Introduction

Over the years I have authored several research papers that covered just a single given surname. These included names such as Gleason, O'Donnell and O'Brien to name a few. In the case of those names there were not a lot of connections among the families in the papers. This paper concentrated on Dwyer families of Cortland, Madison and Onondaga Counties. Unlike the earlier single surname papers there was a high degree of connection among the Dwyer families described in this paper.

The work on this paper began in 2003 and over the succeeding years this effort has sporadically received my attention. On the positive side this paper has benefitted from the increased number of resources that are now available online as compared to the situation that existed back in 2003.

In an effort to enable the reader to easily navigate among the various families a numbering scheme has been developed. The first generation of a family is labeled with a capital letter — such as “A”. The children of this first generation, the second generation, are labeled by appending a number to the letter; A1, A2, A3, etc. The members of third generation are labeled by the addition of another digit — such as A2.1, A2.2, A2.3, etc. This methodology can easily be extended to as many generations as needed.

This paper is organized first by counties: Cortland, Madison and Onondaga. The families are sorted among the various counties based on the amount of time that the first generation spent in that county. The families were then organized starting with the first generation followed by the members of the second generation. The third generation then followed their second generation parents before proceeding to the next member of the second generation.

For each family there are church records (if available), census records and cemetery records plus any information from the Find A Grave web site. Then several newspaper archives were searched for obituaries. Finally the newspaper archives were searched again for human interest articles to help bring the various individuals back to life again.

It has been over 20 years since Dick Barr had transcribed the marriage and baptism records of St. James Church in Cazenovia, NY and Dennis Weiskotten transcribed the burial records of the St. James Cemetery. Both of these gentlemen have since passed on but the usefulness of their transcriptions remains and they continue to assist genealogical researchers.

In a few cases it was possible to track a Dwyer family back to their point of origin in Ireland through various Irish marriage and baptism records that have been available on line since 2015. There was one full throttle example of the “Luck of the Irish.” A Dwyer woman had given birth to 11 children in Ireland before the family immigrated to

America. It was possible to find baptism records for all 11 of those children in the Irish Parish Registers.

The Irish tend to use the same names again and again over the generations. This makes it difficult to distinguish among the many Dwyer individuals with the same names in the public records. Obituaries are extremely helpful in assembling family members, for discovering the married names of the daughters and for finding in which cities the family members were living at the time of a death in the family.

The census records can be very helpful but they have to be examined in the aggregate with a discerning eye. Individuals will sometimes spontaneously switch to their middle names and women are notorious for exaggerating their ages. It comes down to a matter of "what do you trust?" Then there is the problem of the census enumerators who can't spell and have very bad or too fancy hand writing. On top of that there is the problem of the census indexers who have the job of deciphering this hand writing. Sometimes it was necessary to search the census page by page because the indexers couldn't correctly decipher the census handwriting.

In the Appendix there are some lists of marriage and baptism records from St. James Church for persons who couldn't be found in the census records. These are part of the legacy left by the late Dick Barr and they have been included for future reference.

There is also a section where a successful attempt was made to separate a John Dwyer, Jr. of Fabius from a John Dwyer, Jr. of nearby Cuyler. This separation required the detailed analysis of census records, land deed records, newspaper articles and a bit of luck.

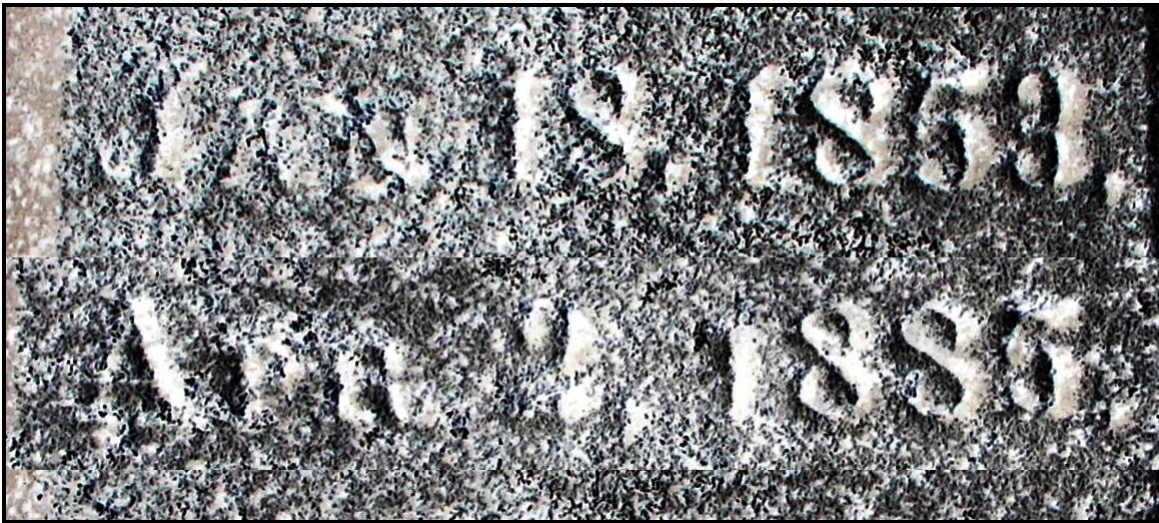

Analysis



Patrick Dwyer's death date came from a list of the burials at St. Patrick's Cemetery in Truxton NY found on the web site interment.net. Patrick's appearance in the 1855 census shows that he didn't die on Jan. 18, 1853.

The image above shows a composite analysis of Patrick and Ann's gravestone in St. Patrick's Cemetery, Truxton, NY. The death dates have been juxtaposed and analyzed by taking a negative of the image and adjusting the contrast. The NY State Death Index gave a death date for Ann Dwyer of April 5, 1885. On the web site interment.net and Find A Grave Ann's death date was given as April 2, 1883. There is an obvious difference between the "2" and "5" and it wasn't a case of misreading the gravestone inscription. If the Death Index is believed then Ann died in 1885. Patrick's death was not found in the death index.

Ann's death date can be used to see that the year of Patrick's death was 185?, with an uncertainty about the last digit in that year. Ann appeared in the 1860 census but Patrick was missing which is consistent with him dying in the latter part of the 1850s. An analysis of the possible last digits found in the year 185X showed that it couldn't be a 5, 7, or 8. That left only a 6 or a 9 as possible choices for the last digit — with the 9 seeming to be the most likely.

Arrivals

This Dwyer family didn't immigrate to the US as a family unit. The first to arrive was John Dwyer in 1846. He was followed by his brother William in 1851. In 1852 their younger brothers Michael and Richard arrived in the US. Their parents Patrick and Ann Dwyer arrived in Truxton in 1854. All the Dwyer brothers came to the US as bachelors and married after their arrival.

The fate of the remaining four children of Patrick and Ann is uncertain. Their ages in the year of their parents' immigration to the US is given in the left column of the family tree above. Assuming that they had not died it seems logical that they chose to remain in Ireland rather than emigrate with their parents.

"**Mrs. Dwyer's** maiden name was **Johanna McCauly**. Mr. and Mrs. Dwyer have lived the greater part of their marriage life in Preble, where they are respected and honored by friends and neighbors about them. Although advanced in years, being 83 (b. 1817) and 82 (b. 1818) respectively, both enjoy good health and still work their four acres of land in Preble. KILLED WHILE JUMPING FROM A TRAIN - Cornelius Dwyer the Victim.

"Last Sunday night occurred another of the frequent fatal accidents which happen to persons attempting to jump from trains in rapid motion. **Cornelius Dwyer**, who met his death in this manner, was a brakeman on the gravel train stationed here, he boarded at the McDonald's on Cortland Street, near Center, and it was at this place that he made the fatal attempt to dismount from the 8:40 evening passenger train going south. In some way he was drawn under the wheels of the car, both his legs cut off near the ankles, his hands fearfully crushed and torn, and he received severe wounds about the head. He was found by some men who were walking down the track and taken to McDonald's house.

"**Dr. F. H. Green** and **Dr. Bradford** were summoned to attend him. So bad were his injuries that no surgical skill could avail, and the sufferer died at a little after 12 o'clock the same night. His parents, who live in Preble, were telegraphed for and arrived a short time before his death, but he was then unconscious. He was nineteen years of age and unmarried. The remains were sent home on Monday morning. We trust this will prove a timely warning to those who are in the habit of attempting the hazardous feat of dismounting from a train when in rapid motion. It is never safe even for the most expert to attempt it."

COUNTY HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT BUILT ROADS FOR ARMY IN FRANCE

William J. Dwyer, who was recently appointed county superintendent of highways by the board of supervisors, is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Patrick J. Dwyer of Truxton. He was born at Truxton in 1894 and still claims that place as home, although his school and highway duties have called him elsewhere for a good many years.

Mr. Dwyer graduated from the Central high school, Cortland, in 1911. In 1912 he entered the service of the state highway department as a rodman and has been engaged in highway work ever since. At first he worked through the summer months, during the years that he was a student at the civil engineering college at Cornell University. By competitive tests in civil service examinations he worked up to the position of assistant engineer and for a number of years was attached to the division engineer's office at Hornell and was in charge of construction and repair contracts in Chemung, Schuyler, Yates, Tompkins, Tioga, Allegany, and Steuben counties. He resigned from the state highway department when he was appointed county superintendent a few weeks ago.

In the fall of 1917 he went to Syracuse and enlisted in the 23d Engineers and went overseas in the following March. His regiment was in charge of highway and railroad construction in France and he worked at Bordeaux, Chaumont, and Varennes in the Argonne section. Mr. Dwyer was with his regiment in the Argonne from the beginning of the battle of Argonne Forest, September 26, 1918, until the middle of May, 1919, and assisted in the construction and rebuilding of many miles of highway. He returned to this country in June and was discharged at Camp Devens, resuming his work with the highway department on July 1.

Thus far this spring, as county superintendent, he has been working with the town superintendents on the dirt highways of the towns and in repair-

ing and rebuilding bridges. At present he has under construction a concrete bridge on the improved road between Virgil and Harford. This bridge has a span of 16 feet, with a 20-foot roadway.

At the annual session the board of supervisors decided to build all town and county highways under a new system, the work to be done by the county superintendent instead of by the town superintendents. Mr. Dwyer expects to start this work in a number of towns soon after the first of May.

"**William J. Dwyer**, 64, Superintendent of Highways for Cortland County, since 1921, died last night in Cortland Memorial Hospital. He resided at 10 Jewett Avenue.



Active in the American Legion for many years. **Mr. Dwyer** was Treasurer of the Dept. of New York for the past 13 years.

"Born April 7, 1894, in Truxton, he was the son of the late **Patrick J.** and **Ellen Haneen Dwyer**.

"He was educated in the Truxton Central School and Cortland High School, attending Cornell University in the class of 1916 where he studied civil engineering. During the summers of 1913 and 1914 he was employed by the New York State Highway Department and in 1915 he entered the regular employ of the department. He was a licensed land surveyor and professional engineer.

"In June 1917, **Mr. Dwyer** enlisted in the Engineering Reserve Corps of the U. S. Army the day after war was declared, and reported for duty at Camp Meade, being assigned to Company K of the 23rd Engineers. 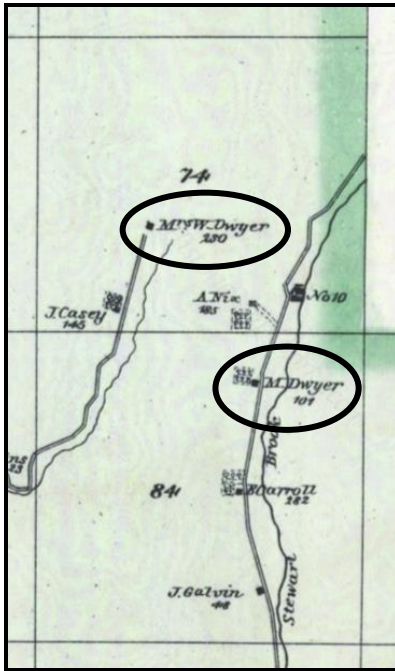

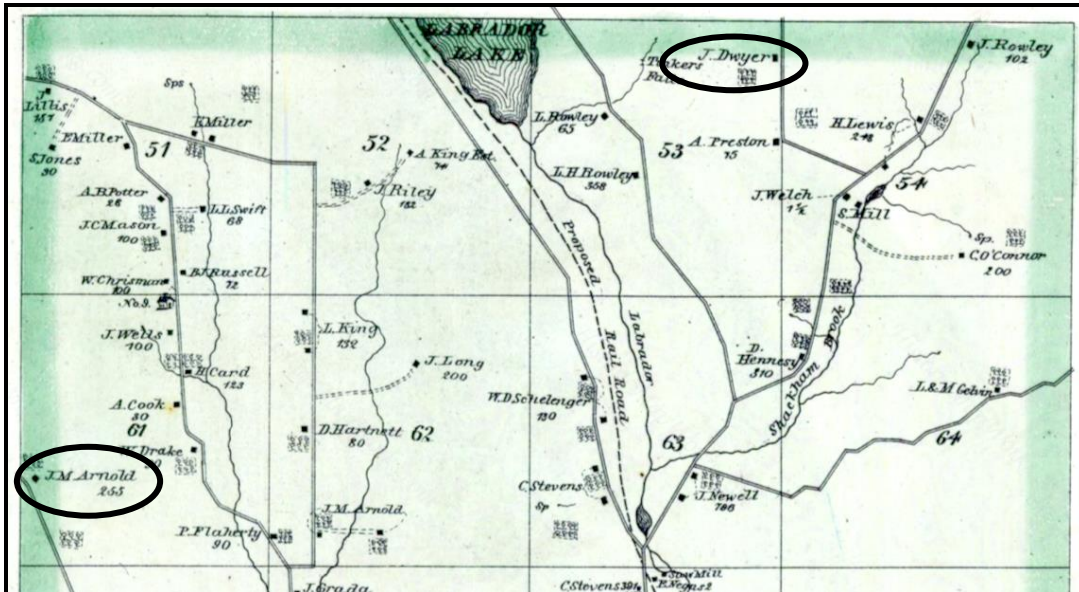

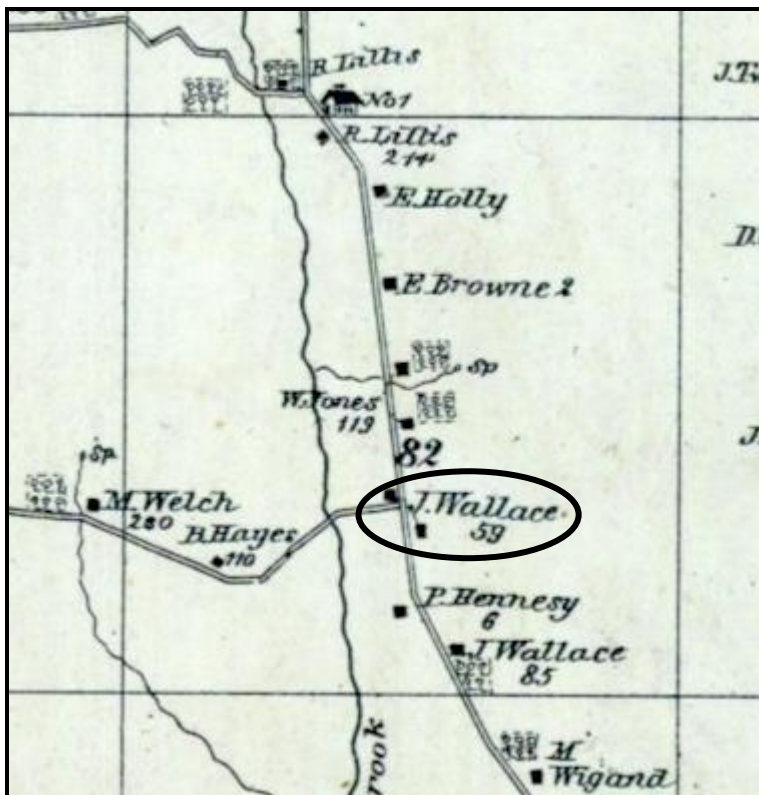
Lot Locations - 1876 Cortland County Map Atlas



