listed, where it was No. 29 and was described as "Lake." In the map above that same parcel is now numbered No. 24 indicating that five of the lower numbered parcels from the published list had been consolidated.


The total number of acres in the townland of Loughourna was listed as 1062 acres. The largest parcel was held by John Keirnan, being lot 2a, that was a little over 374 acres. This represented a bit over 35% of the townland. In the map above the largest parcel is labeled No. 1. This would imply that Patrick Magrath and Thomas Magrath who had jointly occupied parcels 1a and 1b, which had totaled 16 acres have left. Parcel No. 1 was absorbed into the former No. 2 parcel which then became the new No. 1. This can be seen in the map above where parcel No. 1 is obviously the largest parcel in the townland. This probably caused all the small holding in the parcel (those labeled with lower case letters) to be relabeled. This would mean that 1a and 1b in the above map would be the former holding of Patrick and Thomas Magrath.






