
The Old Mattydale Schoolhouse

Introduction

At one time there was a small wooden school house, referred to as District School No. 3, located on East Molloy Road. During the 1920s the area around the old school house had rapidly transitioned from farm land to residential neighborhoods. That surge in growth brought with it a dramatic increase in population which included growing families that needed schools for their children. A new school house was needed and it took the form of a four classroom brick building.



This 1924 map is divided in the center by Molloy Road with the lots of Mattydale to the north, shown in green. The old school house is shown in yellow on the north side of Molloy Road at the top of McKinney Avenue. Just east of the old school house is the new brick school house, shown in pink.

There was no mention of moving the old school house in the Fulton Historical Newspapers in 1922-1930. However there was this: At a school meeting Kathie Molloy described how..."The little old building, which has stood for 70 years, had one teacher who tried the best she could to teacher 146 pupils, before Feb 19, when we moved into the new building."

However, the time period was a bit shorter than 70 years. The original building from 1853 was destroyed by fire in 1902 and a new school house was quickly built on the same location. Therefore, the little old school house sitting on Molloy Road in 1923 was only 21 years old. Miss Molloy should have known that since she had attended school in both of the buildings.


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
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What Happened to The Original One Room School House?

The first clue that the author had about the fate of the old school house came from a short history of Mattydale that was passed out to his 6th grade class. According to that document it had become a residence on one of the nearby streets, according to Gertrude Duplessis' <u>History of Mattydale</u>. "This early school was moved to Matty Ave. in 1922 and is occupied as a private dwelling," p. 6.



In 1923 Matty Ave was only two blocks long, it ended where it butted up against the Wright farm. If the old school house had been relocated in 1922, it would have to be somewhere in those two blocks. However, on a 1924 map (shown above) the old school house (yellow) was still in place, prior to the wing extensions being added (1928) to the original brick building (pink).



The old school house can still be seen in a 1926 aerial photo above. The wings were added on each side of the original brick building, in 1928, and can be seen to be missing in this earlier photo. The wings would necessitate the moving of the old schoolhouse at that time. The one-room school house was located right at the top of McKinney Ave, to the left (west) of the larger brick school house.

Probable Sequence of Events:

The new four room brick school house was opened on February 19, 1923 and the children paraded from the old wooden school house, located just west of the new school, to the new school house. 1923-05-17 – Syracuse Herald

The Mattydale subdivision had opened on Saturday, March 18, 1922. The subdivision plan number was 82-1868 and was dated September 28, 1923. On March 9, 1923, Frank and Minnie E. Matty purchased the western half of the old school house lot consisting of 0.123 acres. The old school house was still in place in 1926 (see photo above), however, the construction of wings on the eastern and western ends of the new brick building would require the old school house to be demolished or removed. Frank Matty had purchased of the western half of the old school house lot in 1923 and the larger portion of the old school house was on his half of the property. According to the newspaper, construction of two fireproof wings on the brick school house in Mattydale was set to begin "within a few weeks." (Sunday Journal, October 23, 1928).

In all likelihood it was Frank Matty who had the old school house removed from its longtime location on East Molloy Road at the top of McKinney Avenue and he had it moved to his empty Lot 62 on Matty Ave., which was right behind the brick school. Then, on or about July 6, 1929, Matty sold Lot 62 to Maurice Flavin. It changed hands twice more before the end of 1929. It isn't known if any of these first owners ever resided on the property before the 1930 census recorded Reuben Holmes as residing at 213 Matty Ave (Lot 62).

In the following paper the ownership of Lot 62 of the Mattydale tract will be traced from Frank and Minnie Matty to the Betters family. Then the land transaction between the Mattys and School District No. 3 will show that Matty possessed the western half of the old school house lot from 1923 until December 1928. The construction of the wings on the school required the removal of the old school house. It can be demonstrated that Frank Matty had access to the property and a location (Lot 62) for the old school house to be relocated. Although no actual mention of the old school house could be found, the property transfers and the construction of wings on the brick building provide the motivation for the removal of the old building and Matty had the means and motivation to move the structure.

213 Matty Avenue - Lot 62

In January 2021 the author received an email from Isaac Betters

"My name is Isaac Betters, and I have been doing some research on the house I live in. My parents bought the house in '91 and according to who they bought it from, my address (213 Matty Ave) was the old one room schoolhouse."

After consulting several maps and a virtual stroll up Matty Avenue via Google Streets it was determined that 213 Matty Avenue was Lot 62 in Frank Matty's residential development called Mattydale. Then, a search of the 1930 census turned up a Reuben R. Holmes who was residing at 213 Matty Ave. with his family. Further information was gathered on Holmes via search of the Fulton History Newspaper Archive.

On March 27, 1928, a fire caused by lightning destroyed the house of Reuben R. Holmes of Matty Ave. However, no explicit address was given in the newspaper article. At the time of the Holmes fire, 213 Matty Ave. was still in the possession of Frank Matty and his wife. Matty (and his wife) sold Lot 62 (which later became 213 Matty Ave.) to Maurice Flavin and the deed was registered on July 6, 1929. It was at some time after this sale that Holmes and his family occupied a house on Lot 62.



The location information is not as complicated as it might appear at first glance. The (M) stands for the Township of Manlius which was an original township in the Military Tract. "Sal" is for the Town of Salina which was carved out of the original Manlius township. "Lot 62 Sec B" is the designation of the property within the Mattydale subdivision.

These are the lots that the school district needed to build the original brick school house. The District still owned the eastern half of the old school house lot after Frank Matty and his wife purchased the western half of the old school house lot three days later. For a contract to be valid there needed to be an exchange of something of value, in this case a dollar. Effectively Frank and Minnie Matty donated the land to the school district.