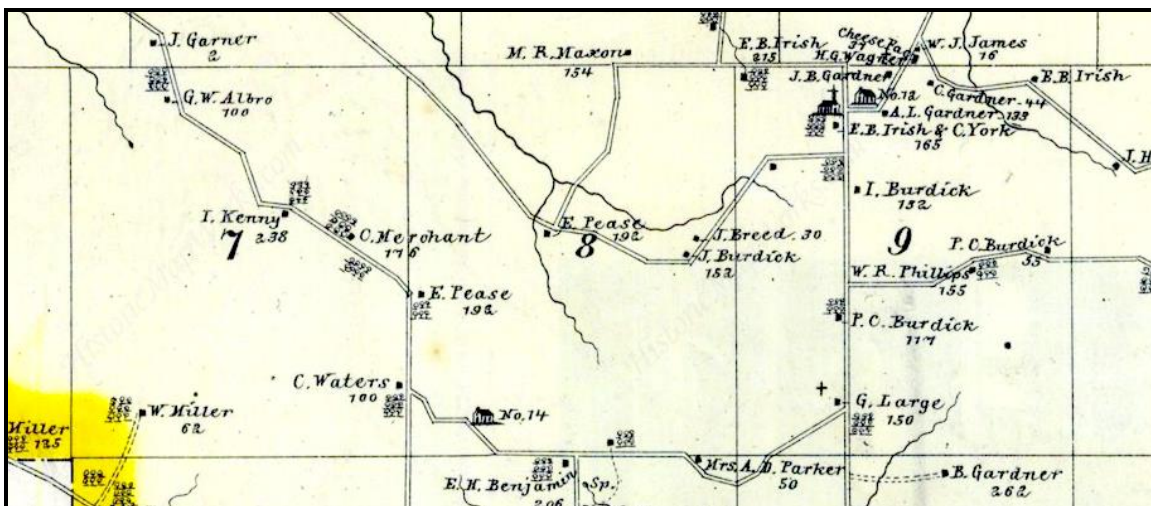

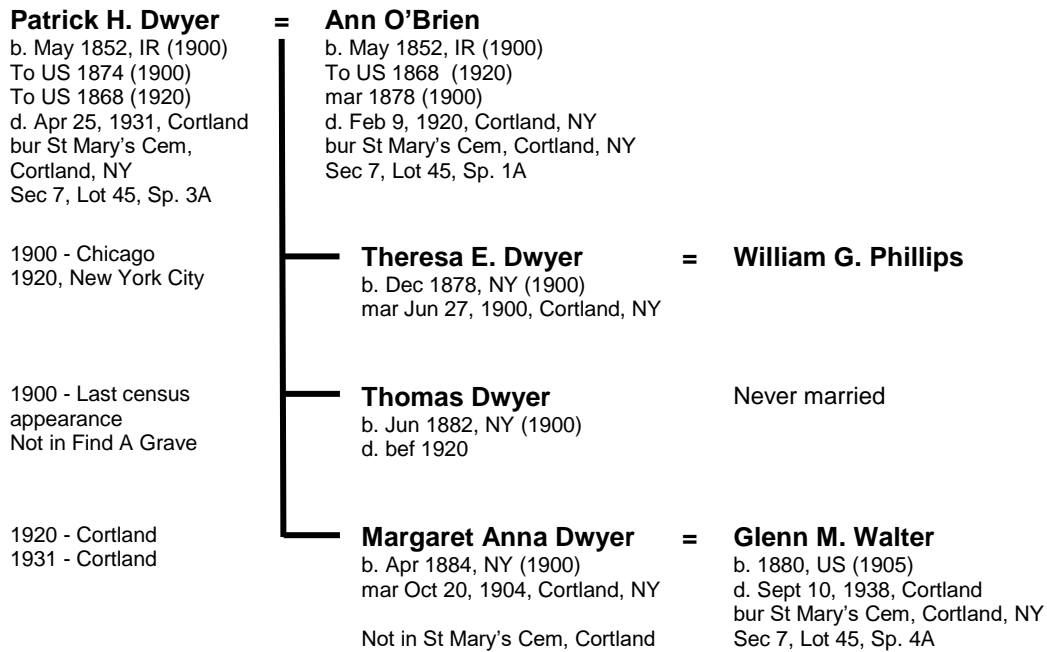

Catherine and Ellen Dwyer come from a list given to Barb Ryan, of Cortland, in August 2003 by Theresa MacNamara Fitzgerald. Theresa received the list from Kathy Russell Shiffer (Ryan, Burke, Dwyers). The list had no dates. All the dates had to be back filled into the tree above. The information on Malachi Dwyer's parents (William O'Dwyer and Ellen Burke (from Spain)) came from that same list. It was just a list of names — there were no authorities cited. Theresa was descended from the James Rowan - Margaret Dwyer line.

Malachi Dwyer was not found in any census. He wasn't found on Weiskotten's list of burials in St. James Cemetery, where his wife Johannah was buried. Malachi was also not found on the NY State Death Index, but then neither was his wife Johannah found there.

William Dwyer

"Having lived nearly a century. **Mr. William Dwyer** was claimed by death on Tuesday morning, September 7th.

"He was born in Ireland in 1817, coming to America in 1843 and has since made his home in Fenner and Cazenovia. In 1860 he married **Miss Winifred Ryan**, and to the devoted couple were born eight children, six of whom survive him.

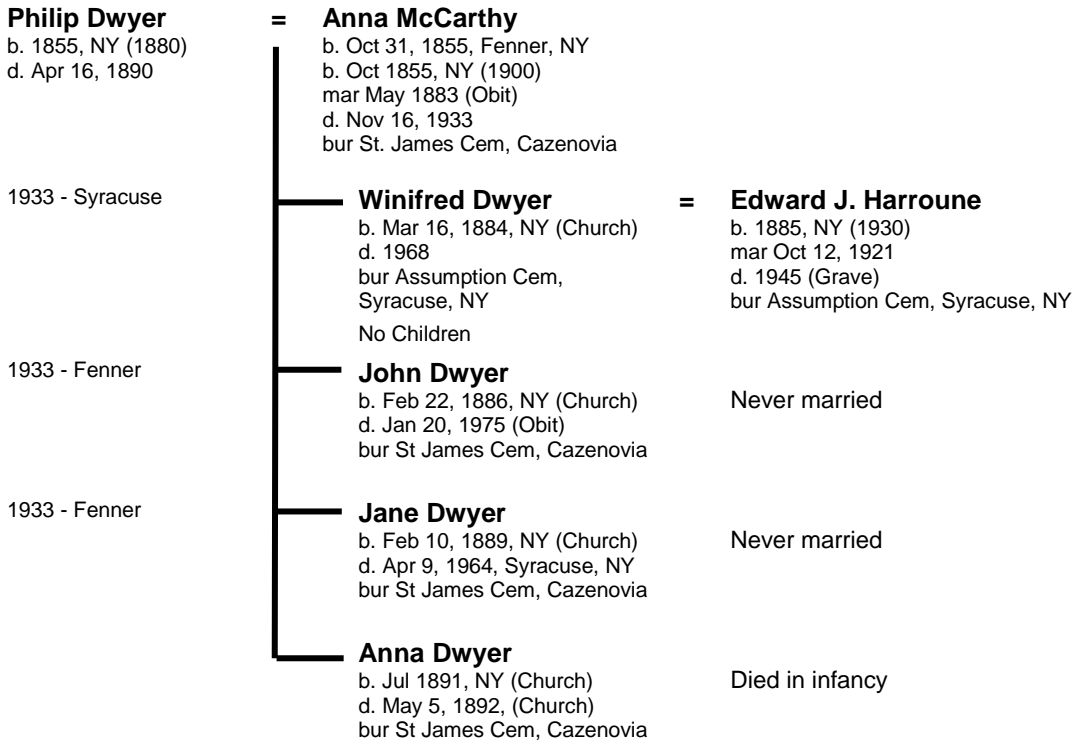

Ralph Marion Killed; Gravel Bed Accident

“**Ralph Marion**, 30, son of **Mrs. Bridget Marion** of Cazenovia, was crushed to death in the conveyor of a sand lifter late Saturday afternoon (May 2nd).

“The accident took place at the sand and gravel bed of the General Stone Company of Easton, Pa., half a mile north of Fayetteville, just before workmen were ready to quit operations for the day. **Mr. Marion**, who is superintendent of the plant, was cleaning mud from a bucket conveyor belt, a duty he had performed very often. The bucket line, which carried sand and gravel from the pit to the separating unit, had been stopped to allow him to climb into the pit. After he had scraped mud from the belt with a stick he signaled other workmen to throw the starting switch. A moment later, **Marion** shrieked and the motor was stopped. The heavy machinery could not be stopped at once, however, due to momentum, and workmen found **Marion** crushed, with his arm held fast between the shaft and belt. The University Hospital ambulance of Syracuse was called immediately. It took ten minutes to extricate the body from the belt. Marion was pronounced dead by **Dr. Ellsworth** and **Dr. Berwald**, ambulance physicians.

“**Mr. Marion** had been superintendent of the plant since it was taken over by the Pennsylvania company nearly four years ago, going there from the company plant at Ballina.

“Funeral services were held yesterday at his home at 131 Eldorado St., Syracuse, at 8:15, and at St. James church, Cazenovia, at 9:30. Burial was made in St. Agnes Cemetery.

“**Mr. Marion** is survived by his wife, **Mrs. Ella Dwyer Marion**; two brothers, **Daniel** and **Frank Marion** of Cazenovia; his mother, **Mrs. Bridget Marion** of Cazenovia, and two sisters, **Mrs. Anthony Dwyer** of Norwich and **Mrs. Edward J. Sullivan** of Syracuse.”

WORKER KILLED WHEN CAUGHT BY MACHINE

“His arm caught by the belt of a conveyor machine, **Ralph Marion**, 35, of 131 Eldorado st., was crushed to death in the plant of the General Crushed Stone Company in Burdick st., a mile north of Fayetteville, just before work for the day was finished Sunday.

“**Marion**, superintendent of the plant where he had been employed for nearly 15 years, had gone into a pit to scrape mud off of a conveyor belt, a task he had performed thousands of times.

“Workmen said that the machinery had been stopped to give **Marion** an opportunity to clean the belt, and that he had finished the job and signaled **Kenneth Edwards** of Fayetteville to have **Harvey Mishoe** of 104 Oxford st. to start the machinery again. A minute later they heard a shriek from the pit and **Edwards** shouted to **Mishoe** to throw out the starting switch, the machinery coming to a slow stop.

“RACE TO PIT

“Racing to the pit **Mishoe** and **Edwards** found that **Marion** had been drawn against the revolving shaft and the body was held so tightly their combined strength was not sufficient to extricate him.

“**Edwards** leaped on a truck and sped to Fayetteville for assistance, notifying **Trooper Handeville** and telephoning for the University Hospital ambulance. In the meantime **Mishoe**, **William Brownell** of Kirkville and **Henry Bushey** of 648 S. Warren st. had sought to release **Marion**, but found the task beyond them, two of the workmen fainting. **Trooper Handeville** climbed into the pit and directed the men to pull the belt back by hand, which enabled him to release **Marion’s** arm.

“RESIDENT 15 YEARS.

“Born in Cazenovia, **Marion** had been a resident of Syracuse for 15 years. He had been married just a year.

“Surviving are his wife, **Mrs. Ella Dwyer Marion**; two brothers, **Daniel** and **Frank Marion** of Cazenovia; his mother, **Mrs. Bridget Marion** of Cazenovia, and two sisters, **Mrs. Anthony Dwyer** of Norwich and **Mrs. Edward J. Sullivan** of Syracuse.

Sherman Death Near McLean Crossing Is Fourth In A Lifetime

“Dryden, Feb. 1 — **Daniel B. Sherman**, 45, was struck and killed by the morning Lehigh milk train about 11:30 a.m., Saturday, as he was walking on the right-of-way of the Lehigh Valley about 1,000 yards west of the Keenan crossing, near McLean. This tragedy makes the fourth time within a lifetime that persons have been killed near the same crossing. **Mr. Sherman** was walking towards McLean from his home on the old Fulkerson farm north of Freeville on the back road between Freeville and Peruville.

“The investigation concerning the accident, launched Saturday afternoon by **Dr. William L. Seit** of Newfield, Tompkins county coroner, revealed several facts. A woman living near the crossing, told **Sheriff Adams** of Ithaca she saw the man go down on the tracks just before the train passed her house. **Engineer Thomas McNally** of Canastota said he saw an object on the right of way, between the rails, but thought it was a bundle of papers until the engine was on top of the man whose body was carried about 200 feet before the train stopped.

“**Mr. Sherman** was born in Dryden, east of town, on what was known as the Mullen place. Several years ago when the Dryden water works bought this farm, **George Sherman**, Daniel’s brother, bought the farm on the Peru road where the two brothers have lived since. Surviving is his brother **George**, a sister, **Mrs. Bertha Hyde** of Cortland, and two nieces and a nephew.

“The funeral was Tuesday at 2 p.m. in the Perkins funeral parlors with the Rev. **Fenton E. Crutchley**, officiating. Burial was at Willow Glen.”

