

Thomas McGrath of Moyaliff

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In the 1855 NYS census Thomas McGrath was living in the town of Pompey, Onondaga Co., NY. Living at the same residence was Thomas' father Michael and his wife Catherine, formerly Gleeson, and James McGrath. The nature of the connection of James to Thomas McGrath has been the subject of a over a decade of research. On the next farm, back in 1855, was Bridget Ryan, she was the niece of Catherine Gleeson McGrath and later that year she became the bride of James McGrath. In the latter part of 1858 all of these persons participated in the Maple Ridge Migration. They were part of a group of more than a dozen individuals who relocated from the Pompey area to Maple Ridge in Lewis County. Michael didn't participate in the migration and it is thought that he had died sometime prior to 1860 and was probably buried in Old St. Mary's Cemetery on Renwick Ave, in Syracuse.

Thomas McGrath was a "native of Mealiff [Moyaliff] near Holy Cross, Co. Tipperary." This was engraved on his gravestone at St. Patrick's Cemetery, Maple Ridge, town of Martinsburg, Lewis County, NY. Based on the census information and the 1875 maps by D. G. Beers this Thomas McGrath was living in the southwest corner of Maple Ridge. At that time he was living at a crossroads that today is known as McGraw Corners. His second wife, Mary Kennedy McGrath and her son James are also found in the Maple Ridge Cemetery. The rest of their children are buried elsewhere.

Thomas died on Mar. 4, 1883 at age 67. Catherine Gleason McGrath died on April 18, 1859 at age 36. Catherine McGrath was gone from home by 1880, while younger sister Ellen, at age 14, was still at home.

Katy (Catherine) had a residence time of 9 years where as her husband Thomas McGrath had a residence time of 3 years. The 9 years is believed to be a mistake.

Farmer, Value of Real Estate \$100. Thomas was married within the last year.

Thomas was listed as a farmer. Thomas has "aged" 19 years between 1870 and 1880.

Lewis County Directory 1895-96 entry for Mary (Kennedy) McGrath

"McGrath, Mary (Kennedy), widow of Thomas, Martinsburg, r. 93 cor 94 farmer 49, 5 cows, 1 horse, 1, Walter farmer (son)." p. 384

This is Thomas McGrath's family. The "r 93" is a residence number, basically a street address. The "cor 94" might refer to the corner of the next residence "r 94". In 1875 and 1880 Thomas was located on the southern portion of Lot 107. The "farmer 49" entry might be interpreted to mean the size of land holding. However, a conservative estimate of the size of the farm would be 7 acres.

1892 NY Lewis Co., Martinsburg, Maple Ridge

Mary and her two sons, Michael and Walter were still living on the family farm.

Walter McGrath was found the NYS Death Index — he died on December 29, 1944. His burial place could not be found at the Find A Graves website and no obituary has been found for Walter in any of the newspaper archives. It is thought that Walter might have been buried in the Old Oneida County Home Cemetery, off Floyd Avenue, Rome, NY. However, on one list of interments most of the burials were from 1910 - 1930 with nothing past 1931.



This gravestone was originally misidentified as belonging to a different Thomas and Mary McGrath. The inscriptions on this stone were captured in the Dunten list for St. Patrick's Cemetery, Maple Ridge

This is Thomas McGrath of Moyaliff and his second wife Mary Kennedy McGrath. Although he is listed on the gravestone Thomas is not buried in this plot. There is a transcription error in the Dunten list - Michael's inscription is seen in the picture to be 1816 - 1883. His plot is on the western side of the cemetery in a single plot near the grave of his first wife Catherine Gleeson McGrath. Mary's inscription should be 1831 - 1900. Thomas and Mary's son James is also buried here. His years were given as 1871 - 1894. The birth year for James may also be in error.. In the 1870 census James was listed as a 2-year old giving a birth year of 1868 rather than 1871.

The search for the daughters of Thomas and Mary McGrath [Catherine (b. 1860), Ellen (b. 1866)] have been difficult. A search of the Maple Ridge and Lowville cemeteries didn't turn up any likely candidates. Many searches were made of the census records for females named Catherine or Ellen of the approximate age but no persons of interest were found. After many searches of the newspaper archives Catherine and Ellen were finally found and their stories will be told in the following pages.

