Reconstructing Families From the Records

Introduction

In this document the available records were used to reconstruct extended McGrath and Long families in the Thurles and Cashel Poor Law Unions. The starting point was the single families which had been already constructed from the Civil Records (1). Therefore this process will miss families which had moved from the Cashel or Thurles Districts or had emigrated from Ireland prior to 1864. The main purpose in the reconstruction of these families is to allow as many connections as possible to be made with other families. The desire is to go beyond just parents and children and push as far back as possible to construct multi-generational families.

The records involved in this reconstruction activity are the parish records from the NLI site, the civil records from the Irish Genealogy site, Griffith's Valuation, and the 1901 and 1911 census records on the Irish National Archives site. The civil marriage records are very useful in this family reconstruction exercise since they contain the fathers' names of the couple being married. This provides a linkage back to the previous generation. In addition there seems to be a strong adherence to the Irish naming tradition during this time period, at least as far as the 1st and 2^{nd} sons and daughters. In most cases this tradition gives the names of the children's paternal and maternal grandparents, if there are enough children. Another necessary element in this reconstruction is geography in the form of the family residences which many times are found in the various records. This piece of information can be challenging, beginning with the sometimes appalling spelling and penmanship found in the hand written records. The IreAtlas Townland Database (2) is very useful in comparing a handwritten townland name with the various townlands in the database. The site allows searching that isn't limited to only an exact match. It allows searches with only a portion of the name located at various positions within the townland name. Once a correct spelling of the residence, usually a townland, has been found then the Townland web site (3) can be used to find a map of the townland location which also shows the townland's boundaries. Gravestone inscriptions and old family genealogies can be very helpful but these are more difficult to obtain and require a good deal of luck.

In preparation for this reconstruction exercise two separate transcription projects were conducted to build up families from the parish registers (baptism records) (4) and separately from the civil birth registration records (1). These family groupings were sometimes complimented with marriage and death records. The results of these transcription projects furnished individual family trees which were the raw material that fed this larger family reconstruction process.

The assembly of families from the baptism and birth records is governed primarily by the names of the parents but it is also guided by the family residence and gaps between the children's birth dates. The automatic construction of family trees and tables from the parish baptism records is a strictly parish by parish process. A certain amount of ambiguity is contained in this family assembly process in that parents of identical names, residing in the same townland, cannot be easily distinguished from one another. An additional source of ambiguity in working with the baptism records arises when a family moves from one townland or parish to another. It is only when the individual families are connected together that some of these ambiguities can be discovered and resolved.

The vehicles used for assembling and organizing the family records are a combination of family trees and pedigree charts which allow a concentration of the information. The pedigree charts are used to extend the family back in time and display a reduced amount of information (years of births/baptisms, deaths and marriages). This minimizes the space required to represent an individual couple so that more generations and families can be accommodated in a structure that will still fit on a single page. This format was chosen because it allows a concentration of the information, which improves the ability to spot inconsistencies and increases the probability of finding new family connections.

This reconstruction process has an intuitive element which is guided by the minimization of inconsistencies among the various records. However, the results are not always perfect and more research is needed to ensure the accuracy of the proposed family connections. It is hoped that this minimization approach will lead to the most accurate reconstruction of these families possible, based on the currently available information. These structures also provide a useful summary of the best estimates of the ancestral names and serve as guides for future research. The diagram following the table of contents shows how the original records were first combined into two sets of family records (church and civil) and were then used in the creation of this paper. These family record documents (5) are available on the mcgrathsearch.com web site:

Several papers (6) that had already been started benefitted from the multi-generation family connections developed in this paper. These papers are listed on the right hand side of the diagram. It is hoped that some of the families in this document will be found to be connected to the McGrath and Long families in the Moyaliff-Holycross area and if so they will be integrated into the larger document currently under development: "Reaching Across The Penal Times."