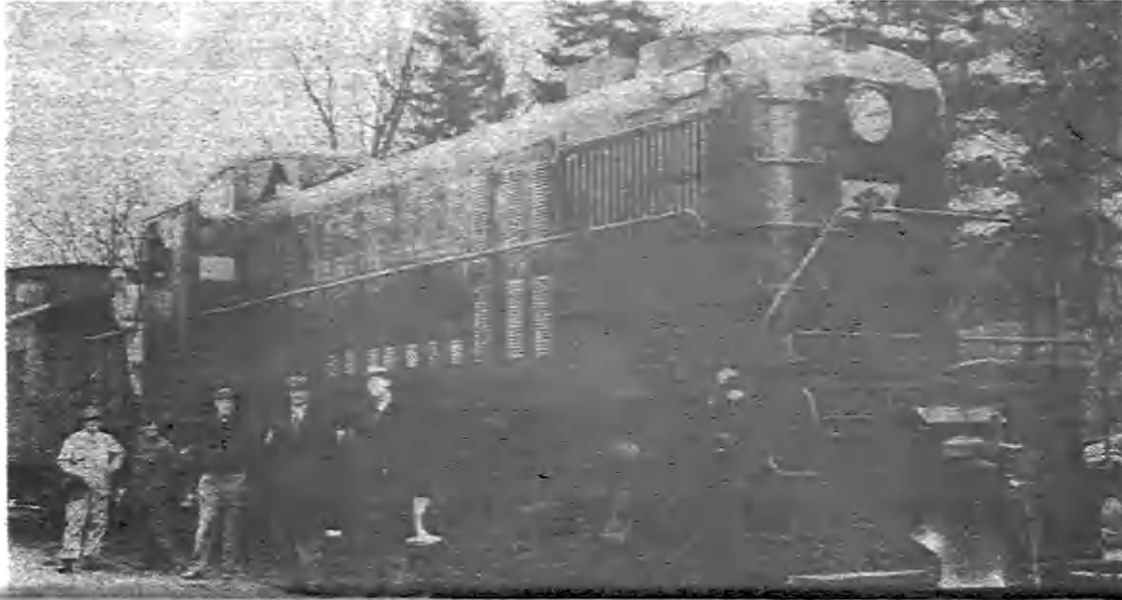
“Thirty-five employees of the Lehigh Valley Railroad enjoyed a supper and entertainment at Frank Moore’s Inn, 183 south Main Street on Thursday evening in honor of the retirement of **Burt Hull** and **Martin McNally**, well known employees of the Lehigh Railroad.

“One of the members paid touching tribute to the faithful and devoted service of the retiring men in saying ‘the railroad man never forgets the rails, the locomotive, the coach, the freight car, the caboose, nor the long rumbling train plowing through blizzards, washouts and spring floods, as well as the sad and painful accidents.’

“**Mr. Hull** and **Mr. McNally** leave behind them a host of friends made on their route from Sayre, Elmira, Ithaca, Cortland and Canastota.”

First Regular Run of a Diesel Over This Branch of Lehigh



The northbound train due daily at 11:55 A. M. at Cazenovia over the E. C. & N. branch of the Lehigh came in last Friday hauled by a Diesel—the first time a regular run over this branch has been made by one of these locomotives. The big, red, new 1500-horse-power road switcher (only two days out of the American Locomotive shops at Schenectady) attracted considerable attention.

“Even though you don’t see the engine you will recognize the typical Diesel deep-toned whistle (the Republican won’t attempt to describe it) as the train arrives in Cazenovia from Cortland about noon and on the return trip from Canastota at 3:55.

“The engine operates between Sayre and Canastota 24 hours a day, six days a week. Ordinarily it is serviced in the shops only once a week in contrast to the steam locomotives which must be serviced twice daily.

“Several years ago gasoline-electric passenger coaches were run over this branch but those were not Diesels, according to railroad officials.

“In the foreground of picture is **G. M. Dewey**, agent and yardmaster at Cortland. Standing beside him, **F. L. Daugherty**, train master at Sayre, then **Station Agent Frank G. Cargill** of Cazenovia and **H. A. MacMorran** of Sayre, road foreman of engines. The three officials made the first run ‘to see how things went.’ **Trainman Charles Burke**, formerly of Perryville, is the last man in the picture. **Engineer Thomas McNally** formerly of Fenner, is in the cab window, and fireman John Ludwig stands on the deck.”

“**Joseph H. Kiernan, Jr.**, a conductor on the Lehigh valley Railroad, follows his father and grandfather in that position with the line — and now he is working with engineer **Thomas W. McNally**, who a co-worker with the father and grandfather.

“**McNally**, shown left in the picture with the newest **Kiernan**, started as a fireman in March, 1904, and has been an engineer since 1909. He lives at 33 Park St., Cortland, and he expects to retire in June.

“The Kiernan trio started with **Patrick H.**, who went to work in 1878 as a trainman and in 1884 was promoted to conductor. His son, **Joseph H. Kiernan, Sr.**, joined the railroad as a trainman in 1909 and became a conductor in 1920. The latest **Kiernan** went to work as a trainman in 1945 and was named conductor in 1952.

Patrick H. Kiernan did not retire until 1937 after 58 years of service. The latest of the Kiernan conductor line was once a carrier boy for the Cortland Standard, but he now lives in Auburn

Tom McNally Retires; 51 Years on Railroad

Tom McNally, son of the late **Mr. and Mrs. Patrick McNally** of Chittenango Falls, retired Friday, July 1, 1955, after 51 years, three months and 23 days working for the Lehigh Railroad.

“Riding with him, on his last day, was his brother, **Martin McNally**, himself a 30-year railroad veteran, who was making the last run with Tom for old time’s sake. **Martin** was injured 12 years ago and forced to retire from railroading.

“Tom has an unblemished record for safety. He has been an engineer for the past 46 years and during that time he has never been involved in an accident, no passenger on his train has ever been hurt and no member of his crew has been injured.

“He signed on with the Lehigh on March 8, 1904, as a brakeman, and worked the tail end of the train until he was made fireman in June of that year. This was before there was any compressed air on the cars and they had to be cranked to a halt by hand.

“He served as a fireman from 1904 to 1909 and was made engineer on April 10 of that year. He has since worked steam locomotives, gas-electric rigs and the present diesel engines, working passenger trains, milk trains, freights and anything else the railroad had to offer. For the past year he has run the night freight through Freeville, Ithaca, down to Sayre and back in the morning.

“**Tom** has no special plans for retirement, right now. He and his wife, **Celia**, live in Cortland and plan to keep right on living there, relaxing and taking things easy.

“Among his welcomers at the Lehigh Station July 1, was his son, **Tom McNally, Jr.**, his wife, and their three grandsons, **Thomas, Daniel** and **Stephen**. They live in Johnson City, but drove up to be on hand when the train came in.

“**A. G. Shapley**, station agent, said that it was hard for him to get used to the idea that Tom would not be working for the company any more. He said that he was considered one of their best men, but that the company rules made it compulsory for engineers to retire when they reach the age of 70.

“**Tom** returned the compliment. He said that all of the men he had worked with, and all of the station managers, have been fine fellows, that they have all worked together very well, and that he has enjoyed working with them all.”

"**Mrs. Margaret McNally** of 11 Argyle Place, 73, widow of **Patrick McNally**, died at her home this morning at 6 o'clock after an illness of the past two months.

"**Mrs. McNally** was born in Cazenovia, Madison county, on December 8, 1854. She was the oldest of a family of six children of the late **James** and **Margaret Dwyer Rowan**, one brother surviving. **Mrs. McNally** spent the greater part of her life at her birthplace where she was united in marriage to **Patrick McNally** June 8, 1881.

Former Resident Dies

"**James J. McNally**, 48, a veteran of the World War, in which he served as a lieutenant in the U. S. Navy, died Saturday morning (Jan 23rd) in a Houston, Texas, hospital of a ruptured appendix.

"A follower of the sea for a quarter of a century as engineer, **Lieutenant McNally** was on board a steamer when he was stricken. The vessel put back to Houston in a vain effort to save his life.

"**Lieutenant McNally** was born Sept. 19, 1883, at Cazenovia, son of **Patrick** and **Margaret Rowan McNally**, who lived on a farm near Chittenango Falls. Malachi Rowan Seeks \$5,000 Damages for Alleged Personal Injuries

"Through his attorneys, Hitchcock & Murphy of Syracuse, **Malachi Rowan** has brought an action against the town of Fenner for damages in the sum of \$5,000 for personal injuries alleged to have been received by being thrown from his sleigh while driving over the roads of the town of February 6th last.

"The papers in the case assert that **Rowan's** team went into an unguarded depression in the road, the horses plunging to the bottom of the hole, which was several feet deep. He was thrown between the horses and his entire body was bruised, strained, contused and injured. 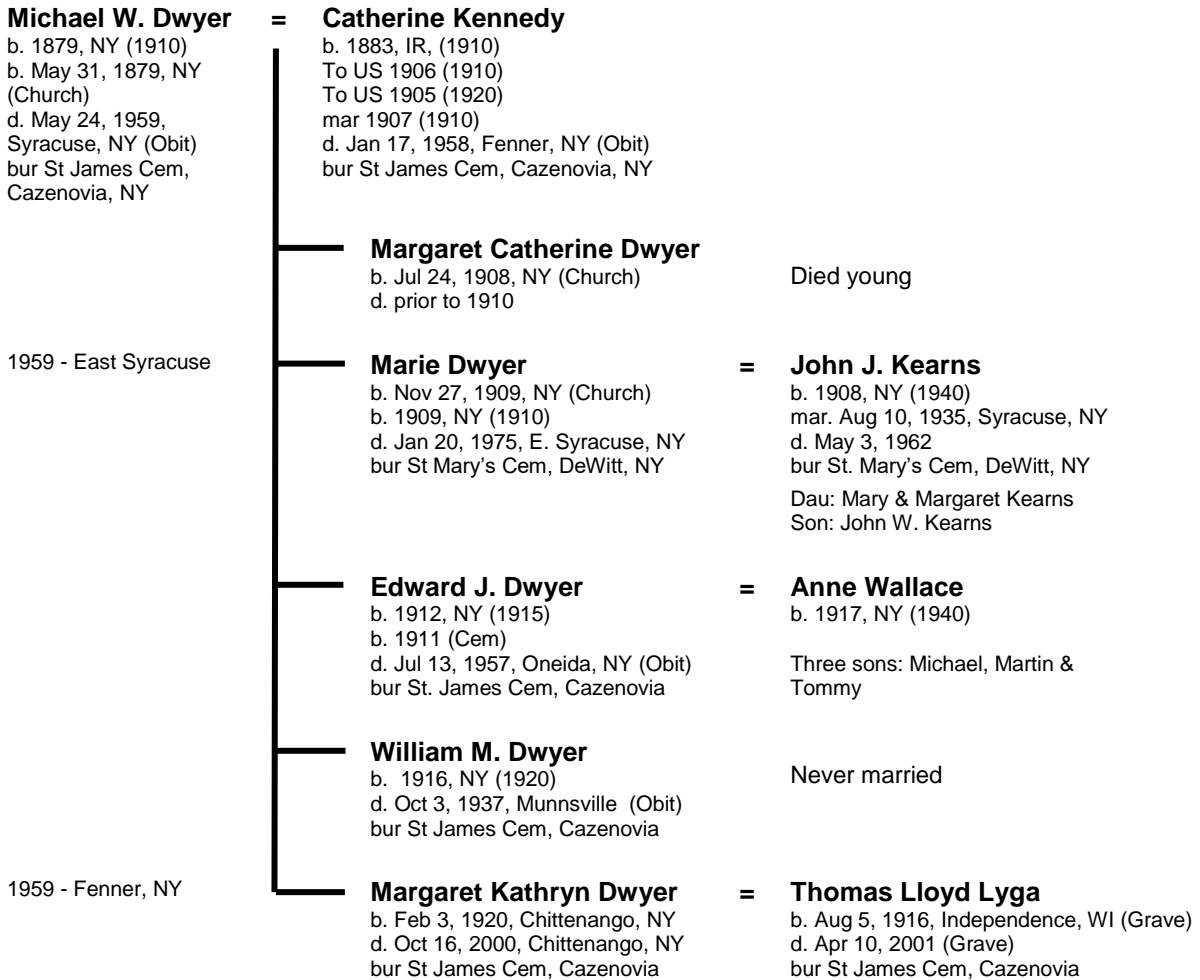

"This community was saddened on Sunday morning (Nov 6th) by the news that **Lawrence P. Burke**, one of the rising young men of this place, was dead. His death had been expected for several days. He was born near Perryville and came to Cazenovia several years ago to attend the Seminary and during the vacation began the study of law in the office of **Cameron & Kiley**. On advice of **Mr. Cameron** he returned to his studies in the Seminary from which he graduated in the class of '90. He studied in the office of **E. N. Wilson** but on the first of January 1892 he was regularly registered as a law student in the office of **D. W. Cameron, Esq.**, and has been his clerk till within about six weeks.

"Some fifteen years ago while at work on the farm he was severely kicked by one of the team which he was using and the bone of the left leg above the knee has been diseased ever since, at times causing serious inconvenience, and finally his death. Several operations have been performed during these years, the last being about five weeks ago by **Dr. Jacobson**, of Syracuse. The physicians found that the disease had become unusually deep-seated, and although he held his own for a few days and even seemed better, yet since a week ago last Friday, little hope has been entertained of his recovery. As a man, **Mr. Burke** was careful, conscientious and thorough in all matters committed to his care, and he will be mourned by an unusually wide circle of friends whom he had won by his uniform courtesy, frank, genial disposition, and upright character. William L. Burke, Former District Attorney, Died From Stroke

"Former District Attorney **William L. Burke, 54**, died Sunday morning at his home in Hamilton. He suffered a stroke the previous afternoon while watching the Penn State - Colgate baseball game and never recovered consciousness.

"A native of Perryville, he was born February 7, 1889, one of the 10 children in the family of **Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Burke**. He was graduated from Perryville union school and from Cazenovia Seminary where he was a baseball and basketball player in 1908. Entering Syracuse university law school, he received his degree there in 1910. He was twice elected Madison county district attorney.

"In 1938 he was sent from the 39th senatorial district as a delegate to the state constitutional convention. He won newspaper headlines there by a dramatic appeal for a bill allowing publically-owned utilities to make a profit.

"During the first world war he served in the navy and he was a member of Lloyd V. Evans Post 375 of the American Legion.

"Besides his parents, his wife **Ethel W.** and son **William L. Jr.**, he is survived by two daughters, **Ethel** and **Charlene**; two brothers, **Lawrence**, professor at Niagara university, and **Charles Burke** of Canastota; four sisters, **Mrs. Frank Kivlighn** of Westbury, L. I.; **Mrs. Albert Gaughan** of Syracuse, **Miss Marjorie Burke** of New York City and **Miss Florence Burke** of Perryville; one nephew and three nieces.

"Funeral services were held Tuesday morning in St. Mary's church, Hamilton. Active bearers were **Mayor William A. Reid, James D. Howlett, James J. Feeley, James Leland, Truman Wedge** and **Robert C. Roberts**, all of Hamilton.

"Honorary bearers, all prominent in judicial and legal circles were **James P. Hill** of Norwich, **Ely Personius** Elmira; **Riley Heath**, Ithaca; **Martin Deyo**, Binghamton; **Andrew McNaught**, Stamford; **William H. Coon**, Cortland; **Roland Davis**, Cortland and **Albert E. Campbell** of Canastota.