Some Mary Kennedy McGrath Confusion

When the following two items were found they were originally believed to be describing the same person. Since Mary Kennedy McGrath had died in 1900 according to her gravestone inscription everything seemed to fit together.

“A **Mary McGrath** showed up next in the 1900 census as a patient in the **St. Lawrence State Hospital**, in the town of **Lisbon**, in St. Lawrence County. She was listed as a 71 year old Ireland born widow who had given birth to four children of whom only two were still alive.”

1899-07-20, Thursday Watertown Daily Times

“**Mrs. Mary McGrath**, of **Maple Ridge**, was taken to the State hospital at Ogdensburg yesterday.”

The following item had been found previously and was initially ignored since the above two items had seemed to have settled the open questions. However, when it was found the Thomas and Mary McGrath’s oldest daughter Catherine had married a man named John Smithling this article took on a new importance and cast doubt on the Mary McGrath in the 1900 census.

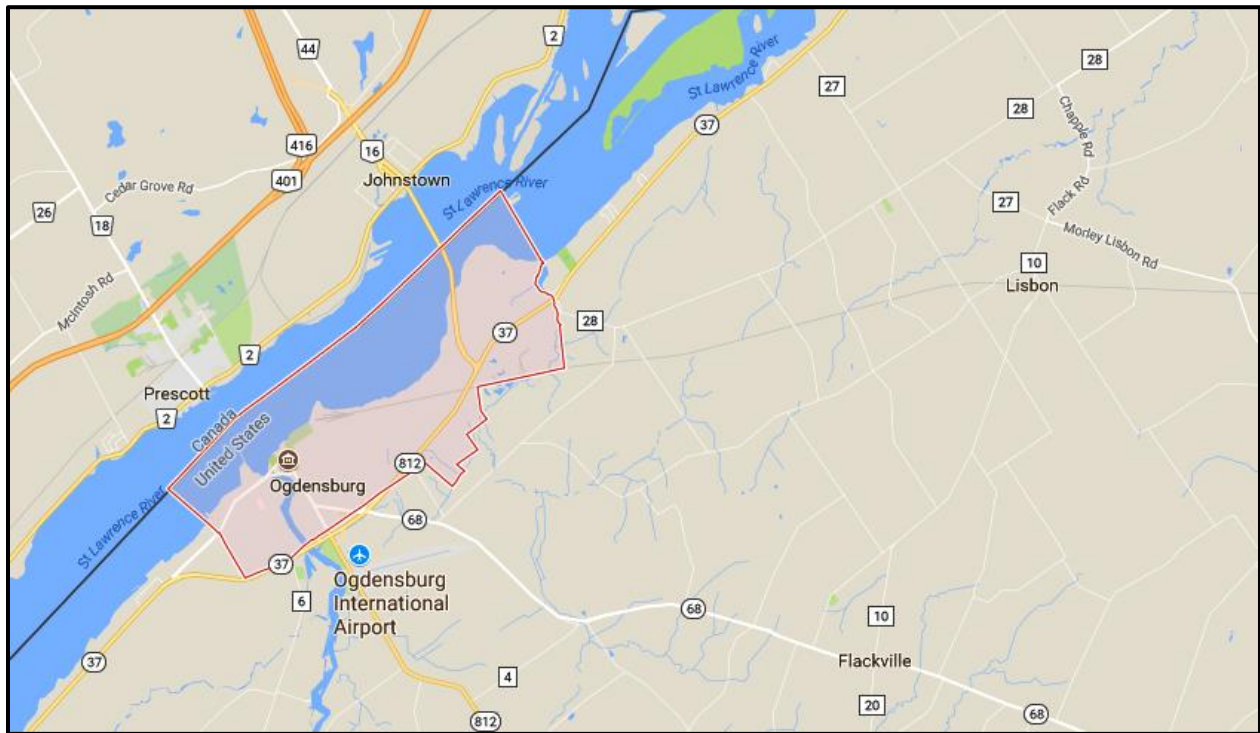
1900-02-27, Tuesday, The Rome Daily Sentinel

“**Mrs. Mary K. McGrath**, 67, died at the home of her daughter, **Mrs. John Smithling**, in Leyden on Saturday. She has been ailing for some time, but the immediate cause of death was congestion of the bowels. The funeral was held at 10:30 today from the Maple Grove Catholic church. Interment was made in the **Leyden cemetery**.”