The "Pre-Birth Baptisms"

The following excerpt will explain the bolding, underlining and highlighting used when the church baptism and civil birth records overlap and in some cases the baptism date precedes the birth date.


"These observations have been made while searching the civil records for two surnames: McGrath and Long, in two Registration Districts: Thurles and Cashel. Depending on the RC parish, the parish register records available online overlap the civil records for about a 15 year period. Upon comparing the civil and church records in this overlap period the existence of a "Pre-Birth Baptism" phenomenon has been discovered. This phenomenon is characterized by a birth date in the civil record which occurs after the baptism date found in the church record.

"Examples of these phenomena should be found in these papers in Sections 1 and 4 (see document description in the Process section of this paper). Many of the families in these sections contain both birth records and baptism records. The names in the baptism records that exhibit these phenomena are underlined along with the corresponding name in the birth records. The date of the birth record is highlighted in yellow when there are matching records (same person) in the birth records and baptism records. Some of the baptism records came from a previous project and are summarized by just names and dates while for some families the baptism records were newly transcribed from the National Library of Ireland site and appear in more detail. "

In the table below are the only Denis Magraths found in the Thurles registers. They are all of sufficient age to have married in 1858. However none are compatible with the assumption that Denis and Bridget followed the Irish naming tradition in selecting names for their children. Under this assumption Dennis' parents would be Michael and Winny. No marriage record could be found for a Michael McGrath and a Winny in the 1830-1845 time period in the area around Thurles. There was a Michael McGrath of Ballycahill and Holycross RC parish who married Mary Ryan and they had a son Denis who was baptized on December 28, 1831. The identity of Denis McGrath's parents remains an open question.



Michael McGrath's baptism record in the Thurles RC parish register. There is no church record for Winnie's baptism. In the civil records there is a Winny but no Michael. Winny McGrath's marriage record (to Patrick Shea) showed that her father was named Denis and the 1901 census showed that her mother's name was Bridget. Her existence is better established than Michael's.







Three sets of parents' names are based on the naming tradition. The fourth set of parents didn't have enough baptism records to allow this naming method to be used. However, the witnesses at the wedding of William Ryan and Catherine Long were possibly Catherine's brothers and their family was known. But then again, this is all tentative and remains to be verified.




Coolbawn is a sub-townland located in the western half of the townland of Moyaliff, in the civil parish of Moyaliff. Although Coolbawn is located in Upperchurch and Drombane RC parish the church at Holycross (Ballycahill and Holycross RC parish) is much closer, which explains why William and Catherine's children were baptized there. Catherine Long's parents were not deduced from the family's use of the naming tradition. The reasoning follows from the names of the witnesses at Catherine and William's wedding as shown below and on the next page.



Based on that and Catherine's estimated birth year of about 1815 - 1820 (based on her 1839 marriage) then it is proposed that the James and John Long marriage witnesses were her brothers. Therefore it follows that John Long and Mary Magrath above are Catherine's parents.

In compiling the paper *Reconstructing Families From the Records*, there are many lines to follow as the number family members grow with each generation. Some lines are easier to follow than others but eventually the search will end due to lack of records, leads, or just time. As the search involving the Matthew McGrath and Margaret Costello family was coming to a close there was one last census record that looked like it might belong to that family so that it was tossed in at the end with a comment about a possible connection. 
"Possible relative to Matthew since Matthew and Francis appear among the children's names. Patrick and Nora had been married 7 years. Nora had given birth to 5 children all of whom were still alive, however only four of the children were living at home. The parents could read and write but none of the children, who were 6 and under, could read or write."

In early 2019 the Reconstructing paper was uploaded to the website mcgrathsearch.com in the hopes that someone might recognize their own connection to one of the families described in the paper. Ultimately it is hoped that many of these families constructed from old records will be connected to present day descendants who might be able to provide more details about their family's history. In August 2022, Seamus McGrath (seamus160452@gmail.com) of Thurles recognized the family in the 1911 census shown above and sent the author an email. Seamus had recognized Patrick McGrath as his grandfather and had some additional questions about the family.