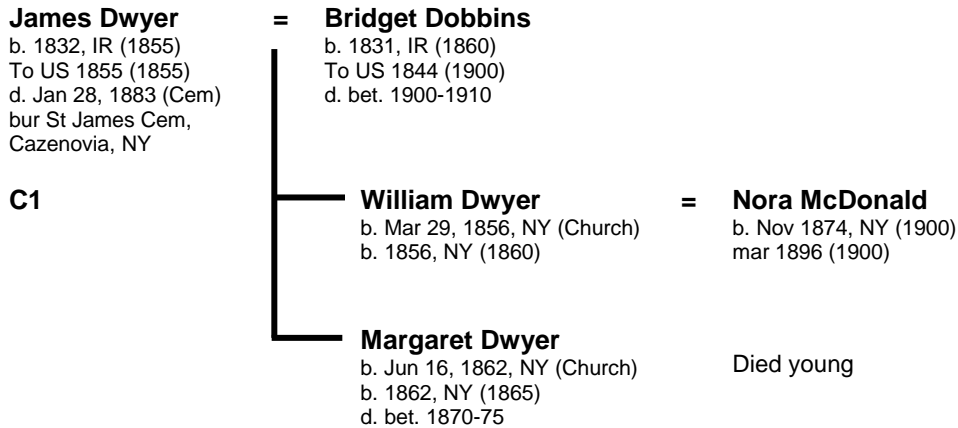

William Dwyer Vol. Fireman, Fatally Burned

“An explosion of a gas tank in a truck fire yesterday morning caused the death of **William J. Dwyer**, 50, of Cazenovia and burned six other men, one of them seriously — all seven members of the Cazenovia volunteer fire department

“The truck, which belonged to **Ernest C. Lane** of Erieville, back fired and burst into flames when on route 20 near the former West Shore railroad crossing just west of Cazenovia village. The fire department was called and just as a carbon dioxide extinguisher was about to be brought into play, the gas tank on the truck exploded, blowing out the end of the tank.

“**Dwyer** and **Merritt Fuller** were burned the worst, the clothes of the former being burned off. **Dr. S. H. Raymond**, who was at the fire, gave the stricken man first aid and rushed him to St. Joseph's Hospital, Syracuse, where he died within about six hours (Apr 26th).

“**Fuller**, employed as a fireman at the state fair grounds and a member of the Cazenovia Hook and Ladder Company, was taken to the office of **Dr. A. R. Morrow**

where he was treated for severe second degree burns of the face, hands, legs and chest. The **E. J. Walsh** ambulance took him to the University Hospital of the Good Shepherd, Syracuse, where his condition is reported as serious.

“**Franklin Durfee** and **George Miller, Jr.**, also were treated by **Dr. Morrow**, the former for second degree burns on the leg, and miller for second degree burns on one arm.

“**Patrick Ryan** and **William G. Jones** were treated by **Dr. Paul MacLeod** for second degree burns, **Ryan** for burns on left hand, arm and back; **Jones** for burns on both hands, neck and back.

“**Robert Dwyer**, brother of **William**, also was burned on the arms and neck.

“**Lane**, the owner-driver of the truck, who was burned helping extinguish the flames which were enveloping the firemen, was treated by **Dr. MacLeod** for second degree burns on both hands and arms.

“The truck, valued by authorities at about \$50, was destroyed.

“**Mr. Dwyer**, who had been employed as a meter tester by the Cazenovia Electric Company for 26 years, is survived by his wife, **Mrs. Mary White Dwyer**; two daughters, **Patty**, 8, and **Judy**, 5; his mother, **Mrs. Nora Dwyer**; six sisters, **Mrs. William Blodgett**, **Mrs. James Ryan**, **Mrs. Clive Gregg**, **Mrs. Howard Young**, all of Cazenovia, **Mrs. William Kruger** of Sherrill, **Mrs. Herbert Fuller** of Warwick; three brothers, **Robert Dwyer** and **Francis Dwyer** of Cazenovia, and **Walter Dwyer** of Syracuse.

“The remains have been taken to the home of his mother on Farnham street from where the funeral will be held Saturday morning at 9 o'clock, and in St. James church at 9:30. **Rev. Richard J. Lynch**, pastor, officiating. Burial in St. Agnes cemetery.

“Both companies of the Cazenovia Fire Department will meet in their rooms in the municipal building this evening at 8 o'clock to go in a body to the home. Saturday morning they will attend the funeral in a body in uniform, according to announcement of **Chief David Hughes**.”

“ — **Mr. Timothy Dwyer** of San Francisco, is the guest of his brother, **Mr. T. J. Dwyer**. **Mr. Dwyer** is a furniture dealer in Frisco, and tells some thrilling and interesting stories concerning his recent experience during the earthquake disaster. Although his business was greatly damaged, he feels himself lucky to have escaped with his life and expects to return in a few weeks to resume his former occupation. He brought home several souvenirs, picked up by him after the earthquake. Among them were two china cups and saucers which were warped and greatly blackened by the fire and smoke. One cup had the appearance of a smoked lamp chimney, although the smoke can not be removed by soap and water, as it is burned to (sic) deeply in the glazing. Otherwise this cup is in a good state of preservation.”

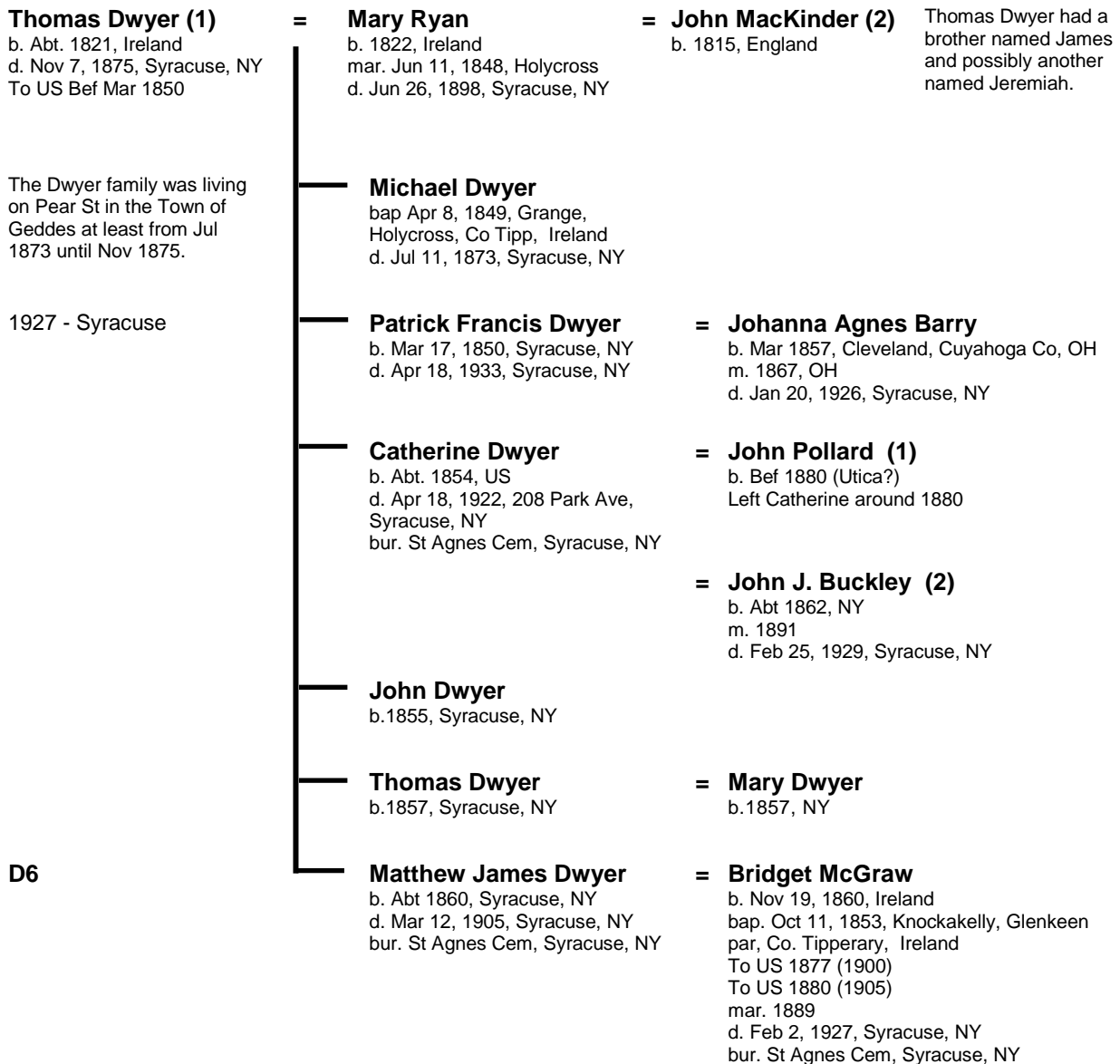

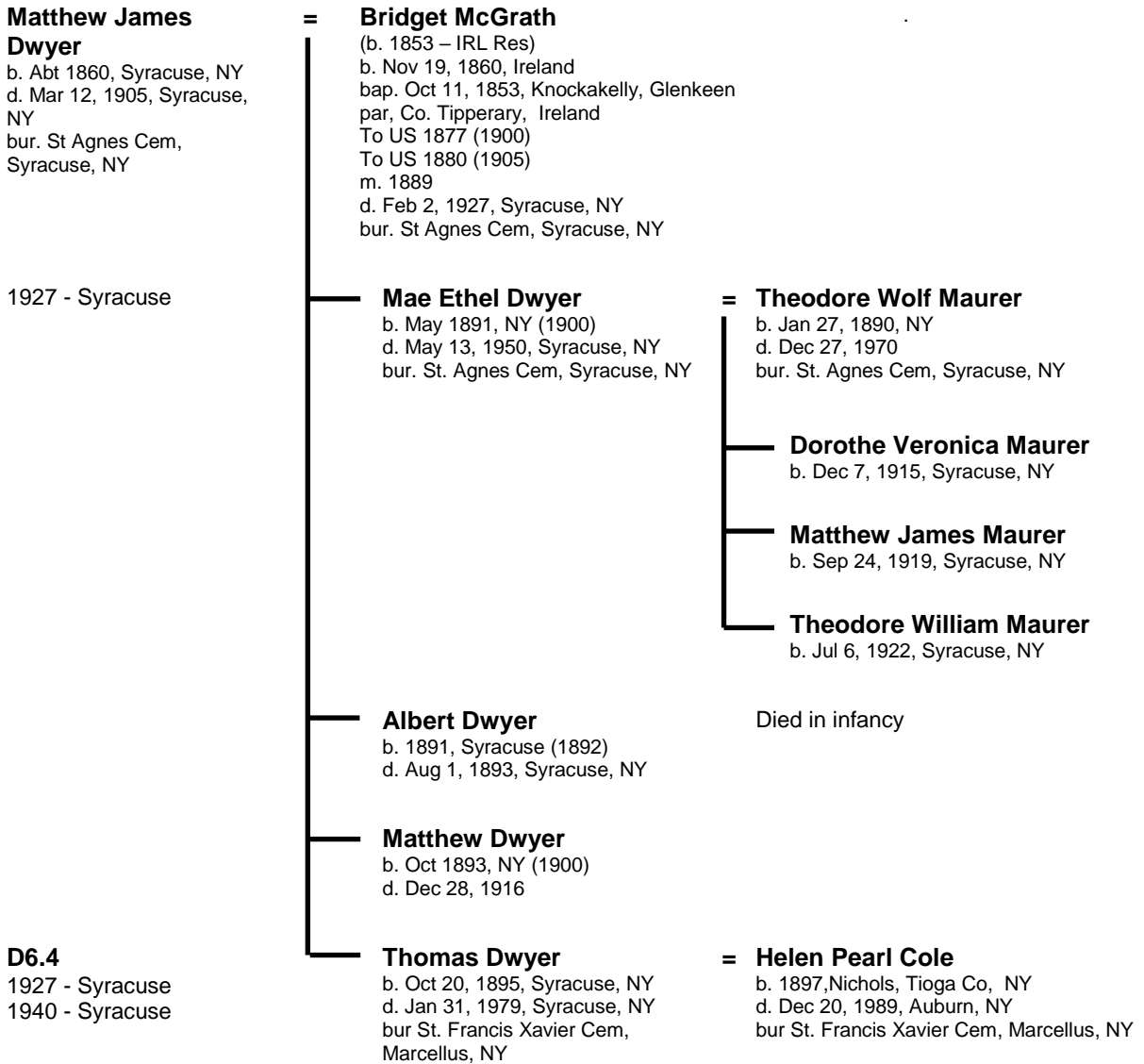

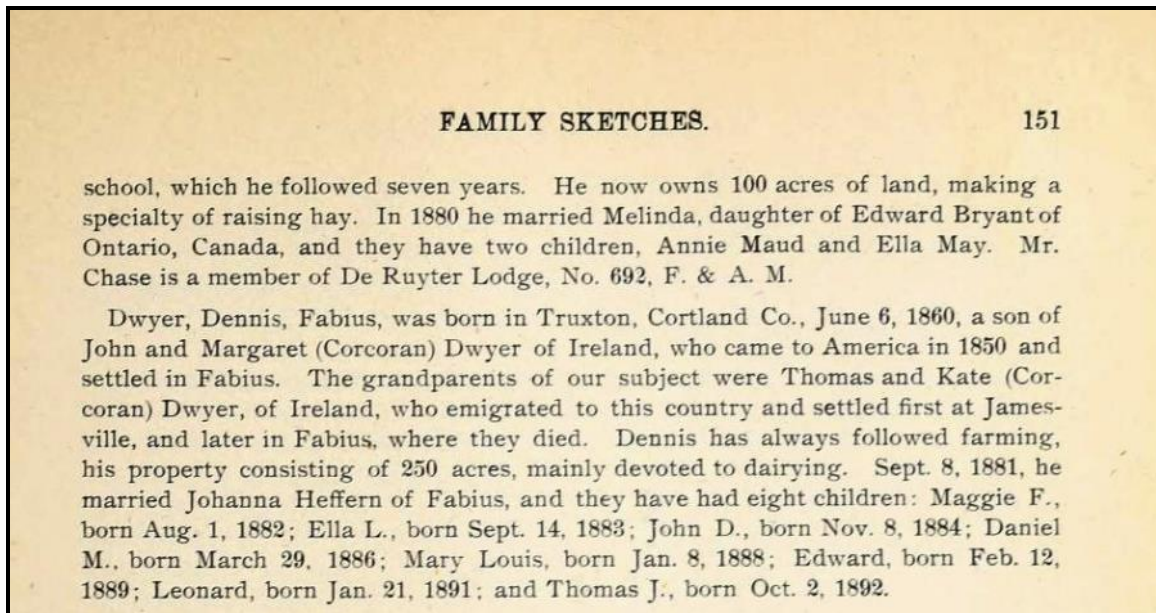

A Fatal Auto Accident

"**Miss Mary Dwyer**, 30, daughter of **Mr. and Mrs. Dennis Dwyer** of Fabius, was killed instantly at 11:30 o'clock yesterday (Oct 6th) morning when a car owned by her brother, **Leonard Dwyer**, in which she was riding, skidded while climbing a steep hill near Monticello overturned and hurled its occupants into the ditch.