Analysis

There are subtle differences to be found in these three descriptions and it’s necessary to examine them for consistency and to decide if the differences are significant. A source of continuing confusion has been the gravestone of James McGrath (1871-1894) in St. Patrick’s Cemetery at Maple Ridge. Originally this James was assigned to another Thomas and Mary McGrath family living on Maple Ridge. After this James was assigned to the correct family of Thomas McGrath and Mary Kennedy it was realized that although Thomas McGrath’s name had been engraved on his son James’ gravestone Thomas was not buried there. The grave of Thomas McGrath is over on the western side of St. Patrick’s Cemetery. Then there is the Mary McGrath in the 1900 census. Mary Kennedy McGrath died on Feb. 24, 1900 therefore she could not appear in the 1900 census since the day of the census was June 1, 1900. A closer look at the Mary McGrath in the 1900 census indicates that she was in the hospital in the town of Lisbon and Mary Kennedy McGrath had been taken to the hospital in Ogdensburg in July 1899. The census Mary, although she was an Ireland born widow, she was four years older and only had four children while Mary Kennedy McGrath had given birth to five. Only two of the census Mary’s children were still alive at the time of the census, while four of Mary Kennedy McGrath’s children were still alive.

It now appears that perhaps James' mother, Mary Kennedy McGrath, is also not buried there. According to the 1900-02-27 Rome Daily Sentinel article above Mary Kennedy McGrath was buried in "the Leyden cemetery."

Where Is Mary Kennedy McGrath Buried?

In St. Patrick's Cemetery at Maple Ridge in the town of Martinsburg, Lewis County, NY there is a stone monument inscribed with the names of three individuals. These are Thomas McGrath, Mary McGrath, and James McGrath. Thomas and Mary McGrath are the parents of James who died in 1894. It is fairly certain that James is buried under that monument but it is also certain that his father Thomas is not buried there. Thomas McGrath died in 1883 and was buried separately under a different monument on the west side of this St. Patrick's Cemetery.

After some initial confusion with a different Mary McGrath of similar age and circumstances the correct Mary McGrath was found. It was determined that Mary Kennedy McGrath had died on February 24, 1900 at the home of her oldest daughter, Mrs. Catherine Smithling, in Leyden, NY. In a February 27th article in the Rome Daily Sentinel it was stated: "Interment was made in the Leyden cemetery." The language of this article would seem to leave no doubt that Mary Kennedy had been buried in the Leyden Cemetery on February 27th, the day of her funeral. Normally after a winter funeral in the northern states the coffin is placed in a vault at the cemetery to await burial after Spring brings easier digging conditions.

The same Rome Daily Sentinel February 27th article stated that the funeral was held at “the Maple Grove Catholic church.” No such church has been found but there was a Maple Grove farm and a Maple Grove hotel in that area around the same time. The Maple Ridge Catholic church would have made more sense since that had been Mary’s church for over 40 years. She had been living at the old family farm at Maple Ridge until she went into the hospital at Ogdensburg in the summer of 1899. Surrounding that church was the St. Patrick’s Cemetery where her late husband Thomas and son James were buried along with other members of her family (Kennedy).

In examining the monument described in the first paragraph, the placement of the inscriptions is curious. The normal practice is to place the main inscription on the east side of the monument. However, the inscription for James McGrath (1871-1894) is found on the south facing side of the monument. If the monument had been placed in the cemetery immediately after the death of James there would be no reason for placing his inscription on the south side of the monument rather than the east side. Underneath the inscription of James’ name and birth and death years is the phrase, “THEIR SON.” This phrase would have no meaning if his parent’s names were not also engraved on the same monument as they are in this case and located on the primary side, the east side. If only James had been buried there a more commonly found situation would be to inscribe something similar to “son of Thomas and Mary McGrath” on James’ side of the monument. Taken together all this would seem to imply that the inscriptions were all made at the same time and the 1900 death of Mary Kennedy McGrath might have been the event for purchasing the monument. And this would lead to the belief that Mary Kennedy McGrath is indeed buried in the plot next to her son James and sharing a single monument.