Patrick and Nora had been married 7 years. Nora had given birth to 5 children all of whom were still alive, however only four of the children were living at home. The parents could read and write but none of the children, who were 6 and under, could read or write.

After further research it was determined that this Patrick is the son of Matthew McGrath and Margaret Costello – his age should be 48, NOT 58. Nora claimed to have given birth to 5 children and all were still alive. Her son Patrick, born September 27, 1908 is missing from this census. However, the following census for the Kelly family living next door to the McGraths shows that 2 year-old Patrick McGrath was visiting them at the time that the census enumerator visited. The census was taken on Sunday, April 2, 1911.



The Longs of Raheen, Holycross

The baptism records of the children Kennedy Long, Lawrence Long, Jun, and John Long, Jun are found in the Ballycahill and Holycross RC parish registers. The existence of the Sen / Jun pairs is supported by the Griffith's Valuation (GV) for Raheen - shown in the table below.

The church records gave Lisnagrough as the residence of a Lawrence and John Long. It can be consistently assumed that these records belong to the "Jun" part of the pairs. Lisnagrough is the next townland southwest of Raheen. This identification means that Lawrence, Jun and John Jun had moved to Raheen by the time of the GV.

All the Longs who appeared in the GV for Raheen were occupying consecutively labeled lots. This geographic closeness makes it plausible to assume that all three of these Long families might be related. The dashed lines at the top of the pedigree symbolize the possible existence of a connection.

Kennedy Long was not found in the GV for Raheen, although it was his last known residence ¹, since the family had immigrated to Hoosick Falls, NY in 1848. The connection to Richard Long was based on the assumption that Kennedy Long's first son was named after his grandfather. If this is Laurence Jr., it would be expected that his first son would have been named Laurence. Given the 1835 commencement year of the Ballycahill-Holycross church records there could be other children prior to James. If this were Laurence Sr. then there would have been room for a Laurence Jr. to appear in the GV, although he might be on the younger side for being an occupier of land. In this case Laurence Jr. and Thomas would be brothers.

John Long = Anne Burke

There is a **John Long** in the Ballycahill and Holycross records who was associated with Lisnagrough. Like Laurence Long, John must have also moved to Raheen by the time of the GV but this is speculation at this point.

Patrick Long

So far no **Patrick Long** has surfaced in the other records who could be placed in the townland of Raheen at the time of the Griffith's Valuation. In a later section of this paper there is a Thomas Long who will be discussed. He was labeled there for convenience as "of Grange," while the Minton Papers describe this Thomas as "of Tubrid" (subtownland in the northern portion of Raheen townland). The father of this Thomas was named Patrick (from Thomas Long's 1892 death certificate). As indicated in the diagram on the previous page this Thomas might be the brother of Patrick Jun.





*Tubrid Long - McGrath Pedigree *




Laurence Long and Margaret Ryan of Lisnagrough (from their children's baptism records) have been identified as the Laurence Long Jun. family who were occupying land in the townland of Raheen at the time of the Griffith's Valuation. This assignment was made since Thomas Long's (1824-1901) first son was named Laurence and his first four children were born in Tubrid, Lisnagrough, Farney Bridge and Tubrid (1862-1867). However, since Thomas Long's first child was born in 1862, at the time of the GV Thomas was most likely living at home, which would lead to the assumption that his father was the Laurence Jun. and not the Sr.

Laurence and Margaret's granddaughter, Ellen Long, married Patrick McGrath (Glenbane) and they had their children in Tubrid (sub-townland in Raheen) during the first decade of the 20th century.

The civil marriage records of Michael (1868), Margaret (1872), Anne (1873), Patrick (1874), and Mary (1875) support their father's name being James. Margaret had no children but the names of Patrick McGrath and Ellen Long's children reinforce James as Patrick's father. The census records for 1901 and 1911 furnished the information on the name of James' (1841) wife as Johanna and the names of the other children.