"**Miss Dwyer** was returning to her home after having stayed since Saturday with another brother, **Edward Dwyer**, at his home at Lake Mohopac. She was accompanied by her brother, **Leonard Dwyer**, **Charles Reynolds**, a Syracuse Patrolman, and his sister, **Miss Theresa Reynolds**. The other occupants escaped.

"The car with its party of four was ascending Wurtsboro hill, near Masten Lake, which is not far from Monticello, at a rate of about 20 miles an hour. Suddenly something happened and the car skidded, swerved into the ditch at the side of the road and overturned. **M. Glasier**, Monticello officer, who was following the machine said the car was going slow at the time of the accident.

"The body of **Miss Dwyer** was taken to undertaking rooms at Monticello and the family were notified of the tragedy. The body will be shipped to Fabius today.

"Surviving are her parents; two sisters, **Mrs. John J. Hennigan** and **Mrs. Michael Hennigan**, both of Syracuse, and five brothers, **Edward Dwyer** of Lake Mohopac, **Leonard**, **Robert** and **Thomas Dwyer** of Fabius and **Milton Dwyer** of Syracuse."

"**Mrs. Mary Nugent**, 78, of Tully, was killed last night when hit by a car while crossing State st., Tully, the 40th traffic fatality in the county this year.

"State Trooper **Anthony Varisco** listed the driver as **Frank J. Pine**, 29, of RD 2, Cayuga.

Multiple Fractures

"According to morgue attendants the woman received a skull fracture; crushed chest, fracture of the right leg, compound fracture of the left leg and multiple fractures of both arms.

"**Dr. Marcus S. Richards**, coroner's physician, pronounced her dead and released the body to the Hartwell Funeral Home, Tully.

"**Pine**, who was traveling south, reported to **Trooper Varisco** that the woman suddenly appeared before him just after a northbound car had passed. He said he was unable to stop in time.

"The accident victim had been visiting a neighbor, and was hit while attempting to cross the street to the home of her daughter, **Mrs. William Murphy**, with whom she lived.

"The accident occurred at 8 p.m. about 200 yards south of the traffic light in Tully.

"There were no witnesses to the accident: it was raining at the time. Several persons told the trooper they heard the 'thud' of the crash.

"No charge was made against the driver, the trooper said.

"**Mrs. Nugent** is the 40th traffic fatality in the county this year and the 16th in four weeks.

"Widow of **Lawrence Nugent**, Tully blacksmith, she was born in Apulia Station and lived in Tully about 30 years.

"She was a communicant of St. Leo's Church, a former organist there and a member of its Altar Guild. She also gave piano instruction.

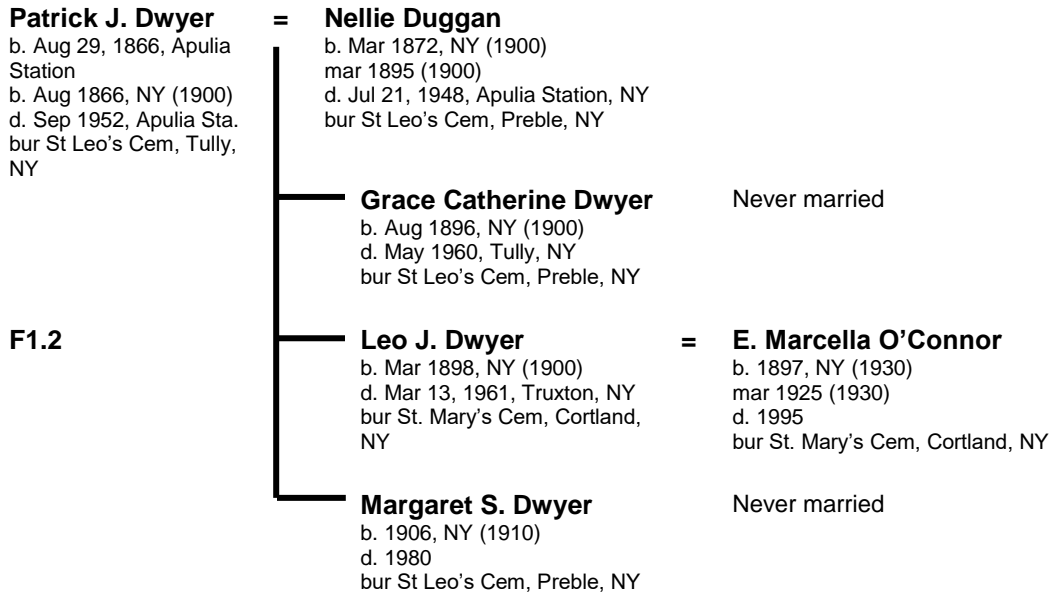
"Besides her daughter, she is survived by three grandchildren, two nieces and a nephew.

Helena's father was descended from the Apulia Dwyers. They are distinct from a second set of Dwyers (**E**) in Fabius. Margaret Dwyer, the sister of Helena Dwyer's father (Leo Dwyer) taught school at Gooseville Corners. Margaret boarded with some of the Dwyers from this second group of Dwyers. Helena didn't think the two Dwyer families were related and she usually knows her stuff.

The actual location of Gooseville Corners is about ½ mile east of the school, on Route 80, in the northeast corner of the intersection of Route 80 with Gardner Gulf Road. The school (No. 8) was located on the east side of the Delphi Road about 1000 feet north of the intersection with Route 80.

There is much more information on this second group of Dwyers (**F**) that has a connection to the author's family. In the Fabius Dwyer family (**E5**), Jack C. Dwyer (**E5.8.2**) married Doris Jane McGraw who was the daughter of John Arthur McGraw (1891 – 1962) and Marie Connors (~1898 – 1945). John's parents were Michael W. McGraw (1843 – 1923) and Alice Rooney (1858 – 1940) who were the author's great grandparents.

KILLED COASTING

Thirteen-Year-Old Matthew Dwyer Ran Into Tree

"The first fatality in coasting occurred Wednesday evening when **Matthew A.**

Dwyer, the 13-year-old son of **Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Dwyer** of 512 Ulster street, lost his life while coasting with a party of boys near his home.

"During the evening the lad went out with a party of boys to enjoy the good coasting on Myrtle street hill, a few blocks from his home. Young Dwyer was on a single sleigh, and was coasting down the hill, when in some way he lost control of it and it ran into a tree. The great velocity gained from the icy hill precipitated the lad into the tree with tremendous force. His shoulder and arm were crushed by the crash and he received internal injuries.

"He was picked up by his playfellows, placed on his sled and taken to his home, where he was able to help himself into the house. This was about 9 o'clock, but soon after he sank rapidly as a result of the internal injuries and died at 2:30 a.m. (Feb 18th)

"The lad was a pupil in Porter school and was bright in his classes. He was popular with his playmates and idolized by his family, which is completely prostrated by the fatality.

"Besides his parents, he leaves two sisters, **Nora B.** and **Anna**, and one brother,

"The Florida hurricane disaster struck home for the second time Wednesday when word reached this city of the death of **Thomas C. Dwyer**, 41, formerly a resident of 611 E. Fayette st., killed during the storm

"The message of notification was received by the victim's parents, **Mr. and Mrs. William J. Dwyer**, of the above address. The telegram gave no details of how the Syracusan was killed other than that it was during the hurricane.

"Second Known Victim

"**John McCarthy's Sons**, local undertakers have been commissioned to make all arrangements to bring the body to this city. Dwyer is the second victim from this section, former supervisor **William W. Esty** of Cardiff having been killed at Miami.

"Dwyer went South last November to take a position as superintendent of construction for the McCarthy construction Company, of New York at Hollywood. He had been living in that city ever since. The victim was born in Syracuse and was graduated from Central High School.

"Surviving are his parents, two brothers, **William J. and Frank M. Dwyer** and two sisters, **Mrs. J. J. Murphy** and **Mrs. John F. Phalen**.

"Radio and telegraph were enlisted Wednesday in the efforts of Syracuse relatives to locate First Class Mate

Thomas C. Litts, Syracuse man, a flyer in the Naval air Force stationed at Pensacola, Fla., missing since the tropical hurricane swept that state last Saturday."

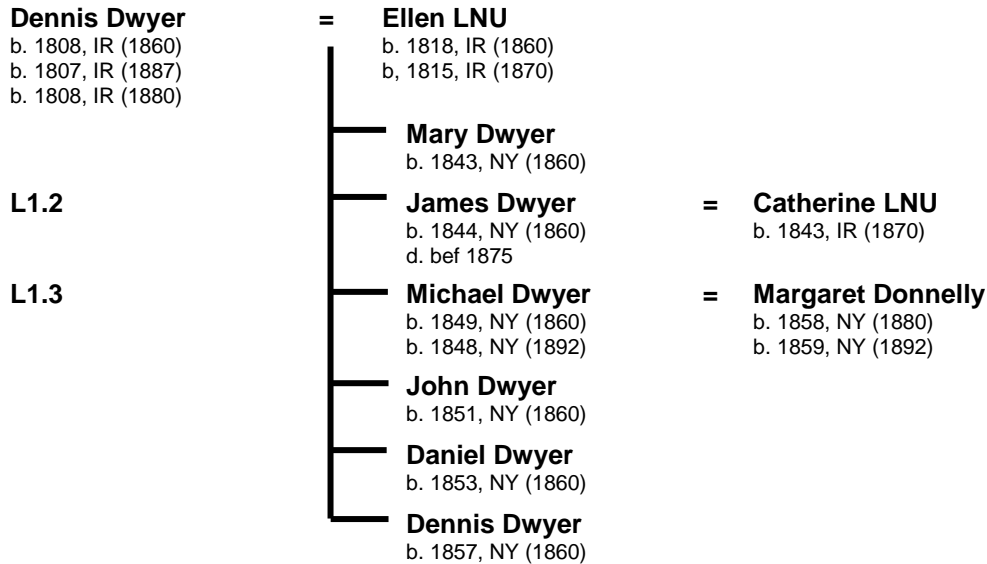

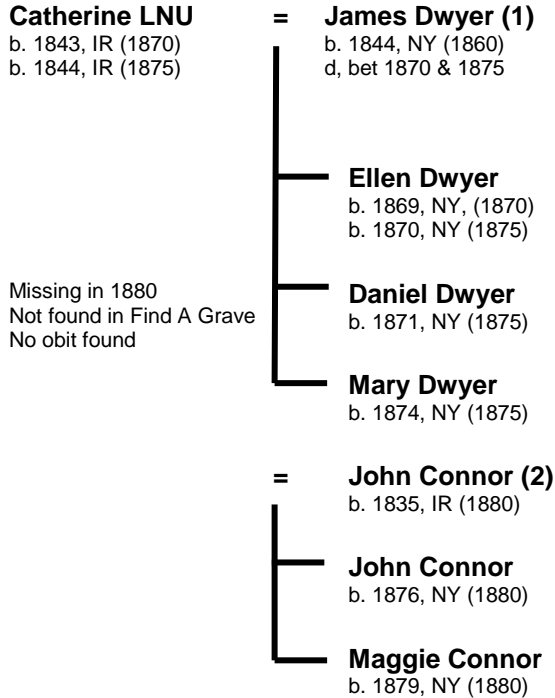

Houghtaling**, charged on oath of **Charles Blair**, of the firm of Blair & Truesdell, bankers and brokers of this city, with forging the name of his father, **Dennis Dwyer**, to a promissory note for seventy dollars. Young **Dwyer** had the note discounted at Blair & Truesdell's last October. The note was made out in regular form and is dated October 1st, and made payable, with interest ten months from date.

“**Dwyer** was arraigned before **Justice Mulholland** yesterday afternoon and pleaded not guilty to the charge. He was committed to await further examination. He has a wife and three children. His father is a farmer in comfortable circumstances.”

Note (1): Perhaps Mary Dwyer had diabetes and she had a limb amputated (probably a leg), which is not uncommon for people suffering from the disease. An official at St. Agnes Cemetery assured the author that was the custom back in 1955 although the burial of amputated limbs is no longer practiced.

Alice Dwyer disappeared after the 1880 census. In the 1900 census Alice's husband Patrick Dwyer reported his marital status as MARRIED although Alice never appeared in a census after 1880. No obituary has been found for Alice; she is not in the Find A Grave database. She was not found in the NYS Death index. Alice is not buried in the Dwyer family plot in St. Agnes Cemetery, Syracuse, NY. The lot card shown above for the Dwyer plot shows that it still has 2 empty spaces up to the present day (2026).

DYING IN A ROOM BY HIMSELF

Michael Dwyer Refusing Assistance a Few hours Before His End

"When **William Coburn**, the janitor of the Crouse building in Warren street, relieved the night watchman, **Michael Dwyer**, early yesterday morning (Aug 27th) the latter complained that he had suffered all night from sickness and asked of the former permission to occupy his sleeping room in the block, as he was too weak to go to his home at No. 64 Tully street until, as he said, he was refreshed by a nap. The request being granted, Dwyer went to the room, which is on the fifth floor. At 9 o'clock the janitor went to the room and asked Dwyer's permission to bring him a breakfast. This Dwyer declined, as he subsequently did a cup of coffee, saying that he didn't feel hungry. At noon Dwyer was again visited and urged to eat something, but again refused, with the remark that he would feel better soon, when he would go down and get a meal. The janitor went about his work and thought no more of Dwyer, until about 5 o'clock in the afternoon, at which hour he sent the elevator boy up to see him. The boy found him in bed apparently asleep and so returned and informed Coburn. At 6:30 the latter went to the room and to the bedside. His attention was attracted by Dwyer's unnatural appearance and placing his hand on him attempted to arouse him. He shook him vigorously and then felt of his forehead. It was cold. The man was dead. An alarm was raised and Undertaker McCarthy was called. By the latter the body was removed to his morgue where it was embalmed and viewed by **Coroner Knapp** and his jury. An inquest will be held on it this evening at 8 o'clock.

"Beside a wife, **Mr. Dwyer** leaves three sons and three daughters. Of the sons **Michael** is a dry goods salesman in St. Louis, **Frank V.**, who lives at home, is a locomotive engineer, and **Richard** is the first baseman and captain of the Utica base ball team. He played in that capacity in this city yesterday. He was notified of the death last evening as he stepped out of the Hotel burns to take the train for Utica.

Of the daughters,

Mary L., is the principal of the primary department of Putnam school.