Follow Up On the Children of Thomas McGrath and Mary Kennedy

The family of Thomas McGrath (1816-1883) and Mary Kennedy (1832-1900) of Maple Ridge has been difficult to trace. They had five children: Catherine (1860), Michael (1863), Ellen (1866), James (1868), and Walter (1871). By 1895 only Mary and her son Walter were still living on the family farm on Maple Ridge at a location that is still referred to as McGraw Corners. After that they seemed to disappear from the records and newspapers of that time – their trail had just gone cold.

That was the situation back in 2008, when I had last researched that section of the family. On October 12, 2015 I had the opportunity to move back into the Maple Ridge material again. Since 2008 the Federal and New York State census records had been put on line and the Fulton Postcard History web site had grown to over 33 million pages of old newspapers from all over New York State. It was a good time to try another search for Thomas and Mary McGrath's children.

Catherine and Ellen had probably married and with the change in their last names they were practically impossible to find without still more information. Walter was the first one to show up in the 1920 census. He was working at the Rome State School. He also showed up in the 1930 and 1940 census records. In the latter he was an “inmate” at the Oneida County Home (“Home for the Needy”) in Rome, NY. He was single and probably had never married. Walter probably died prior to 1950 since he wasn't mentioned in his brother Michael's obituary in 1950.

There were five McGrath families living on Maple Ridge during the 1860-1880 time period, and one of those was another Thomas and Mary McGrath family. This Thomas was a brother of two of the other McGrath families (Michael and John) all of whom were from the area of Golden in Co. Tipperary, Ireland. The Thomas McGrath of interest here was from Moyaliff, Co. Tipperary. A monument for a James McGrath (1872-1894) [census records indicate a birth year of 1868] was mistakenly assigned to the Thomas McGrath family from Golden. This time around it was discovered that this James belonged to the Thomas McGrath of Moyaliff family.

The next person to be found was Michael J. McGrath who had been in the cheese business in 1900. Since Walter had been found in the Utica area it was decided to look for his brother Michael in the same area. A Michael McGrath showed up in the 1920 census for Utica. He was employed as a fireman at a knitting mill. His age of 53, according to the 1920 census, yielded a birth year of 1867, which was four years later than that indicated in the earlier census records. Additionally Michael had also told the census enumerator that his parents had been born in New York when they had both been born in Ireland. Initially, this Michael McGrath seemed to be a poor candidate for the son of Thomas and Mary Kennedy, however, when his obituary was found later the name his wife, Emma, and children, Esther and Durant, proved the connection.

Following the trail of Durant McGrath led to his daughter Gloria Elizabeth McGrath who married Harold Schreck in 1948. They had a daughter also named Gloria (or so it seemed for a while). When Michael McGrath died in 1950 he was living at 274 Main St. in Whitesboro, NY, just northwest of Utica. When Michael's wife Emma passed away she was living at the same address. Over the years several other relatives also passed away while living at that same address. In 2015 a Gloria Schreck was living at that same address and she was thought to be the

daughter of Gloria McGrath and Harold Schreck. However this turned out to be Gloria Elizabeth McGrath herself. Gloria and Harold never had any children and the marriage appears to have ended in divorce.

The Obituary That Ended the Search for Catherine and Ellen McGrath

The following 1905 obituary for Helen “Nellie” McGrath Shannon pulled everything together. It connected Nellie to her brothers Michael and Walter, gave the name of her surviving husband and daughter, and connected with her sister Catherine and gave the name of Catherine’s husband, John Smithling. For a short obituary it sure contained a huge amount of valuable information.