Oddly there were no civil or church records of James and Johanna's marriage. No baptism or birth records could be found for any of their children. The rest of this family has been reconstructed solely from the census records. The grandchildren fond in the census would be children of one of James and Johanna's sons: James, Michael or John. Similarly to the rest of the family no grandchildren named Johanna and John McGrath could be found in the civil records. The group of names which comprise this family could not be found anywhere else in Ireland. If not for the census records this family would not exist.

Gaile is the Election District while Glenbane Lower is in the Holycross civil parish. The James McGrath shown in the 1901 and 1911census is <u>possibly</u> the father of Margaret and Patrick McGrath according to the information found in their marriage records (1895 and 1904, respectively). James and Johanna had been married 46 years and Johanna had given birth to 8 children, 7 of who were still alive at the time of the 1911 census. James (Sr.) was a retired farmer, his sons James and Michael were stone masons, and his daughter Mary was a dressmaker.

The Grandchildren

In this approach it is assumed that James McGrath is the father of both Johanna and John. Below is a birth record for a Hanna with a James as her father. The residence, Holycross, is geographically closer to Glenbane. Hanna was living with her grandparents at the time of the 1901 census and her parents (no marriage record found) were still alive and they would have a son named John in 1904 (no birth record found). Prior to 1911 James' wife died and he and his children, Johanna and John, were all living with James' parents at the time of the 1911 census.



The original interest in John and Catherine's family was the connection to Raheen found in the baptism records. An attempt was made to see if John was the father of Margaret (b. 1872, Glenbane) and Patrick McGrath (b. 1874, Glenbane). Their parents were James McGrath and Johanna LNU according to the Glenbane census records. A search was made of the Ballycahill and Holycross registers: Oct 1859 - 1876 and no marriage record and no baptism records were found for a James McGrath. The same search of the civil registrations also turned up empty.

A marriage record was found however for a similar but not the same person. This was a John McGrath of Cormackstown and Raheen, Holycross.

Analysis: Attempting to make this John McGrath fit in as the father of Margaret and Patrick McGrath of Glenbane didn't work out - there were too many discrepancies. (1) This is John and the marriage records of Margaret and Patrick gave their father as James. (2) This Margaret and Patrick were from Glenbane while John McGrath's Margaret and Patrick from Raheen and Long House. Raheen is about 5 km north of Glenbane. (3) There is a difference in the birth years of these two sets of Margaret and Patrick McGraths which could be overlooked if not for (1) and (2).



These are believed to be the parents of Thomas Long who married Bridget Ryan. The Ancestry Index to the Parish Registers was checked and no Thomas Long was found in this family. However, since the commencement of the Ballycahill and Holycross parish registers was only 1835, there could be additional baptisms for each of the Laurence Long families which were not recorded. The naming tradition assumption applied to the names of Thomas Long and Bridget Ryan's children yielded the names of Laurence Long and Margaret for Thomas' parents. Of course, this early commencement year also puts Laurence and Margaret's marriage record beyond the beginning of the church records. Therefore it is not possible to use the naming tradition assumption to predict the names of Laurence and his wife.



All the families with a Rathkennan association, found in the records, were pulled together in this section. They were then arranged based on their generation. The top row of families in the pedigree chart above all had children who were baptized in the same decade. It is assumed that they are related and the dashed lines indicate a possible common set of parents. The Rathkennan baptism records typically show up in the Ballycahill-Holycross RC parish registers, which sadly commence in 1835. Patrick Long's first son was Lawrence and first daughter was Mary and so he was placed under Lawrence Long and Mary Brien. Michael's first son was named Michael and so he was placed under Michael Long and Honora Long. This same Long couple had a son Richard born in 1841 and Richard Long marriage record gave his father as Michael Long and so he was placed under this couple.