Lizzie is a teacher in Montgomery school and

Kittie is a teacher in Adams school

"Mr. Dwyer had been in the employ of the Crouse family for more than twenty years, having been up to last May a shipping clerk for G. & N. Crouse, wholesale grocers at the corner of West Water and Clinton streets. **Dr. Plant** will make an autopsy this forenoon, after which the body will be removed to No. 64 Tully street. Mr. Dwyer was 64 year was old."

ARSENIC FOUND IN HIS STOMACH

Dr. Plant Tells the Result of His Post Mortem Examination of Michael Dwyer's Body

"The Coroners' inquest in the case of **Michael Dwyer**, who was found dead Thursday evening in a room in the Crouse building, in Warren street, began at **Undertaker McCarthy's** rooms last evening and the evidence adduced was of a rather sensational character.

"**William Coburn**, the janitor of the building, testified to Dwyer's actions on the day of his death and to the finding of his body. **Dr. William T. Plant**, who made the autopsy, said that he found in the principal organs nothing to account for the sudden death until he opened the stomach, the inner coating of which was intensely inflamed. At one point a large brownish patch which looked as though a powder had been deposited

was found, and the doctor took that away with him for investigation, and afterward discovered it to be sulphide of arsenic. He didn't examine it as to quantity. Death, in his opinion, ensued from arsenical poisoning.

"Answering questions of the jurymen, **Dr. Plant** said that arsenic does not always produce vomiting, but is generally accompanied by spasms and intense thirst. The whole inside of the stomach was characteristic of arsenical poisoning. The body was embalmed a short time after it was taken to the morgue and the fluid used in the operation contains arsenic, but the doctor is positive the arsenic he found was introduced into the stomach before death. Undertaker McCarthy explained to a reporter afterward that he injected the fluid through the nostrils and that it ran down the throat.

"After **Dr. Plant's** testimony a messenger was dispatched to the Crouse block and **Janitor Coburn** was recalled and said that he found no phials or papers in his room where Dwyer was found dead, and he knew of his having taken no drugs or medicine. Dwyer had been staying in the block for several days before his death and didn't go home at all. He got his meals in a restaurant in the building and occupied a room belonging to a **Mr. Howard**, a drug clerk employed at William's drug store in Warren street. A few nights before the death the witness noticed that Dwyer appeared despondent, and asked him if he was in trouble. Dwyer replied that he was, but would not tell what the trouble was. The witness didn't think that Dwyer was a drinking man. The inquest was then adjourned until Monday evening at 8 o'clock.

"**Mr. Howard** was seen after the inquest adjourned, and said that he found no drugs or powders, or any trace of them about his room, and never sold Dwyer arsenic or anything else, nor had he ever been ordered to do so. To him it was strange that the body of a man who had taken such a powerful poison as arsenic should be found in such an apparently peaceful condition. 'Mr. Dwyer,' said Howard, 'had occupied my room for eight or ten days before he died, and why he didn't do so on the day he died is more than I know. He was very neat in his person and habits, and I willingly allowed him to occupy the room.'

"That Mr. Dwyer's despondency was occasioned by trouble by trouble in his family, as was stated yesterday afternoon, is denied by his relatives, who say that the property has been in his wife's name for several years, and that there has been no cause whatever for domestic unhappiness. A physician is quoted as saying that Mr. Dwyer was taking powerful medicine to rid himself of diarrhea, and that to this may be attributed the presence of arsenic in his stomach."

THE DEATH OF MICHAEL DWYER

The Presence of Arsenic in the Stomach Satisfactorily Explained to the Priest

"The family of **Michael Dwyer**, who was found in the Crouse apartment building on Thursday evening strenuously oppose the theory that death was the result of suicidal poisoning. The authority given for this view of the case was **Dr. Plant's** report of the Coroner's jury on Friday evening, to the effect that on making an examination of the stomach he had found intense inflammation and other evidences of the presence of arsenic. William Coburn, the janitor of the Crouse building, in whose room Dwyer died, testified that no phial or papers of any kind were found in the room. The appearances of the corpse itself is decidedly against the idea of death by arsenical poisoning, which is always accompanied by vomiting and severe spasms. **Dr. Benedict**, who had known Dwyer for a long time, said last night that he saw the dead man in the Crouse building the day before his death. The doctor thought the idea of suicide preposterous and explained that the presence of arsenic was the result of the method of embalming adopted by **Undertakers' McCarthy**. The poisonous fluid was forced through the nostril.

The method is by arterial infection. Some of this fluid, which contains large quantities of arsenic, naturally found its way to the stomach, a point which is very emphatically proven by an analysis of a stomach made by **Professor William Manlius Smith**, the chemist, some months ago. In this case the Professor distinguished from two specimens of embalming fluid furnished by Undertaker McCarthy, the particular variety used.

“**Rev. Dr. O’Hara** is satisfied from the facts of the case, as developed, that **Michael Dwyer** died a natural death and has granted a permit for burial in St. Mary’s cemetery. Suicides are not permitted to be interred in consecrated grounds. The stomach has been sent to **Professor Smith**, of the Medical college, for analysis, and his report will be submitted at the Coroner’s inquest to-morrow evening.”

The Medicine Contained Arsenic

“The Coroner’s jury in the case of **Michael Dwyer**, found a verdict last night that Dwyer came to his death from the effects of arsenic taken for medicinal purposes but which accumulated in his system until it became fatal. **Coroner Knapp** called on the family yesterday and learned that some time ago Dwyer bought a quantity of medicine from **Dr. Hartley**, to be taken for an ulcer on the leg. It is supposed that the medicine contained arsenic. **Coroner Knapp’s** investigations showed that the pleasantest relations have always existed between Dwyer and his family.”

Young Tornado in Stunts at Valley

House Unroofed, windows Smashed, auto Overturned in Severe Blast; Two Children Caught in Blow, Rescued

Fences Scatter About and Other Damages Done in Brief Space of Time

“A young tornado whirled down White av. in the Valley Monday afternoon, shattering windows, unroofing a house, overturning a high-powered auto, among other stunts. Two little girls, starting out for school, were caught in the blast and thrown against the house, from where they were quickly rescued.

“A storm of flying leaves and corn stalks, the cries of children and the crash of window panes, were the first signs of alarm. The blast was over almost as quick as it started, beginning at 1:30 o’clock and lasting only a minute or two.

“Forming suddenly in the corn field at the foot of the hill, behind the tavern at Cortland av., corner of White av., the wind first whirled a stacked heap of cornstalks to the field’s four corners. Some stalks were left hanging in trees by the road.

“Smashing in part of a greenhouse and overturning a small barn, the center of the wind cut from the field, pulling down electric wires as it swept across Cortland av.

Auto Overturned

“It swept ahead a wall of leaves which rattled against the glass windows of **O. D. Lord’s** store, while a big auto standing in front of the store was lifted up and turned on its side.

“‘I thought my time had come,’ said **Mrs. Lord**, in telling of the excitement. The store windows held, but a window of the next house broke and scattered the fragments of glass over the living room.

“On the other side of White av., little four-year-old **Adeline Barr** and six-year-old **Marion Barr** had just left the front door of their home on their way to school. Before either could ‘bat an eyelash,’ both were swept up against the side of the house. They were rescued by their mother.

“Four windows and six lamps were broken in **Mrs. Walter Barr’s** home. The house rocked on its foundation as did the other houses in White av.

Roof Ripped Off

"Passing on down White av., the wind stripped the roof from the home of **Mrs. Frank Williams**, who at the time was away. One big tin strip of roof was blown as far as Loomis av.

"To increase the discomfort rain commenced to fall and neighbors hurried to help in patching up a temporary roof to protect the **Williams** home.

"The wind seems to have spent its force by the time it reached Atlantic av. It had, however, toppled over **Michael Dwyer's** hen coop and more corn stack heaps and rails of fences were scattered about.

Other Houses Suffered

"Other houses losing windows were those of **Bernard Stanton, John Siddal** and **John Howard**.

"The Valley disturbance was purely local, said **Weather Forecaster Manford**. The wind had been blowing 43 miles an hour Sunday, he added, and wa at 30 miles an hour Monday night. It had blown a little harder during the day, he said."

TEACHER FRACTURES HIP IN FALL ON SIDEWALK

"**Miss Elizabeth E. Dwyer**, 25, of No. 2029 Cortland avenue, Onondaga Valley, a teacher in Montgomery school, suffered a fractured hip at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon when she fell on a slippery sidewalk near the East Fayette hotel in East Fayette street.

"**Miss Dwyer** was picked up by other persons walking in the street and helped to the hotel. An ambulance from St. Joseph's hospital was summoned through the police and she was removed to that institution."

"Giving the residue of his \$1,500 estate to **Miss Anna Murphy** and **Miss Mary Murphy**, 507 Tully st., sisters, whom he describes as 'the two grandest women I have ever known,' the will of **Richard Eugene Dwyer**, who died Sept. 2, cut off his son, **Hurlbut Dwyer** of Patterson, N.J., with a gift of \$1.

"In making the \$1 bequest to his son, Dwyer wrote in his will:

"To my son, **Hurlbut**, I wish to leave the sum of \$1, which is a larger amount than he ever gave me.'

"Real estate left by the testator consists of three vacant lots in Salt Lake City."

Note: After checking census records and assembling the family tree of the **Murphy** girls it was determined that they weren't related to **Richard Dwyer**. In **Richard's** obituary it stated that he was survived by two nieces — these nieces were not the **Murphy** girls. However, both the **Dwyers** and the **Murphys** had lived on Tully Street. It would appear that **Richard Dwyer** knew the **Murphy** family from the old neighborhood.

A further connection can be found in that fact that **Richard's** sister, **Mary, Kittie** and **Lizzie** were all teachers as were the **Murphy** girls **Mary** and **Ann**.

PIONEER BALL PLAYER DEAD

“Services for **Richard E. Dwyer** of 142 Linden st., former professional baseball player and organizer of several minor leagues, who died last night (Sep 2nd) in St. Joseph hospital after a brief illness, will be conducted at 10:45 a.m. tomorrow at the rooms of **David R. Mooney**, funeral director, and in St. Lucy’s Church at 11 o’clock, where a solemn high mass of requiem will be sung. He was 79 years old.

“Born in Syracuse, Nov. 13, 1858, **Mr. Dwyer** first earned recognition as an amateur player around Syracuse. Breaking into baseball when the game was establishing itself as the national pastime, he spent 33 years of active service on the diamond, becoming a pioneer authority on the game.

“His first professional; job was with the Gloversville Independents in 1879. After spending three years with teams in Missouri and Nebraska, he joined the St. Louis Browns in 1882, where he stayed two years. Dwyer refused the playing managership of the Syracuse Stars in the New York State League in 1885, and accepted a similar post with Binghamton.

“In 1890 he was playing manager of the Portland Ore., team on the Pacific Coast, and organized the Pacific Northern League. He continued his organizing efforts in Montana and Washington during the 90’s and then dropped out of baseball for a time to take a position with a steamship company.

“In 1901 he returned to organize the Northern New York League. He made his last appearance in the game as a member of a City League club in Los Angeles in 1911.

“He returned to Syracuse four years ago, after working with the United States mail service in Alaska, and for three years was employed by the government as an accountant. Dwyer retired a year ago because of failing health.

“Surviving are a son, **Hurlbert Dwyer**; a grandson, **Hurlbert Dyer, Jr.**; a nephew and two nieces. Interment will be in St. Agnes’ cemetery.”

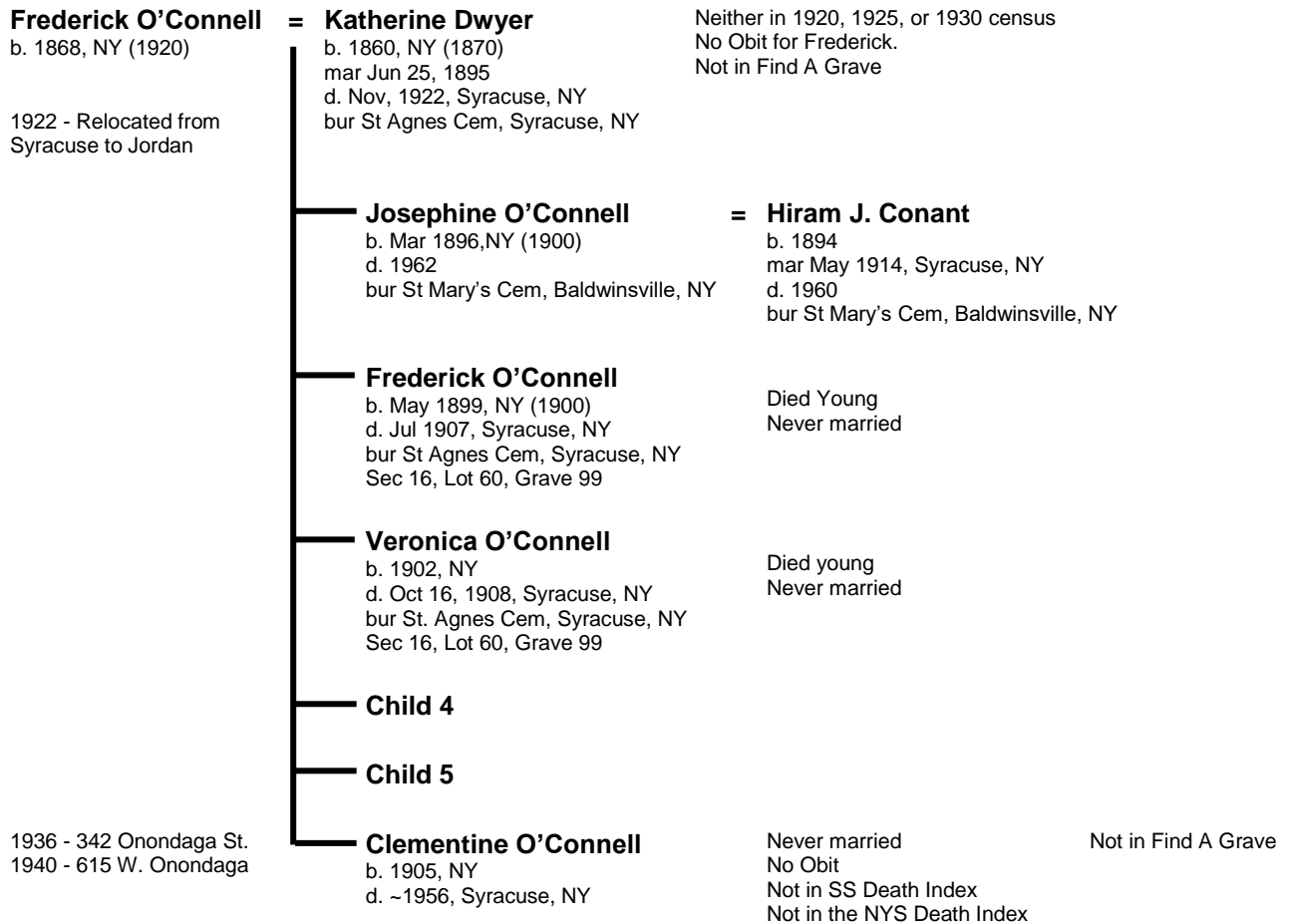

HUSBAND AND WIFE SUE FOR INJURIES

Bring Actions Against Rapid Transit Company for \$17,000.