OBITUARY, Mrs. Frank M. Shannon

May 29, 1905, Amsterdam Evening Recorder, Amsterdam, NY

“**Nellie F. McGrath**, wife of **Frank M. Shannon**, died suddenly this afternoon at 2:20 o’clock, at her home, No. 14 Bridge street, of heart trouble, aged 38 years. Mrs. Shannon has not enjoyed the best of health for a year past, but nevertheless was able to be about. Sunday she enjoyed a drive with her husband and felt unusually well. This morning she arose and was around the house when she was suddenly stricken. She gradually sank until death came this afternoon. Besides her husband she is survived by one daughter, **Lydia**, one sister, **Mrs. John Smithling** of Talcottville, Lewis county, and two brothers, **Michael McGrath** of Utica and **Walter McGrath** of Leyden, NY. No arrangements have as yet been made for the funeral.”

Catherine B. McGrath

By the time of the 1880 census 19 year old Catherine McGrath was no longer living with her parents on the family farm in Maple Ridge, town of Martinsburg, Lewis Co., NY. In 1888 she was living in Amsterdam, NY when she became the second wife of John F. Smithling Talcottville, town of Leyden, Lewis Co. Catherine became the mother of John’s three children two of whom subsequently died prematurely. She went on to have eight more children with John Smithling. In 1909, four years after giving birth to her eighth child, Catherine’s husband John died at their home at Talcottville. At that point these were her children: Lester (19), Mary (18), James (17), Clair (15), Florence (14), Phillip (10), Eleanor (7) and Robert (5). By 1915 Lester was working around northern New York and James had moved to Syracuse while the remaining six children were living at home in Talcottville with their mother. In October, 1916 Lester married Grace A. Jewell in Syracuse, NY and they settled there. The following year Mary married Ronald Burns MacMorland in Constableville, Lewis Co., NY and they resided in New York after the wedding. In 1918 Clair joined the Army and was sent to France. By 1919 both James and Phillip were living and working in Washington DC. Catherine finally left Talcottville around 1919 and by the time of the 1920 census she was living in Syracuse, NY with her son Lester’s young family along with her children James (27), Eleanor (18) and Robert (16).

Florence married Arnold G. Bowie in 1922 and they were living in Albany, NY in 1927. In early December, 1924 Catherine McGrath Smithling passed away at the home of her son Lester at 119 Congress Ave., Syracuse, NY. She was buried in St. Agnes’ Cemetery.

Family trees are constructed on the following pages for both of John M. Smithling’s two marriages. Catherine McGrath was John’s second wife. They were married in 1888 and had eight children.

The Late John Smithling

“John Smithling, who died at his home in Talcottville on the 20th ult., was born in Turin, February 5, 1844, and lived there until the Civil war broke out, when he enlisted in the service of his country, joining company K from that town. After the war he was engaged in farming and the manufacture of cheese in the town of Martinsburg for several years, and later he engaged in the mercantile business in the village of Martinsburg. Mr. Smithling was married twice. In January, 1872, he was united in marriage to Mary A. McHale, of Harrisburg, who died in 1885. Of this union three children were born, only one of whom survives. Mrs. C. L. J. Alger, of Lyonsdale. In 1888 he was married to Katherine McGrath of Amsterdam, who with eight children survive. He also leaves five brothers. Joseph, of Martinsburg; Gilbert, of Lowville; Lewis, of Syracuse; Charles and George, of Santa Cruz, Cal.; also one sister, Mrs. Filona Bibbins, who resided in Santa Cruz, Cal. Mr. Smithling was ever a good friend and neighbor and a kind and indulgent husband and father. He was of a very cheerful disposition and very fond of home and friends. He will be greatly missed in the community, and a large circle of friends extend sincere sympathy to the bereaved family.”