Richard and Mary Costello Long were the parents of Bridget Long who married Patrick Toohey (s/o William Tuohy and Mary Fanning). Patrick and his family immigrated to Norwich, NY in 1874 and then moved to Colorado before moving to Butte, MT in the late 1890s. These proposed connections require three marriage records to prove it or a headstone inscription that shows that Mary Cass did not die in the interval needed to disprove it. A simpler cause of the confusion would be that the priest wrote Connors instead of Cass in Mary Long's baptismal record. Clare Tuohy has seen this Cass/Connors switch in other records.



APPENDIX

Populating The Pedigree Chart The Pedigree Chart

The large number of generations represented on the pedigree charts found in this paper makes it almost impossible to describe the relationships in a general and unambiguous manner. However, such an attempt will be made. At the bottom of the pedigree chart are the children who represent the youngest generation. On the particular chart shown below there are five generations represented - from the children to the gg-grandparents. The four youngest generations are usually well documented while the oldest generation is an extrapolation from the better documented generations. The oldest generation on just about every pedigree chart will be a stretch that represents the best educated guesses that could be made based on the available information.


A typical pedigree chart will contain at most five generations. The process starts at the bottom with the youngest generation which will closely resemble the usual family tree, but with a reduced amount of information. Moving up the chart the individuals in the older generations will be named by their relationship to these children. Therefore in a five generation chart there are: children, parents, grandparents, g-grandparents, and gg-grandparents. Accommodating this number of individuals in a single chart requires ignoring a few individuals, by only tracing out the ancestors of one of the parents on a single chart. At each subsequent generation, ignoring an individual here and there, will leave more room for the others. This is needed in cases where much more information is sometimes known about one individual's ancestors than the other.

The large number of individuals represented on the chart requires that only the essential information be displayed. The information that accompanies the individual names will usually be restricted to birth. marriage, and death years in addition to a location if available. In the case of the oldest generation this type of information will probably not be available, especially in those cases where the names have usually been determined or proposed through the naming tradition assumption. It is still necessary that this oldest generation convey as much information as possible. If the names of the individuals in the oldest generation have not been found in any records, i.e. they are inferred from the naming tradition or other means, then they will be displayed in italics and will not be bolded.


An estimate of the reliability of the proposed names in each generation needs to be made and in some manner that estimate needs to be indicated in the pedigree chart itself. The reasons for the variation in the reliabilities are dependent on the ability to determine the names of all the children in the family. This can be difficult when the marriage has taken place prior to the commencement of the parish registers for that locality. If the marriage record was found in the records and the first baptism from that marriage is close enough to the marriage date then it can be reasonably assumed that there are no missing children on the front end. In the family tree case shown on the following page the vertical line extending to the predicted name of the individual is a solid line. If there is some uncertainty if all the baptism records have been found then a dotted vertical line is extended to the predicted name of the individual.


The basic problem plaguing the use of the pedigree chart and the cause of difficulties in trying to explain its use lies with the relatives and their multiple relationships within the family, ie. one person's grandfather is another's father. This labeling all depends on the individual's point of reference. The only way around this multi-reference problem is to pick a basic reference point and then use it throughout the construction of the pedigree chart. In this paper the children in the youngest generation are chosen as that basic reference point. All the other individuals in the chart are described by their relationship to this youngest generation. This is most easily understood by studying the diagram shown below.

This process is driven by the existence of baptism records, or in some cases, birth records, and will therefore not continue forever, eventually the process will terminate at a final generation, when the records run out.

Gortnaculrush is in the Electoral Division of <u>Clogher</u>, in Civil Parish of <u>Clogher</u>, in the Barony of <u>Kilnamanagh Lower</u>, in the County of <u>Tipperary</u>

The baptism records from the Irish Parish Registers have previously been grouped into families and organized by surname and RC parish [see Note 1]. Within each parish the families are organized into separate tables for male and female parents of the selected surname. In Clonoulty RC parish, for example, there is one set of tables for male McGraths and a separate set of tables for female McGraths. An individual family tree was created for each family that had four or more baptism records. Within one set of tables the families are organized by the given name of the McGrath parents. For a given McGrath first name the families are ordered within the table by the date of the first baptism for each family. This provides an approximate chronological order within the table.