"**Frederick J. O'Connell** and his wife, **Katherine L. O'Connell**, have each brought action against the Syracuse Rapid Transit Railway Company for damages for personal injuries received in Cortland avenue when a trolley car overturned their wagon and threw them out on the evening of May 31.

"**Mr. O'Connell** brings his suit in Supreme Court and asks \$15,000 damages. He alleges in the complaint that he was driving south in Cortland avenue near Louis Winholtz's vinegar factory, and that the car came behind him without giving proper warning of its approach. The vehicle, he alleges, was overturned and he was thrown out. He says that his left ear was badly torn and that the internal ear was injured so that the hearing has been greatly impaired and he believes that the injury is permanent. He also says that his neck and back were injured.

O'Connell**, a carpenter, residing at No. 217 May avenue, was struck by a southbound Elmwood and Valley car at 6 o'clock last night as she was crossing the Rapid Transit tracks in front of the office of **Dr. J. M. Rutledge** at No. 750 Cortland avenue.

"Accompanied by her 6-year-old brother, **Frederick**, the little girl had been to a nearby drug store for some delicacies for a 'tea party' she was arranging on a little table for herself and brother.

"Two weeks ago the child fell and broke her forearm while playing. Parts of the bone protruded through the flesh and tetanus developed. Young Catholic Girl Who Committed Suicide Was Buried Without the Rites of Her Church

“**Mary Murphy**, the young servant girl in the employ of **Arthur R. Peck** of James street, who committed suicide Thursday (Jul 19th) was buried this afternoon (Jul 21st) in an out of the way section of St. Agnes’ cemetery.

“No priest officiated at the funeral of the girl, she being a suicide, and as the Catholic church forbids suicides the right to be buried with the last rites of the church, the girl was laid to rest without any ceremony. The funeral took place from McCarthy’s morgue at 2 o’clock.

“**Miss Murphy** went to holy communion in St. John’s cathedral Sunday morning and before she died was given absolution by **Rev. Ambrose Dwyer**.”

The actual proof that the two John Dwyer, Jr.s are **different people** is the following: **John, Jr** of Fabius was born in NY in 1854 and his mother was **Margaret. John, Jr.** of Cuyler was born in Ireland in 1840 and his mother was **Hannah.**

Catherine LNU married a 1st husband - Unknown - he drowned in about 1882

Catherine LNU married a 2nd husband - John Dwyer

John Dwyer's oxen yoke was killed by a train - March 1885

Catherine Dwyer died in 1891

John Dwyer named administrator for Catherine Dwyer's estate in 1891

John Dwyer of Cuyler appeared in the 1900 census and he was residing on Morgan Hill.

Fabius Dwyer

There was a John Dwyer of Fabius who owned 50 acres in the northeast corner of Truxton Lot No. 53. - This is John Dwyer, Sr.

John Dwyer, Sr. of Fabius was foreclosed on this property on Nov. 24, 1896. This was most likely due to his death.

John Dwyer, Sr. married Eliza Comerford sometime before 1880.

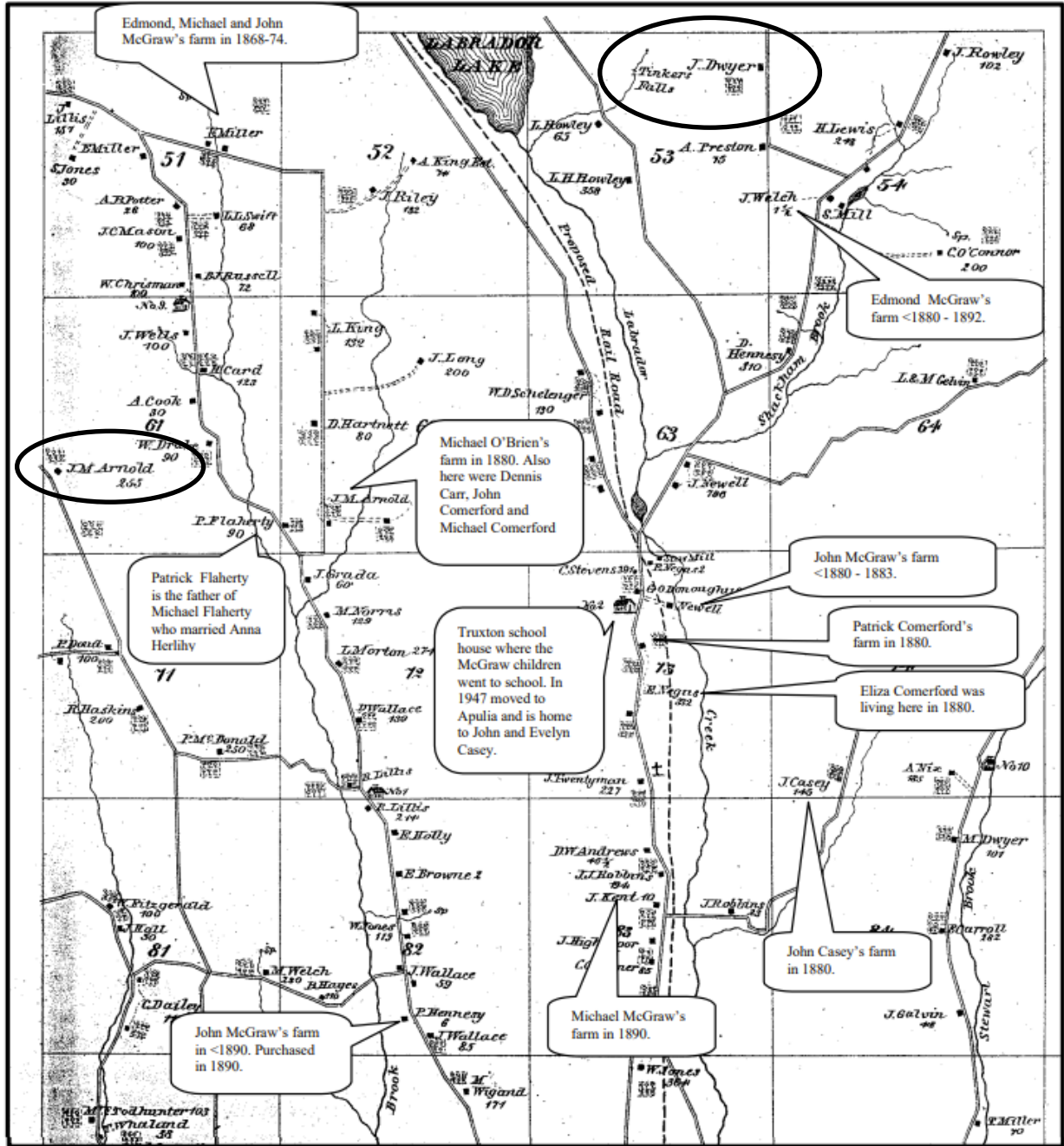

In 1869 John Dwyer, Jr. was only 15 years old and seems too young to own any land. In the land transaction shown above in this section it was seen the John, Sr. purchased this land on Lot 61 from John M. Arnold on February 21, 1866 — so it was in the family at the time that information for the 1869 directory was gathered. Then John Sr. sold the same parcel of land to John, Jr. on June 17, 1874, when John, Jr. would have been 20 years old. .

This 1900 census was thought to have shown that **John Dwyer** of Cuyler is a different person than **John Dwyer** of Fabius. However, the Fabius **John Dwyer** who died in **1896** was **John Dwyer, Sr.**, the father of **John Dwyer, Jr.** of Fabius. The actual proof that the two **John Dwyer, Jrs** are different people is the following: **John, Jr** of Fabius was born in NY in 1854 and his mother was Margaret. **John, Jr.** of Cuyler was born in Ireland in 1840 and his mother was **Hannah**.

John Dwyer was not found in the **1905**, **1910** or **1915** census.

In the 1880 census John Dwyer was single and by the time of the 1900 census he was a widower. The newspapers in the following section will show that the woman John married was named Catherine. A monument in St. Patrick's Cemetery, in Truxton shows that this Catherine died on May 6, 1891. Also buried in the same cemetery is John Jr.'s mother, Hannah Dwyer (1802 - 1884).

It was also assessed as non-resident, valued at \$175, which has been returned to the County Treasurer unpaid and the error has not been corrected. The petitioners ask the board to correct the same.

"On motion of Mr. Schellinger, the petition was received, placed on file and referred to the committee on jurisprudence."

"**John Dwyer** of this town went to Truxton last Friday with a yoke of oxen to buy provisions for his family. After buying his groceries and putting them into his sleigh, it is said that through the influence of some men in Truxton he became intoxicated, and after promenading him around the streets a while, he, with two bottles of whiskey in his pockets, was loaded into his sleigh and started for home. When near **Nelson Keeler's** he, in some way, got out of his sleigh and his oxen came up and stopped at Mr. Keeler's barn. **Mr. Keeler** went out and helped him into his sleigh and started him on all right. When he came to the railroad crossing his team instead of keeping the road turned and started to come up the track, and had come but a few feet when the 6:30 P.M. passenger train came at full speed, and the lights and screaming of the whistle aroused him enough so that he crawled out of the sleigh just in time to escape being instantly killed. The sleigh was broken into a thousand fragments, one of the oxen was cut all in pieces and the other was hurled some distance and fatally injured before the train could be stopped. Strange to say the two bottles of whiskey were all safe and sound. **Mrs. Dwyer** has the sympathy of the entire community. It is only a few years since **her former husband** went to the same village and became intoxicated, and when near **Wesley Patrick's** got out of his sleigh, and so crazed with whiskey he did not know where he was, wandered around and finally was found in the river drowned, but a short distance from where this husband came so near being killed by the cars. It is reported upon good authority that **Mrs. Dwyer** will present a bill to the parties who sold her husband the liquor, for the damage, and if not settled by them she will commence a suit against them, under the civil damage act."

TRUXTON

"We notice in the DeRuyter *Gleaner* that **John Dwyer** who had his yoke of oxen run over by the cars a few days since had been influenced by some of our citizens who endeavored to get him intoxicated. If not settled it will be a very interesting case."

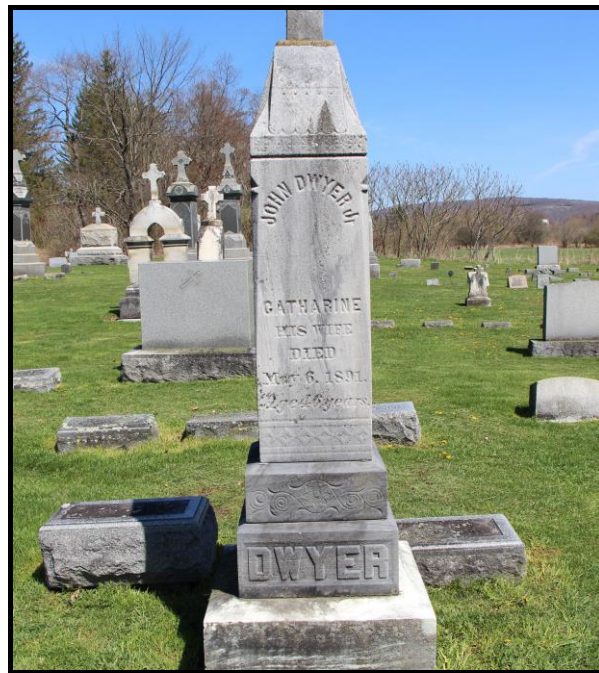

Gooseville

Know Where Gooseville Is? Many Do — Sort of

By Dick Case

"I met the mayor of Gooseville the other day.

"His name is Jim Conway and he lives in the far southeast corner of Onondaga County, in the town of Fabius, at the foot of Arab Hill. He can almost spit into Madison County, it's that close.

"Gooseville is on county maps and in our traditions. The settlement — at Oran-Delphi Road and Route 80 — has been there almost 200 years.

"The Conways have been there 70.

"Jim's dad, Basil Conway, who died two years ago, bought most of Gooseville, 210 acres, in 1928. The family farmed the land until Jim sold his dairy herd six years ago.

"The title's honorary, Gooseville doesn't have enough going for it to support more than a handful of homes, a four-way stop and an old cemetery. There used to be two hotels and Gooseville School.

"Jim is an elected official, though. He's the senior among the Fabius town council members. He got on the board in 1980.

"When people ask him where he lives, he replies Gooseville, of course.

"Sometimes they stop and say, 'What?', he explained. 'Mostly, they say they've heard of it and know where it is.' 'Sort of,'

"The closest reference point is Highland Forest county park, which has spread across Arab Hill, since 1932. Before that, for nearly 100 years, this second highest spot in the county supported a tiny farming community called Kenyon Hollow.

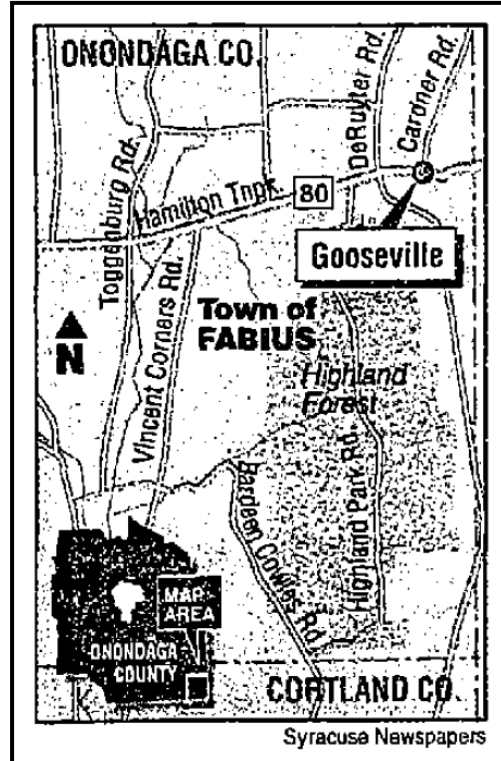
"In 1889, the Syracuse Journal printed a report, 'Views from Arab Hill.' The writer described standing at the summit, 1,900 feet above sea level, and seeing 'the lovely valley, looking like a chess board, with its green wheat, its yellow stubble fields, its pastures of paler green, and its fields newly plowed and brown, (looking) like the changing, brilliant colors of a kaleidoscope.'

"The Conways' ranch house, which he and his wife, Judy, built in 1959, sits in the kaleidoscope. He was born in the Conway farmhouse down the road, closer to 'The Corner.'

"People also ask the mayor how his hometown got its name.

"He tells them the story he heard from his father, who taught school before he farmed and was born in the town of Pompey in 1905, the son of an Irish immigrants.