Lester, the first of John and Catherine McGrath Smithling's children, was born in 1890 in Talcottville, Lewis Co., NY. After the death of his father in 1909 Lester left home and worked in several villages in the Lewis Co. area, including Lyon Falls (1911), Illion (1913), and Little Moose (1914). In October 1916 Lester married Grace A. Jewell of Syracuse with a wedding in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Syracuse, NY. Lester was employed as a machinist as they moved around on the south side of Syracuse while their family grew: Robert M. (b. 1918), John F. (b. Feb. 9, 1919) and Phyllis Marie (b. Aug 10, 1922). In the years after 1925 life took a turn for the worse for the Lester Smithling family. The 1930 census found Lester's wife Grace as an inmate of the Willard State Hospital for the Chronic Insane, in Ovid, NY. His sons Robert and John were in the House of Providence (Home for Dependent Catholic Boys) in Syracuse and his daughter Phyllis was living with his sister Mary MacMorland and her husband in Pleasantville, NY. As for Lester himself, he didn't show up in the 1930 census although it is believed that he was still living in Syracuse. Robert Smithling was a lodger with another family in 1940 and was working as a District Manager for the Herald Journal newspaper. John was still living at the House of Providence. Their younger sister Phyllis had returned to Syracuse at some time prior to 1935 and in 1940 was living at St. Vincent's Orphan Asylum as a lodger. She was in 11th grade and was attending the Cathedral High School. As for Dad, old Lester was a no show for the 1940 census despite being mentioned in the announcement of his son Robert's engagement to Marion Martin. At the time of the announcement Lester was living at 133 West Borden Ave, in Syracuse. Grace Smithling, Lester's wife, was not mentioned in the announcement although she was still alive and remained an inmate at the Willard State Hospital. Grace passed away sometime after 1945. Lester died on August 11, 1957 in Syracuse, NY

“Mrs. Josephine Smithling died Saturday morning at her home in this village, after a brief illness. 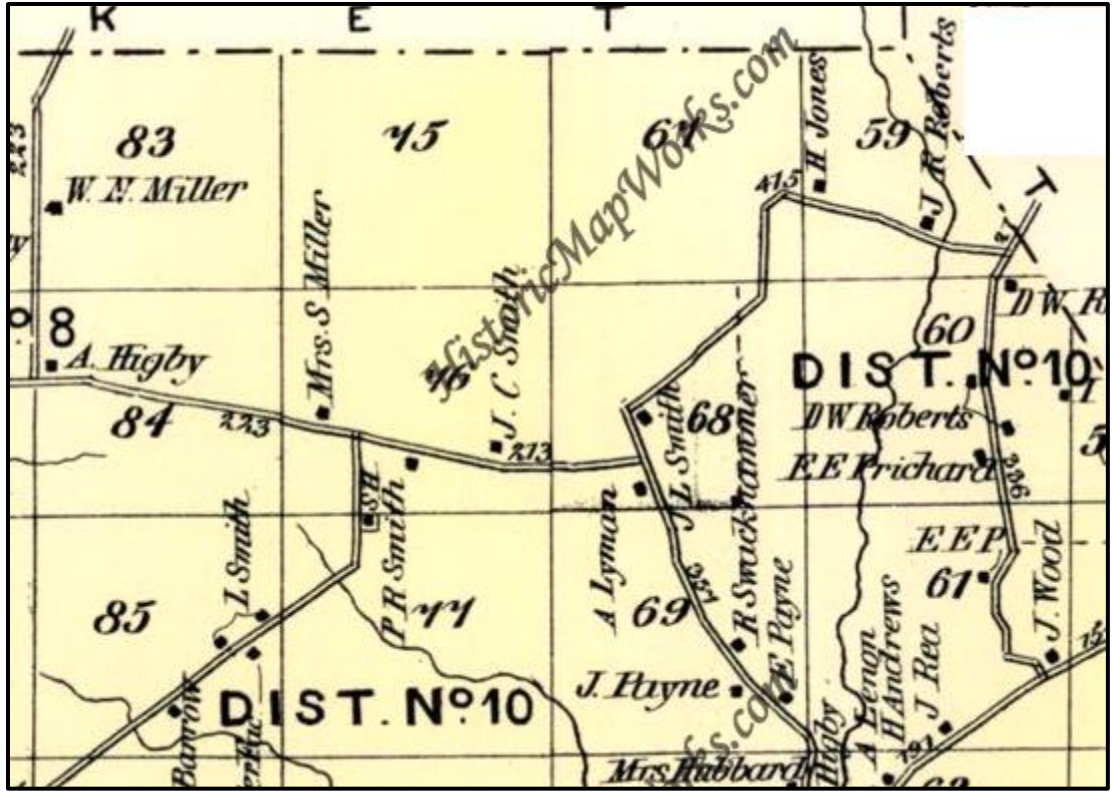