The goal of the exercise in this document is to create larger families by combining the earlier constructed individual families described in the previous paragraph. This process is guided by assuming that (1) families used the naming tradition: 1^{st} born son and daughter are named after the paternal grandparents and the 2^{nd} born son and daughter are named after the maternal grandparents; (2) the fathers' age is compatible with the family's placement on the time line sequence; (3) the families are geographically close. The selection of the connections between the families is such that the number and degree of any inconsistencies are minimized.

This approach for matching up the families is not perfect since some families didn't always consistently follow the naming tradition; marriages occurred between individuals who did not live geographically close to each other and sometimes there were large differences in the ages of the couple being married.

One way to implement this process is to create a table of three columns and with as many rows as needed. In reviewing the RC parish of Clonoulty Male Table [see mcgrathsearch.com \rightarrow The Families in Ireland \rightarrow Family Records \rightarrow McGrath \rightarrow Clonoulty], which started in 1804, the families within a given townland seem to fall into three approximate groups: 1804-1815; 1830-1850; 1860-1875. These are approximate time periods but the grouping effect is easily discerned. For a given townland, with a significant number of families, copy and paste the families from the web site PDF table into the appropriate time column of the three column table just created. Then try to match up the families in the 2nd (middle) column with one of the families in the first column. There might be multiple families in the 2nd column that match up with a family in the 1st column. Then repeat the process lining up families from the 3rd column with families in the 2nd column. Again, many to one matches are permissible.

In the three column table above an apparent match up has been found for three male McGrath families in the sub-townland of Stook. They are obviously geographically close, since they are all in the same townland (Gortacoolrush). The age differences seem compatible (handled by the column sorting) and the naming tradition along the male line is seen to have been followed consistently. This appears to be a perfect match except for one thing. The Patrick Magrath baptized in 1815 cannot be the Patrick McGrath in the 2nd column because the 1815 Patrick died young and his family never reused the name for another child. This information came from the inscription on his father's [James McGrath (1796-1833)] gravestone in Clonoulty graveyard. This demonstrates that these process results represent a proposed set of family connections which are reasonable but cannot be guaranteed to be correct even though all three criteria are satisfied.

As a next step the geographic requirement can be relaxed. The surrounding RC parishes didn't commence as early as Clonoulty (1804) so there is no need to search those parishes for a James and Margaret McGrath family. Fortunately, there is another James and Margaret McGrath family in the nearby townland of Clonoulty (probably Clonoulty Curragh) in the same RC parish. There is a Patrick in this family who had been baptized on March 7, 1831.

Church Records - Clonoulty

As originally constructed there was only one James Magrath - Mary Dwyer family in Clonoulty RC parish. The families were constructed via an algorithm and although it could handle surname spelling variations and given name equivalents (such as Maggie, Peggy, etc for Margaret) it could not resolve families of identical names. In Clonoulty there were two James Magrath and Mary Dwyer families. The separation of these two families required user intervention and special tools were provided to accomplish the separation without ruining the structure of the spreadsheet.

The original merged family showed an alternating residence pattern between Stook (Gortnaculrush townland) and Clonoulty. This alternation is not unusual but a couple baptism dates were too close together - less than 9 months apart. A search was made for multiple marriage records with the following results:

February 10, 1823 - **James Magrath** <u>married</u> **Mary Dwyer**, Res: None Wit. Tim Dwyer, John Quinlan and Phillip Magrath. Priest: Rev. P. Molony.

No marriage record was found for James Magrath and Mary Dwyer of Stook from 1815 all the way back to the beginning of the Clonoulty records in 1804. In this case it was possible to make a clean separation of the Stook and Clonoulty baptisms. The two separated families are shown in column 1 of the table on a previous page.