"The garage on the farm used to be one of the hotels in Gooseville,' Jim told me. 'It had been moved to the farm from the corners before my father bought it.



“They said drovers used to stay at the hotel, driving stock like geese to the railroad station at New Woodstock. Or even Albany, although that seems like a long way to drive geese.

“Anyway, that’s how Gooseville got its name, from the geese in the road.’

“Before that it had been called Spragueville, for the Spragues, who came to the area from Connecticut in 1805, along with the Beaches, Wallaces and Kenyons. That information was gathered by T. Elmer Bogardus, one of the writers of the post-Standard’s 1933 series, ‘Forgotten Villages of Onondaga.’

“Bo,’ who later owned the Eagle-Bulletin newspapers, said of the tradition: “Geese were raised by the hundreds in that section many years ago and allowed to roam the fields and hills. The feathers plucked from the live birds made luxurious feather beds, in which one can sink almost out of sight and keep quite warm on cold nights.

“These roaming geese bothered one eccentric old woman who lived on the outskirts and she used to herd the birds into her yard, strip them of their feathers, and turn them loose.

“From that came the name Gooseville...’

“When the reporter visited Gooseville, two sisters, Candace and Alma Beach, survived in the family homestead, a house that still stands on Oran-Delphi Road, less than a mile from the corners. The school had been abandoned; Gooseville kids went to Fabius.

“Jim, a Fabius graduate himself, said his father got the schoolhouse when he bought the farm; he moved it up to the intersection, and used it as a tenant house. It survives as a private residence.

“Gooseville Cemetery, on the way to Delphi Falls hasn’t been used in years; the town looks after it. All the original settlers are there, including Lodorich Kenyon, who died in 1823.

“The mayor joined his father on the farm after high school. At one time, the Conways milked 120 cows and raised 80 heifers. At the end, Jim and one of his sons looked after 500 acres of valley land.

“About five years ago, there came a time, according to Jim, when he realized that the money and energy he and his son had to invest didn’t balance, when they figured in taxes, electricity and insurance vs. the price of milk.

“They would need to milk more cows to keep up.

“Some of their neighbors got bigger. Others sold their cows. In 1993, the Conways sold their cows. Two years later, they sold the farm, except for the alnd around their home.

“I decided there had to be another way of life for me,’ Jim explained.

“He sold to his neighbor the Engsts, who milk 600 cows.

“Judy Conway is a Clancy; her father, Guy, lives in Delphi. The Clancys were Irish immigrants to the area, too. She’s postmaster at Apulia Station, west of Gooseville on Route 80, which some folks still call by its original name, the Hamilton Turnpike.

“Judy is an avid historian and photographer who teaches courses in photo-journaling — preserving family histories — three times a week in her home. She calls her sideline ‘Creative Memories.’

“The Conways have four children, all out of the roost, and Jim was talking about one, Mike, who lives in Hawaii. The mayor is the kind of man who can’t sit still for long, so when the Conways visited Mike, a few years ago, he got the lay of the islands in a few days, then started working with his son on construction projects.

“He so impressed Mike’s boss that the man asked Jim to stay, hire on with him. He tells me he thought about the notion a moment or two, then said no.

“I told him I had to get back home to Gooseville.’ Jim recalled. ‘it’s beautiful country here.’

“Jim bought the wreck of a 1930 Model A Ford almost 40 years ago and spent several years restoring it. He drives it in local parades and will be in the line of march next July when the town of Fabius observes its 200th birthday.

“There’s a vanity license plate on the front of the antique: “Mayor of Gooseville.”

About Arab Hill

“Arab Hill is the traditional name of a 1,900-foot spur of the Allegheny Range that is home to Highland Forest county park. It’s pronounced ‘A-rab,’ with the strong A, in the town of Fabius. We won’t know exactly where the name originated, although one theory is that it’s a corruption of the name of an early settler, Ahab.”

“**Jeremiah Flynn** of Fulton and **Jerry Dwyer** of 321 West Fayette-st. were arraigned before **Police Justice Thomson** this morning on a charge of breach of the peace. Flynn reported to the police that he had been robbed of \$41 at the Delavan house, of which Dwyer is the proprietor.

“When **Detective Larson** accompanied the Fultonian to the ‘hotel’ to investigate the robbery business, **Dwyer** and **Flynn** got late in argument which ended in blows, one of which landed on the detective’s cheek, with no serious result of course. But it made **Larson** mad, and he arrested both men. They pleaded not guilty and were given were given suspended sentences.”

“**Frank O’Donnell** of Utica came to Syracuse Saturday night with a good sized roll, prepared to have a ‘glorious time.’ O’Donnell lost the use of his mental powers through drink Sunday night, but he continued to ‘set ‘em up’ for everybody who would drink with him yesterday. Last night he drifted towards the shady section of the city and was landed in the hotel formerly known as the Delevan house, run by **Jerry Dwyre**.

“**O’Donnell** has a faint recollection of a smoky room, a table filled with empty glasses and a woman by his side. After he had been tossed out into the gutter and recovered his senses he discovered that he had been ‘touched.’”

“He told an officer his story and was taken to the police station. **Detective Dorner** was sent to the hotel and arrested a woman named **Mamie Deyo**.

"**O'Donnell** said last night that he had been robbed of \$60, but this morning when brought before **Justice Thomson** he cut the amount down to \$20.

"The **Deyo woman** denied taking **O'Donnell's** money, but said that he had spent a lot of money for drinks. The woman was allowed to go and **O'Donnell** was advised to go back to Utica by the first train."

The Saga of Jennie Sholes

ADOPTED CHILD GETS FORTUNE AND LEARNS HER REAL NAME

Margaret Reigge Who Has Been the Same as a Real Daughter to Mrs. Jennie M. Sholes Since the Latter took Her From Orphan's Home, Inherits Part of a German Estate — Devoted to Her Foster Parent and Will Continue to Live with Her Here

“**Margaret Reigge** of 724 Benjamin street, who has not seen her parents since she was an infant, and who does not even remember the family name, has just learned that she has fallen heir to a small fortune left her by a relative in Germany.

“**Margaret** is known in Elmira by the name of **Margaret Sholes**. She was adopted 26 years ago by **Mrs. Jennie M. Sholes**, who conducts a boarding house on Benjamin street. At that time she was an infant and was being cared for in an orphan's home at Rochester.

“**Mrs. Sholes** went to Rochester, where the necessary legal papers were drawn up, and returned home with the infant girl, who had been left in the institution by her parents to be cared for by charity.

“**Margaret Reigge** was given the name of Sholes by her adopted mother and has since been known as her daughter. Only a few intimate friends of the family knew of the fact that she was an adopted daughter.

“At the time the **Reigge** girl was adopted, **Mrs. Sholes** was told by the officials of the Rochester orphans' home that she need not divulge to the girl the secret of her birth unless she so desired.

“**Mrs. Sholes** brought the young girl up as well as she knew how. When she reached the age of twenty-one years the good woman told the girl that she was an adopted child.

“**Miss Reigge** is now about twenty-eight years old. During the time she had lived with **Mrs. Sholes** the girl has grown to love her as a mother. She is perfectly satisfied to live in the future as she has in the past and has only kind words for Mrs. Sholes and the excellent treatment she has received during the many years she had lived with her.

“Recently **Mrs. Sholes** was communicated with by **Father Moriarty** of this city, who had received communication from the Catholic institution, where the **Reigge** girl had been left by her parents when she was a baby. The good priest was asked if he knew where the girl could be located and finally succeeded in finding her at **Mrs. Sholes'** home.

FOUND BY PRIEST

“**Father Moriarty** gave the information he had secured to the authorities of the home in Rochester and it was imparted to two sisters of **Miss Reigge**, who had been searching for her. They had been notified of a relative's death in Germany and of the fact that the estate of the decedent had been left to **Mr. Reigge's** children. It became necessary to ascertain if **Margaret Reigge** was living before the estate could be divided according to law.

“The search extended over a considerable period, but finally the sisters were successful in locating their younger sister in Elmira. One of the sisters and her husband came to Elmira and called at the Sholes home where they were made acquainted with the facts of the case.

“**Miss Reigge** did not know that her father was still living and was surprised to learn that he is at the present time confined in a Rochester hospital, where he is in ill health.

"A Star-Gazette reporter called at the Sholes boarding house this morning, where he had a talk with the girl and was informed by **Mrs. Sholes** of the circumstances surrounding the case. She evidently was anxious to do right and to see that justice is done her protege.

"**Miss Reigge** said that she did not know until acquainted of the fact by her sister, that her father was living. She said that she did not until today even know the family name.

"**Miss Reigge** said that she would accompany her sister and her husband to Rochester Monday, where she would affix her signature to the legal papers, which action is necessary in order that the fortune left the family by the German relative may be distributed.

"After she has received her share of the estate, the amount of which she was unable to state, she will return to Elmira and continue to make her home with **Mrs. Sholes**.

"**Mrs. Sholes** is pleased that her charge is going to come into considerable wealth, but she is grieved at the notoriety the case has occasioned.

"I have always been both a mother and father to **Margaret**," **Mrs. Sholes** stated this morning, "and as soon as she has finished her visit in Rochester she will come back to Elmira and continue to share my home."

"Rochester, March 12. — **Jennie Reigge** reached this city today from Elmira, where she has lived for the past 26 years without ever remembering her father and mother and with no knowledge regarding her family. The girl was adopted from a local orphans' home when she was a mere infant by **Mrs. Margaret Sholes** of Elmira and since then she has been known by the name of Sholes.

"Today the sisters, **Jennie** of Elmira and **Mrs. Molly Wignall** and **Mrs. Sadie Judivine** of this city, were reunited through the efforts of **Sister Delphia Reigge** of Rochester. The search for the missing girl, which extended over a period of years, was renewed recently when an aunt died in Germany leaving the **Reigges** a small fortune. Before the estate could be legally divided it became necessary to find **Jennie Reigge**, who has been living all these years in Elmira.

"Before leaving Elmira **Miss Reigge** announced her intention of returning to the Sholes home as soon as her legal business was settled in this city. It is believed, however, that she may change her mind and decide to remain in this city with her relatives."

Martin Rigger married the widow **Jane/Jennie/Johanna Quinlan Hennessey** in Palmyra, New York, on 22 January 1870. They had three daughters together -- **Mary Elizabeth "Mollie," Sera "Sarah/Sadie",** and **Jane "Jennie."**

Martin's wife died in February 1881 when their youngest daughter Jane was almost three years old. Jane's father, left to care for her two older sisters, gave up Jane for adoption to **Margaret Kennedy** and **William Sholes**.

In 1910, **Martin's** spinster sister **Maria** passed away in Germany and left "a small fortune" to his three daughters. Before the money could be awarded to them, Jane Rigger Sholes had to be found and reunited with her sisters. Through the efforts of a local Catholic nun, **Jane/Jennie** was found and the sisters were reunited in Rochester on 12 March 1910. It was then that **Jane Rigger** learned who her biological father was.

The event was recounted in the Star-Gazette, Elmira, NY, p 7, on that day.

“**Mr. and Mrs. James Morse** will celebrate their fiftieth wedding anniversary with a family dinner next Tuesday, April 23. They were married at St. James church, Cazenovia, by **Father Meagher** on April 23, 1890 and were attended by **Miss Norah Leahey** of Cazenovia, sister of the bride, and **Jerry Stapleton** of Auburn, cousin of the groom. The bride was seventeen years old and the groom twenty.

“**Mrs. Morse (Catherine Leahey)** came to this country from Ireland, alone, at the age of sixteen. Her sister, later **Mrs. Conrad Bauer**, and her brother **James** had been here two years. Another sister, **Mrs. Patrick Dwyer**, came later. **Mrs. Bauer** and **Mr. Leahey** have since died.

“**Mr. Morse** was born in Cazenovia, a son of **Jervis** and **Catherine Stapleton Morse**. His father drove the stage coach for a number of years. **Mr. Morse** had two sisters, a twin, **Mrs. Fred Jones** of Rochester, and **Mrs. William Evans** of this place.

“**Mr. and Mrs. Morse** have five children, **Mrs. Thomas Davis** of Cazenovia, **Mrs. Edward Hawley**, **Mrs. Bernard Gruninger** and **James Morse, Jr.** of Syracuse, and **Francis R. Morse** of Hanover, Pa. There are four grandchildren, **Donald Davis** of Cazenovia, **Miss Lenora Davis** of Albany, and **Jack** and **Jimmie Morse** of Syracuse.

“**Mr. and Mrs. Morse** are very active. They have a large tourist house and **Mr. Morse** is employed on the J. P. Byrne estate on the west side of the lake. He was one of the first men in town to drive a car having been a chauffeur for **Burr Wendell** over thirty years ago. **Mr. Wendell** then owning one of the first cars in this section of the country. Later he drove for different Syracuse families and was chauffeur for the late **Mrs. Charles Crouse** for fourteen years.”

Summary

The results above represent the third attempt to find the Leahy family back in Ireland via the Catholic parish registers and the civil records. The first two attempts weren't close and required a significant amount of hand waving and the explaining away of several inconsistencies. It was Honora Leahy's obituary that finally pointed the way by identifying her late husband as John Leahy. In this obituary and in a later article (1940) about Catherine Leahy Morse's 50th wedding anniversary the names and locations of four of Honora's children who had immigration to the US were found. According to the 1900 census Honora had given birth to 9 children and only 4 were still alive in 1900. Using this information it was possible to find 9 baptism records for a John Leahy and Honora Sullivan in Cork City. Three of the known children's names (Catherine, Nora and Mary) were found among the baptism records. There were three sons among the baptism records but there was none named James. Catherine and Nora's 1900 census ages were close to their baptism dates. Mary Leahy's 1900 census age was 10 years later than her baptism date. Another possibility is that Mary was actually Ellen Mary and she was using her middle name. Ellen Mary was baptized in 1873 which is closer to Mary's 1900 census age (b. 1877).

If Honora's number of 9 children born with only 4 still alive in 1900 is true then James presents himself as the 10th child — unless he is one of the three known sons. Thomas was baptized in 1869, William was baptized in 1870 and Patrick Joseph was baptized in 1877. According to the US census records James was born between 1868 and 1872. Therefore Patrick Joseph is too young but James could be either Thomas or William. However if they had middle names they weren't shown in the baptism records. Based on James' 1900 estimated birth year he is a close match to William Leahy.

According to the 1900 numbers 5 of Honora Leahy's children had died by 1900. In the table above an attempt has been made to suggest the fate of Honora's children. Those children that are highlighted in YELLOW are the ones under consideration. It has been assumed that William and James were the same person. When Mary and Honora came to the US in 1891 it would have been logical to bring the two youngest children

with her — unless they were already deceased. The two older children, Mary and Thomas, could have died young or, being old enough, they stayed behind and were then deceased by 1900. There is still some hand waving in the fit to this third attempt but the match seems fairly close.

Only one child, William, was found in the civil birth records. None of the children were found in the civil records.
